

# From Rabbi Jana

Starting Over

How many times can you start over? In video games, it used to be that the number of lives you had depended on the number of quarters you had. Most people would point out that real life doesn't work that way. We get one

opportunity at life. We probably each know someone who had a "bonus life" – they were pronounced legally dead, but with persistent care-givers, their time in this world was extended. Sometimes it takes knowing someone like that, or obviously *being* someone like that to make us truly appreciate the one life opportunity we have... to do the best we can to make the most of this one life – enjoy it, do things for ourselves and others that help to enhance the meaning of life. Sometimes it takes a miracle to make us appreciate what we have.

I hope that you realize that when we live our lives Jewishly, we are given many opportunities to start over. At B'nai Zion, thanks to our renovated synagogue, we definitely feel like we are starting over. Thanks to the new sanctuary design, our worship is a fresh, new, inspiring experience. Thanks to our new kitchen appliances, even our food experiences at B'nai Zion will be like starting over.

The Jewish calendar gives us many opportunities to start over: The High Holy Days: Rosh Hashanah with a new year and Yom Kippur with a clean slate; Shabbat with a refreshed, re-Jew-venated weekly new beginning; and even Passover, as the newness of Spring enhances our experience of remembering and attaining our freedom.

You already know that in my family we clean the house to remove all of the chametz we can find – in the closets, under the beds, wash the curtains, dump the drawers... For us Passover really feels like a fresh start – an exhausting, but refreshing start.

Passover is a festival that reminds us that we are bound together in history as a people. It ties us to all Jews all around the world today. It gives us hope for the future. It is about being Jewish – being part of something bigger than our individual selves. If you have ever been to a Seder with only a few people, you know that it just doesn't feel right. Passover is about the crowd of people who left slavery... the multitude that traveled together to freedom. It points us directly to that awesome moment, seven times seven weeks away, when we – as a people – experienced God -- with all of our senses, and with all of our friends and family and neighbors around us.

I hope that you feel that you are getting to start over. I hope that you renew and strengthen your place in our people. I hope you realize that living a life filled with special people is an important part of what makes life special. I hope you find time to deepen your knowledge of how Judaism guides us to take care of ourselves and each other and our world. I hope you find many good occasions for us to worship together. I hope to see you soon. I hope you have, as my grandparents (may their memories be blessings) used to say: a zissen and a kosher Pesach (a sweet and kosher Passover).

#### From our Educator

With memories of a hugely successful Purim Carnival still in mind, I am now looking ahead to Pesach (Passover), my favorite Jewish holiday. Pesach is the essence of Judaism, our story of freedom from slavery. It is also for me the ultimate family festival because we are commanded to tell the story of our deliverance *every year* to our children. In fact, the haggadah tells us four different times that we must teach our children. One explanation of the need for *four* directions to teach them is that they are different from one another. They learn differently. So, whether they are wise, simple, wicked (do we really have wicked children?), or unable to ask



their questions, we nonetheless have the responsibility of helping them understand what it means to be a part of a people who were freed from slavery in order to forever be sensitive to the value of freedom. We have a responsibility to do more than just read the words written for us in the haggadah. We need to engage in discussion as we go through our service. We need to make the experiences of our spiritual ancestors relevant in our own lives. We need to show concern for those who are enslaved by poverty and by ignorance. Our congregational efforts to feed the hungry, support the homeless and the disadvantaged reflect Jewish values that come straight from Pesach. We who have known slavery and who cherish freedom must not turn away from the cries of those who are oppressed. They may be physically enslaved like far too many women and children in other parts of the world, socially enslaved like LGTB individuals whose fight for equality is also our fight; or even spiritually enslaved by dogma like those whose religious intolerance we abhor. Pesach teaches us to celebrate our own freedom, but it also inspires us to open our eyes to the slavery around us. It impels us to get involved in the larger world and work so that other people's lives are free from discrimination, inadequate education, and lack of dignity.

Taking the lessons of Pesach to heart, we are about to embark on our Third Annual Mitzvah Day, a day of service to help those in need and to beautify the world in which we live. It is scheduled for Sunday, May 4. Please put the date on your calendar and commit *now* to joining us. Mitzvah Day is *not* just for kids or even just for Religious School families. It is for the entire Jewish community. It is a gift we *freely give* to our community *because* we value the freedom that we once gained from slavery in Egypt and that we fought for – and died for — repeatedly in our history when enemies tried to oppress us.

Finally, I invite everyone who is physically able to give blood in our Blood Drive Sunday, April 27. We have set a goal of donating 25 units of blood, and if we are to meet that goal, we need new donors as well as repeating donors. Most important is the addition of the Bone Marrow Registry to our Blood Drive. It takes only a swab of the inside of your cheek (no needles) to provide a sample and enter the "Be a Match" registry. You might have the opportunity to save the life of a child with leukemia, a child like Zach Guillot, whose life we celebrate as we mourn his death at age 9. The target group is people ages 18-44. We hope everyone in that age group will participate. Look for additional information elsewhere in the bulletin.

Happy Pesach to all of you. In April Religious School classes meet only twice: Sunday, April 6 and Sunday, April 27. The middle Sundays of the month are part of our Pesach Break.



We've provided Life Share Blood Center with 20 units of blood for the past two years. This year we hope to make it 25. This year's Blood Drive is organized to take place on Yom HaShoah, the day of Remembrance of the Holocaust. We turn ourselves to giving new life through blood transfusions on a day that we mourn the loss of 11 million: six million Jews and five million others who were targeted for their ethnic heritage, their gender orientation, or their health status.




