RABBI'S STUDY



Last month, I listed all of the fall holidays and gave a little explanation for each. This month, I'll be listing the spring and summer holidays.

Tu B'shvat (Evening of January 30—January 31). Tu B'shvat is a minor holiday that occurs on the 15th day of the Hebrew month of Shvat. Referred to as “The New Year Of The Month Of the Trees”, it has evolved into a holiday about the ecology and our connection to all of creation.

Purim (Evening of February 28—March 1). A joyful holiday that recounts the Jewish victory over the evil menace of Haman. It is customary to hear the reading of Megillat Esther (The Scroll of Esther), dress up in costume, eat hamantashen, give Maatanot L'Evyonim (Gifts to the poor) and Mishloach Manot (gifts of food to friends and loved ones). The day of February 28 is a minor fast day called the Fast of Esther.

Passover (March 30—April 7). Beginning with a minor fast day for first born children only, Passover is the dramatic reenactment of the Exodus from Egypt. While the reenactment is most dramatic on the first two nights through

the seder, the fact that we only eat that which is Kosher for Passover for all eight days is also part of the reenactment. Passover celebrates the single most important event in Jewish history—our journey from slavery to freedom. HOWEVER, Passover is NOT a celebration of freedom in the American sense. God freed us for one purpose—to be Jews. When that aspect is not emphasized, we lose the meaning of Passover.

Shavuot (Evening of May 19—July 21). A two day celebration of God having given us the Torah. We call it the time of the Giving of the Torah because the tradition reminds us that we are to receive the Torah anew each and every day.

Tisha B'av (Evening of July 21—July 22). The saddest day of the Jewish year. During Tisha B'av (lit. “The ninth day of Av), we recall the destruction of the two Temples and many other tragedies that befell on that date. Traditional Jews fast on Tisha B'av and the Book of Lamentations from the Bible is read.

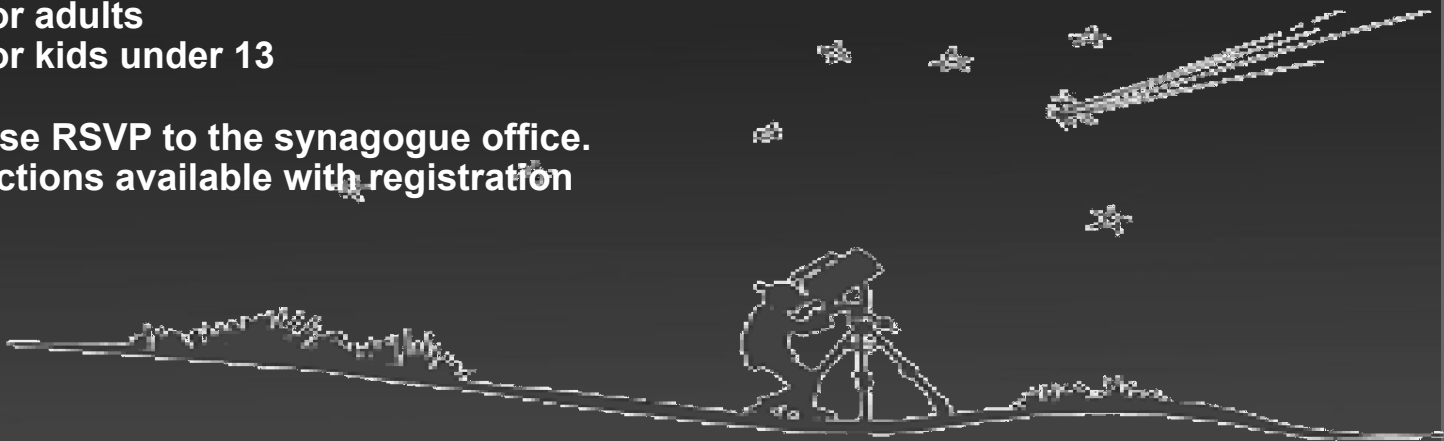

Every Wednesday morning, right after morning Minyan there is the weekly Tefillah class, which starts at 7:30AM. Rabbi Dan has been going through the Siddur and explaining the meaning and purpose of the various prayers. A light breakfast is served. There is no need to register for this class but we would love to have you drop in for some learning, noshing and good conversation.

