# A FEW "FINAL" WORDS FROM RAV BARRY



The beginning of the month of June finds us at the beginning of Sefer BaMidbar, the Book of Numbers.

On the first two Shabbatot in June we will be reading Parshiot Naso and Be'haalotcha.

Naso opens with the census of the Levitical families; Gershon and Merrari. It is important to note that when the Torah mentions counting

the people, it does not use the Hebrew word "lispor" (to count the people), but uses "Ki Tissa" or "Naso" which means to lift up.

When counting the people, each individual is figuratively lifted up in order to show off his is her unique contribution to the community.

Parshat Be'haalotcha opens with God's instruction that Aaron light the seven branched Menorah which was in the Mishkan (Tabernacle) and later on in the Beit HaMikdash (the Temple).

Be'haalotcha also includes the Mitzvah to make the two silver "Chatzotzrot" - trumpets for the following purposes: to assemble the people, to announce the beginning of a journey, and to announce when the Israelites went off to war. They were also sounded on festivals while bringing communal offerings.

When combining these aforementioned themes, we learn that we should always be personally ready to contribute and answer the call to live active Jewish lives and assure that Judaism's eternal light will continue to illuminate our world. As disciples of Aaron, we are counted upon to preserve the lights of Torah, Tfilla, and Gemilut Chasadim.

During the past year Shira and I did our best to engage people in Torah, Tfilla, and Chesed. That was our calling and we did this in and out of the Shul, as well as in our home. We heard the call of the "chatzotzrot" and marched forward.

To sum up, I'd like to share with you the following report:

I was a full-fledged minyanaire committed to attending tefilla b'tzibbur on a daily basis.

I was a Shaliach Tzibbur and have read Torah and Haftara.

I led a spirited "sing along" Shabbat Psukei Dzimra.

I was a full-time pastor committed to visiting and contacting chaverim in their time of simcha, sorrow or distress; including hospital visits; Shiva minyans (Egal and Non-egal); etc. Whether I was in town or abroad, I always communicated with the Shul and the members by email, phone, and by my weekly "Few Words". I never missed a Friday.

Shira and I had an open house policy. We conducted classes, kumzitzes, breakfast learnings in our home. In addition, we hosted chaverim for a heimish Shabbat meal.

I shared my love of Torah with the Chaverim through my weekly teachings: Friday night between kabbalat Shabbat and maariv; divrei Torah on Shabbat, and shiurim on Shabbat afternoons.

This past year my classes included: Living Jewishly (why we do the things we do, when we do them); Status of women in Judaism; Breisheet Rabbah, the Elijah Tales, Cj schmooze; Judith and the Chanuka Story; Israel at 69; Women and the Kotel; the Amora Rav and his nameless wife.

I taught a Torah study class for Hebrew speakers.

I conducted Monthly Judaica classes at Paul's Run in memory of the late Marion Lomonosoff.

I chanted Havdala on Sunday morning for the Hebrew School kids, as well as taught and sang with them.

I visited the Preschool kids on Rosh Chodesh, as well as participated in chag related activities coordinated with Sherri Herschfeld.

I worked closely with Chazzan Don and coordinated the Traditional service with him.

We organized the April-May Zionist Commemorations and Holidays at CSS.

I initiated two "Seuda Shlisheet" programs on Shabbat.

I developed a constructive working relationship with the folks who davened in the Traditional Minyan.

I initiated an early childhood program committee, which planned the Havdalah in PJs event, as well as the Chanukah program.

I invited the older Hebrew School kids to lead the end of Shabbat davening in the Traditional Service.

I was involved in Tot Shabbat programs, as well as in the "Sing Along Shabbat" program.

My door was always open to congregants and I was available to answer Rabbinic questions.

All in all, we are leaving CSS with a great sense of satisfaction that we achieved the professional goals of a Rabbinic couple.

## THE LIBRARY SHELF



It's not too early to line up your summer reading. From beloved young adult author, Judy Blume, comes her third adult book, *In the Unlikely Event*, a page turner that takes place in Elizabeth, NJ in 1950. The story has several facets and with each one you can hardly wait to read what happens next. Miri is our

fifteen year old protagonist, a feisty young lady beset with several real life problems. The book ends leaving you wanting more or a sequel. The volume in our library has been on two cruises, one to the Carribean, the other to South America going through the Panama Canal. It looks forwards to another adventure or two.

Jodi Picoult's *Leaving Time* is a wonderful story of a young girl seeking information about her mother who disappeared years before. It includes everything you wanted to know about elephants and then some.

My favorite quilt author, Jennifer Chiaverini, has again tackled the Civil War. No quilts but this time she has written about spies. Elizabeth, educated in Philadelphia by Quakers, undertakes the feeding and nursing of Union soldiers in a Confederate prison. She invents clever ways of delivering messages as she risks her own life to help the Yankees.

Marie Boswick who also wrote about quilting has

changed her subject material in *The Second Sister*. Lucy returns to her small Wisconsin hometown after her sister who is mentally impaired dies. She discovers the impact her sister Alice had on the town.

Kristin Harmel has written a poignant book about learning of family history from a grandmother who has Alzheimer's disease.

The next two books I've written about previously. One was made into a TV movie starring Oprah Winfrey. It's non-fiction but great reading. *The Immortal Cells of Henrietta Lacks* is a worthwhile book about a poor family and great science. Truth is stranger than fiction!

And last today, but not least, is *The Zookeeper's Wife*, which has been made into a movie. The language is beautiful and the book is well written. Antonina, a Polish Christian woman, through cunning and love for people, saves hundreds of lives during the Holocaust.

The parents supported our efforts and approximately \$2200 worth of books were sold at our Book Fair. This allowed our teachers to choose new books for their classrooms from the credits we earned from the sale.

We "inch" towards the end of the school year with a memorable experience, of course. We took our students on a fun-filled trip to ISRAEL! Passports were sent home for children and parents to complete and return, with photo ID attached. Their "suitcases" were packed full with all of their travel essentials. They all arrived at the airport with their passports, luggage, hats, and sunglasses.

They were welcomed to the El Al Terminal of the airport where they met Captain Sherri, the airline pilot. She directed the passengers to the Immigration booth to have their passports stamped ensuring they will receive their boarding passes. They then took their seats in the wide-body 747. After all children were seated, the airline policies were addressed and the flight attendants ensured that all seat belts were properly fastened.

Rav Barry welcomed fellow passengers playing his guitar and encouraging the children to join in the songs. They prepared for take-off and handled the jostling on the bumpy runway quite well. 


