RABBI'S STUDY



In the Passover Hagaddah, we read:

*Ha lachma anyah
di achalu avahatanah be-ar'ah
deMitzrayim.*

*This is the bread of affliction
that our fathers ate in the Land
of Egypt.*

Of course, this refers to the matzah we eat during the Festival of Freedom. But is matzah not also the first food we ate as a free people when we departed the Land of Affliction? Imagine how it must have tasted: plain but glorious! Perhaps this is why matzah is so striking a symbol. The matzah found on the seder table amidst the many luxurious courses of food served on our finest dishes reminds us that freedom can be both plain and glorious.

Our Rabbis borrowed certain practices (e.g.-drinking the four cups of wine, reclining during the meal) from Roman banquet customs and made them signs of our freedom from Egyptian slavery. And yet it is neither the fine food nor the dining customs of the rich that provide us with the central symbol of the seder meal. The choice of matzah as this symbol cautions us not to equate our freedom with wealth. Our tradition maintains the deepest sense of freedom is found within each of our souls and that it is available to all who both seek it and work toward achieving it. It is matzah that proclaims how freedom is a kingdom whose gates are open to all.

Matzah is also a symbol of our trust in

HaShem. Our ancestors were ordered to quickly depart from the Land of Egypt. There was to be no time to organize a meeting during which to debate the question. Neither was there even time for giving the command to depart second thoughts. Our ancient mothers and fathers faithfully awaited the signal and then went forward with only their possessions and matzah. But they took with them something else as well. They took with them the belief that HaShem had renewed H-s covenant with them, the very same covenant He had established with Avraham Avinu, with Abraham our Father, as well as with Isaac and Jacob. It is matzah that is the symbol of the complete trust the Israelites had in HaShem on that night at that time.

Chaverai ve-Chaverotai...My Friends: it should be very simple for us to understand. Because matzah is the symbol of both the freedom that is available to all who would taste it, and because matzah is the symbol of the perfect faith and complete trust the People Israel had in HaShem, then it is easy to see why halakhah, Jewish Law, requires that the matzot used at the beginning of the seder meal be whole and unbroken. Matzah is indeed the symbol of our love for HaShem and of HaShem's love for us.

I wish for the members of Congregations of Shaare Shamayim as well as the entire People Israel a happy and kosher Passover Festival!

Dear Friends,

There is music inside of all of us. Our own special song. Our song may be music, but it doesn't have to be. Our song is that special gift or talent, that passion and it resides inside all of us. This article is about inspiring ourselves to reach in and use that passion.

I got to thinking about this during some recent performances by the Philadelphia Orchestra.

Beethoven's 5th was on the first program. Beethoven wrote his famed 5th symphony when he was 60 percent deaf, an inspiring story. How was Beethoven able to create such an incredible gift for all of us? We could hear that music with our ears, but he "heard" that music in a way far beyond our capabilities.

Beethoven's 5th was my Dad's favorite, and though Dad was almost as deaf as Beethoven, we spent many hours listening. My Dad inspired my lifelong passion for the music, a passion for sound that he never truly heard as an adult.

The following week was another special concert. Menahem Pressler fled Nazi Germany and at 94 years old is touring the USA, Asia, Europe, and Israel. At our recent concert, he also shares some incredible memories of historic Philadelphia

Orchestra conductors. According to the program, despite his touring schedule, he continues to teach master classes.

What about that song that is inside of us? What do we do with it?

I remember a conversation with violinist Isaac Stern on an old talk show. Phil Donohue said to Mr. Stern something like, "So, you love good food, good wine....". Mr. Stern replied, "If that's all it took, everyone would be a world class violinist!" In the novel *Pride and Prejudice* by my favorite author Jane Austen, Lady Catherine indicates that "Few people in England...have more true enjoyment of music". She "should have been a great proficient"... if she "had ever learnt"!

All around us are people who are sharing their talents and gifts with us. There are beautiful meals, well led events, warm and wonderful Shabbatot, a building full of song and life and community. If you have a passion and a gift to share to add to our community, please don't make us search for you. Call us. Write us. You can help us become "proficient"— and we look forward to it!