"Introduction to Judaism" has begun. It is presented every Sunday that Hebrew School is in session and runs from 10:00AM to 11:00AM. 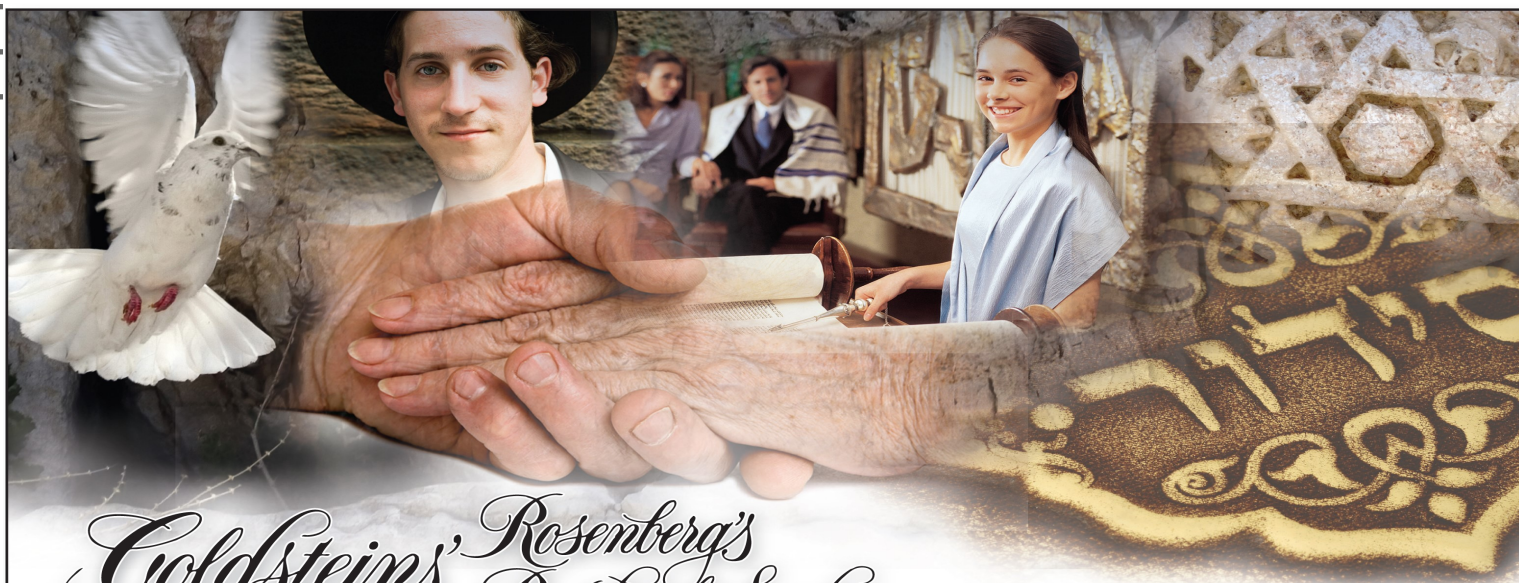

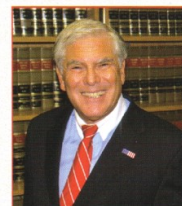

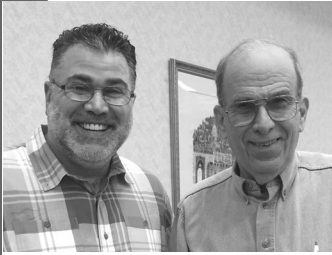
