#### RABBI'S STUDY



From the Babylonian Talmud we read the following:

Once Honi was walking along the road when he saw a man planting a carob tree. Honi asked: "How long before it will bear fruit?" The man answered: "Seventy years." Honi then asked: "Are you sure

that you will be alive in seventy years to eat from its fruit?" The man replied: "I found this world filled with carob trees. Just as my ancestor planted for me, so shall I plant for my children."

How many times have you read an article about Israel and wished you could do something to help Israelis? If you are like me, I am sure that you think about this a great deal of the time. The fact is that you can do something to help our brothers and sisters in the Land of Israel, and it is directly related to what many American Jews refer to as "Jewish Arbor Day."

I am, of course, referring to "Tu B'Shevat," the Fifteenth of Shevat, which is the New Year for Trees. The Talmud refers to Tu B'Shevat as the new year with respect to tithing one's agricultural harvest (10%) to G-d. As time passed, our sages determined that because it is at this time of the year that the fruit of the trees of the Land of Israel begins to form as the sap rises in the trees' branches, Tu B'Shevat would be known as the New

Year for Trees. On this day, it is customary to eat one or more of the following fruits or grains grown in the Land of Israel: almonds, dates, figs, pomegranates, olives, carob, wheat, or barley. With the establishment of the State of Israel, one more "minhag," one more custom, has been added to this minor holiday.

You may ask: "Rabbi, how is Tu B'Shevat related to my being able to help Israel?" The answer is that on Tu B'Shevat it has become the custom for American Jews to make a donation to the Jewish National Fund (JNF) in order to plant a tree/trees in the Land of Israel. At this time, the JNF is also helping to increase the critical shortfall in the water resources so desperately needed for a successful growing season.

So, if you lament the "fact" that you believe you cannot do anything for our people in the Land of Israel, I strongly urge you to consider making a donation to the JNF on Tu B'Shevat in order to help make life easier for our people. By doing so, you will personally help to ensure that "Arn Yisrael Chai!" – "the People Israel lives!"
