# A FEW WORDS FROM RAV BARRY:

# Shiva means Seven



I wrote these words on Sunday, January 8, the Fast of the Tenth of Tevet, after we finished davening in my parents' home and got up from Shiva.

Although the local municipal Chevra Kaddisha in Jerusalem follows Jewish law meticulously, preferring to bury on the day of death, they permitted a delay of the burial until I arrived from the States on Sunday evening.

My mother's funeral took place at 18:00 (6pm) on January 1st. Following the chapel service, we accompanied my mother to her eternal rest. Hand in hand, my father, brother, sister, and many family and friends walked in the darkness to the gravesite on Har HaMenuchot—the mountain of consolation—following the hearse. Clothed in traditional linen shrouds, my mom was laid to rest in the city of Jerusalem, the ground she loved, where she had lived with my father for 37 years. After the funeral, we began sitting as mourners for "Shiva yamim", seven days—from early morning until night, except for Shabbat.

It is thought that the source for the seven Shiva days of mourning is Breisheet 50:1-14 in which Joseph mourns the death of his father Jacob (Israel) for seven days. Chazal (Rabbis in the Talmudic period) have instructed that people who have lost a parent, a spouse, siblings, or children must sit and grieve in their home for seven days.

During this seven day period, the mourner "takes times out" to process the loss, shed a tear, reflect and reminisce without interruption. Routine daily activities, work, and other responsibilities are suspended. The front door of the mourner's home is left ajar. Family, friends, and acquaintances enter freely to "pay a shiva call"; they visit and sit with the mourners and offer their condolences while attempting to ease the mourner's pain. The visits allow the bereaved to express his/her grief, and share thoughts and memories about the

deceased relative.

This was my first shiva, the first time I sat in one of those low "shiva chairs" looking up to those wonderful people with whom I spent quality time talking about my mother, her characteristics, her athletic skills, her scrabble games, her love of family and friends, her wonderful qualities as well as her internal and external beauty.

Wearing the same torn shirts for the duration of Shiva (except for the 25 hours on Shabbat), the four of us stayed in the Shiva house, davening three times a day and accepting consolers and blessings of condolence from 7:30am until 10:00pm.

We were truly blessed to have hundreds of people taking the time to visit us, email us, phone us, or send cards. As sad as we were, we were strengthened by the sympathy and support which was showered upon us from the moment it became known that my mom had died.

Although Shiva may sound like the Hebrew word "lashevet", to sit, it actually means "seven". Friends, you can't "sit Shiva" for two days, because Shiva means "seven". I must thank the Rabbis of old for making this demand of me.

Grieving takes time but should not take forever. The Rabbis allocated 7 days for tears and grief and then thirty days throughout a year for mourning and acclimating oneself to the new status as a bereaved person.

Those Jews who suffer loss would benefit greatly by observing the traditional Jewish seven days of mourning and the customs that accompany this period of time. There are those who believe that sitting Shiva is "an unwelcome burden and an exhausting intrusion", but I would agree with the person who said Shiva is "remarkable; a catharsis; one of the great Jewish institutions."

May all the mourners of Israel be consoled among the mourners of Zion and Jerusalem.
