Where is Your Soul Going?

I recently taught a class about what Jews believe about the Soul. We tried to learn it all in two classes. Throughout Jewish history the concepts about what happens to the soul after we die has been a consistent concern, but the ideas about what happens to the soul have changed.

We discussed compelling theories about Afterlife, near-death experiences, previous lives, reincarnation, and resurrection – all within a Jewish framework. We realized that wondering about what happens after we live is not as important as making sure that the life we are living is lived most fully.

I discovered a fairly new book called *The Seven Questions You are Asked in Heaven* by Dr. Ron Wolfson. It suggests that when someone dies there is a Judgment moment when the deceased is asked seven questions, and their eternal fate is dependent on the answers. In Jewish tradition, perhaps we should be saying "The World to Come" (Ha'Olam HaBa) instead of "heaven," but the idea that we are judged is what is important.

Judaism always teaches we can't know exactly what happens after we die. No one dies and comes back to tell us. The important thing for us to care about is how we live life now. Not surprisingly the questions that supposedly are asked when you die reflect how well you lived.

Briefly the seven questions ask:

First: Were you honest? Second: Did you leave a legacy?

Third: Did you set aside time to study?
Fourth: Did you have hope in your heart?
Fifth Did you get your priorities straight?

Sixth: Did you enjoy this world?

Seventh: Were you the best that you can be?

It takes a lifetime to prepare for that Judgment moment. I had once heard that the afterlife was us sitting in class with G-d as the teacher. Imagine being able to get answers to all the


unanswerable questions. I always felt that I wouldn't want to be unprepared for that class. These questions are like having preparation questions for the final exam. I strongly suggest that you work on them – don't fail this test.

We realize that whatever we believe in Life After Death, we definitely believe in Life Before Death. Live it well. L'CHAIM! To Life!

From our Educator

Let's start this month with hearty congratulations to our second and third grade students in Jodi Vosburg's class: Their bake sale raised more than \$240 to send to Haiti's earthquake victims. The children came up with the idea on their own, and they held the bake sale during the Purim Carnival. Thanks to their parents and others who baked as well as to those who bought.

We will "revive" our Preschool Parent Group after a few months' vacation by having a special "Spring Brunch" on Sunday, April 11 featuring dishes made with "fresh fruits and vegetables." Parents are encouraged to visit a farmer's market with their children and then to make some kind of dish with the produce that you find. Children should also bring a musical instrument (wooden spoon and aluminum pan will work just fine, as will anything from a kids' music set).

April is a great "outdoors" month, so I'd like to encourage all families to do something "green." Not everyone wants to host a garage sale (proceeds can go to a tzedakah project of your choice), but lots of families could enjoy a "toy swap" or on an adult level, a "kitchen swap." In both cases, items that you no longer use are swapped for things that other families no longer use. Nothing ends up in a landfill, and without buying anything at all, your child can enjoy toys, books, or games that another family has outgrown, and you can try out the bread machine that is sitting unused in someone's pantry. If you think this sounds like fun, let me know; we can try it out on a Sunday following Religious School.

On Sunday, April 18 we will celebrate Israel's independence with age-appropriate activities for our students. If you'd like to help, please email me: we need people to prepare food, to help with Israeli dancing, to help with games, etc. We also want every family to contribute a "square" to our "Israel quilt." We will provide the fabric squares – you may embellish them in any way that you like as long as you do something to help us "celebrate" Israel's 62nd birthday.

There will be no Religious School on Sunday, April 4 (Passover break), but we will have classes on April 11, 18, and 25 – please plan to attend each week. We are moving toward the end of the year, and our teachers have many things left to teach. They are MOST successful when they have a full class of students WHO ARRIVE ON TIME.

We all appreciate the support we get from our parents. You help with special projects; you substitute when we need you; you buy the things that we ask for. Another way to support the school is to give to the Religious School fund in honor of your kids' birthdays, or at any time that you usually give a gift in honor of or in memory of someone. The fund covers all the projects that fall beyond the scope of the budget so that we do not have to limit the ways in which we teach our children, support our staff, and strengthen our families.

I look forward to April and May as time to bring our school year to a successful end, even as we plan for a new and exciting year in 2010-2011.


Birthday Blessing Shabbat

Barry has researched and collected rare photographs of Eastern European wooden synagogues for the past 40 years. He was a photojournalist for years, and his photographs have appeared in Time, Life, and other publications. He is also an award-winning graphic designer.

Of the more than 1,000 wooden synagogues that existed before WWII, only a handful remain today. All are boarded up, in disrepair and abandoned. This film tells the story of the synagogues, the life that surrounded them before the war, and what happened to them in the last 50 years.
