# A FEW WORDS FROM RAV BARRY Jewish Numbers Count (for the whole family)



Jews really love their numbers. In fact there's a whole Book of the Torah named "Numbers". It actually opens with counting the number of the Israelites in the wilderness.

While others count calories, we count the number of hours we have to wait for that scrumptious ice cream sundae after eating a juicy beef burger. We are so

much into numbers that we even sing a numbers song at the end of the Passover Seder. It was written long before Dr. Seuss's "One Fish, Two Fish, Red Fish, Blue Fish."

As the song goes, we have three patriarchs and six books of the Mishnah. We also have four species on Sukkot.

We have 12 tribes, ten Commandments, and 613 Mitzvot. We circumcise our sons when they are eight days old, something we didn't do in the 40 years we spent in the desert.

We had two Temples and we have one Temple Mount: the focal point of our t'fillot and the place we visited on the three pilgrimage festivals. But since we brought up "t'filla" (davening), don't forget the number 10 because without those 10 Jewish adults, we wouldn't have a Minyan to daven three times a day.

Now when it comes to seven, the sky's the limit—after all there is "seventh heaven". Shabbat is the seventh (day of week), as is the month of Tishrei (the seventh month of the year), the month of the High Holidays. The Sabbatical year appears every seven years and let's not forget the "sheva"

mitzvot bnei Noach", the seven basic Noahide commandments.

Hey, we would be remiss if we didn't exclaim "eights are great" because we light eight Chanukah candles, celebrate Shmini Atzeret on the eighth day after Sukkot and eight is the number of pieces of clothing worn by our Kohen gadol (the High Priest).

So, "to life, to life; l'chaim!" which brings us up to chai which is 18.

And it's obvious that twice chai is 36, from which if you subtract three, you get 33, a day good for bonfires, bows, arrows, haircuts, and weddings.

So when it comes to numbers—they really count. But so do we! Consider the following riddle:

Would it count if I missed one day of counting, knowing that you counted on me and would hold me accountable?

What am I talking about? Know the answer? Send me an email at ravbarry@shaareshamayim.org.

Looking forward to seeing you in shul on the 50th day for our annual Sinai Mountain camp reunion, when we sit in shul and reminisce about the old days when we were encamped at the foot of Mount Sinai receiving the Torah.

#### MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT



Wanted: Great "Followers"/Volunteers

Many leadership courses focus on leadership traits and skills. Rabbi Joshua Rabin, Director of Innovation, United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism offered a different perspective to synagogue leaders this week as he forwarded an article that

looks instead at the traits of good "followers".

"Follower" may sound like a negative word to you, but as used here it is respectful and positive. Other words for follower are: team player, participant, doer, volunteer. Good followers are creative, caring, and want to contribute to a principle or purpose outside themselves.

The article opens with the example of Sara, who applied to Vassar College in 1934. Sara's father described his daughter as a "follower" rather than a "leader". That was fine with Vassar, who commented that it already had accepted enough leaders.

Although we are obsessed by leaders in todays' culture, what if there were only leaders and no followers? Who would want to see an orchestra with only a conductor? Who would watch a sports team with just coaches? What would our synagogue be with no volunteers?

Followers are critical for successful teams. In fact, there is a whole discipline in organizational psychology called "followership".

We cannot exist without our volunteers, those critical CSS followers. Being a volunteer is a great way to meet new people and to learn more about CSS. If you have a spare hour or a spare 20 hours, find your voice with us.

The purpose is to keep older adults active, engaged, and connected to the community.





#### ALL ABOUT SHAVUOT

Custom:

Shavuot falls on the sixth and seventh days of the Hebrew month of Sivan. (The festival is observed only on the sixth of Sivan in Israel.) Like Sukkot and Passover, it is a multi-dimensional holiday, embracing profound historical, spiritual, and agricultural aspects.

From the agricultural perspective, Shavuot marks the end of the counting of the Omer that began on Passover, but it is also referred to in the Torah at Numbers 28:26 as Yom Ha-Bikkurim (the day of first fruits) and at Exodus 23:16 as *Chag HaKatzir*, the harvest festival.

In Israel, especially on the agricultural kibbutzim, much has been made of this aspect of the festival, and elaborate ceremonies involving the first fruits of the harvest season have been developed. Outside of Israel, many synagogues attempt to incorporate this theme by adorning their sanctuaries with flowers or other symbols of the fertile earth.

The historical dimension of the festival has to do with the receiving of the Torah at Mount Sinai, which, according to the tradition, (see the Talmud, Tractate Shabbat 86b-88a) took place on the sixth day of Sivan. This theme is especially prominent liturgically, as Shavuot is repeatedly called z'man mattan torateinu (the time of the giving of our Torah).

It is customary to start the evening services of the first night later than usual. This is to satisfy the implication of the Biblical verse (VaYikra 23:15) which states that we count the omer until we have completed all of the seven weeks (to the minute). Therefore, we wait to daven Ma'ariv until the 49th day has been completed (see the Shulchan Aruch, Orach Chaim 494, comment by the Magen Avraham).

It is an ancient custom for Jews to remain awake for the entire first night of Shavuot to study Torah. Legend tells that the children of Israel slept so soundly the night before the giving of the Torah that they had to be awakened by thunder and lightning. We, on the contrary, are up all night and need not be awakened. The more obvious reason is that we review and study the Torah to celebrate the anniversary of its giving.

On both days of Shavuot, two Sifrei Torah are removed from the Ark. On the first day, we read about the giving of the Ten Commandments on Sinai (from Parshat Yitro) and on the second day we read about the three pilgrimage festivals. Yizkor is recited on the second day.

We recite the Aramaic hymn known as "Akdamot", which is a praise to God for having chosen Israel and for granting us the Torah. It was written by Rabbi Meir of Orleans, a cantor in Worms, Germany in the 11th century. Akdamot is read responsively before the Cohen Aliya on the first day.

The Book of Ruth is read on the second day of Shavuot. The most quoted reason is that Ruth's coming to Israel took place around the time of Shavuot and her acceptance of the Jewish faith was like Matan Torah for the people of Israel.

It is customary to eat dairy dishes on Shavuot. Many reasons have been given for the custom. One derives it from the verse: "honey and milk shall be under your tongue" (Song of Songs 4:11) which is made to refer to the torah, implying that the words of Torah are as pleasant and acceptable to our ears and hearts as milk and honey are to our tongues. Another reason is that with the giving of the Torah, our dietary regulations, the Laws of Kashrut were established. Hence, when the people came home from Sinai, they could not eat meat because they had none that was prepared properly. To prepare new meat properly would take too long. They had no choice, therefore, but to eat milk dishes (see Shulchan Aruch, Orach Chaim 494:2).




Chloe started her CSS Jewish education at four years old. She couldn't wait to begin!




