### How We Remember

We have been using our renovated sanctuary for more than a year. Everyone who sees it comments about the peaceful, spiritual experience they feel just by being in that sacred space. It almost makes me sad when we have crowds that

are too large to be in the sanctuary, because that feeling isn't the same as in Lefkowitz Hall.

Of course, there is a very special feeling when we are gathered together in a group that is so large that we need to be in Lefkowitz Hall. This year we shared that experience in the evenings of the High Holy Days. We also needed the extra large space for Passover, when more than 140 people joined together (for an incredibly delicious Passover meal – thank you Sisterhood – and liberation experience). We also love to be in Lefkowitz Hall for celebrations, like Bar/Bat Mitzvah gatherings.

Part of what motivates us to get together in large numbers is because we enjoy being with each other to help celebrate, join our voices in prayer, share new experiences, or console. I understand that everyone tries to be at the synagogue to reflect on the old year, and pray for blessings for the coming year. I understand that everyone likes to be together to celebrate freedom, and share a meal together. This year I hope that everyone will feel motivated to join us for an experience that combines all of the reasons we gather together: hope and memory, rejoicing in our history and celebrating our future, and most important – acknowledging and loving the essence of what it means to be Jewish.

Shavuot is the holiday that brings us back to the moment that we stood together at Sinai, and each of us individually and united together were present to receive the "laws of life."

Every time someone from B'nai Zion comes back to visit, one of the first things they do is find themselves on the Confirmation wall. Then they find their family members on the wall. Then they start remembering their friends and neighbors who are there. I have been told that the first few years in our current building, so many people came to Shavuot services that they had to hold them in the social hall, just like for High Holy Days.

I realize that we don't have the same size congregation now that we did then. I am glad that we will be experiencing our first Confirmation service in the new sanctuary. For so many reasons I hope that we fill-up the space. We celebrate what is arguably the most awesome historical moment of all time. We remember the loved ones each of us have lost during the Yizkor service. We show our Confirmands that when their picture is added to the wall, all of you will remember them, and they will remember how important the congregation is to them.

The Confirmation wall now spans about 100 years. The pictures show Confirmation services in three buildings. The buildings change, but when people find themselves and their families and friends in the pictures, we see that the congregation is made up of the people who share experiences in the sacred space. We look at who we were. We see who we were with. We think of who we have become.

We no longer know which mountain we were standing at when we received the laws. We remember that we stood together. We remember that we heard the call and answered the call to be a people.

I look forward to worshiping with you for Shavuot and Shabbat this month... and always.

### From our Educator

The end of one school year is the beginning of the next. Just as our Torah reading cycle is completed in a year, and just as we experience the full range of Jewish life cycle events from birth to death, our educational program is a continuous one. Yes, we have breaks for vacations, but we never really shut down. Our teachers finish their curricula and wish their students a happy summer, but they also pack their suitcases for a weekend in late June at the ISJL Conference where they prepare for the next year.



Our students attend the last day of classes and enjoy our annual picnic, but they too pack their suitcases for Jewish summer camps away from home or their backpacks for Camp

Chai right here in Shreveport. Families travel, and we hope they look for Jewish sites as they explore new cities or new countries. Families read books and watch movies, and we hope they include subject matter that is noticeably Jewish or that can be tied to Jewish values. Summer vacation is not time off from Judaism, but rather a time for families to live Jewishly while they are not impeded by the regular school year schedule.

You can learn about the Jewish environmental movement and then visit the Shreveport Farmers' Market. You can learn about the Jewish calendar and then visit the planetarium at Sci-Port or the star parties south of town at the Worley Observatory. You can celebrate Shabbat by cooking together and sitting down to a meal that is not rushed – and you can light candles, make Kiddush, and bless your children. You can start your own summer Jewish traditions by checking out Jewish websites like MyJewishLearning.com or Kveller.com or BigTentJudaism.com. Rabbi Jana and I would be thrilled to help you plan a summer that includes some Jewish learning as well as opportunities to socialize with other families in the community. One idea is to have a Shema slumber party for young kids – where they come in their pj's for dessert and Shema pillowcase decorating. Another is to have a cooking school for families with some of our star cooks as "celebrity chefs." Tell us that you want summer programming – and that you will help make it happen.

As we think of making things happen, I invite all of you to participate in our 4th Annual Mitzvah Day on Sunday, May 17. Yes, this program takes place after the end of Religious School, but it's a great opportunity for you and your kids (and for those in the congregation who are not part of the Religious School) to take actions that save the world, honor those who came before us, and make our community a more beautiful place. Watch for email announcements and flyers that will outline some of this year's opportunities. The time frame can match your usual Religious School schedule – 9:30 to noon – or you can do something a little later in the day. All projects will end by 2:00 or 3:00 so that parents have time to rest and shower before coming to the B'nai Zion Annual Meeting that same day starting at 5:00 PM, followed by dinner.

We cannot recess for the summer without another shout-out to our teachers. They have worked hard to teach our kids, but even more important, they have modeled what it means to be a Jewish adult. By being here week after week with enthusiasm and creativity, they have shown our children that Religious School is not just for kids. They have shown our children that Religious School brings friends together (our teachers are a close-knit group) and that adults can still learn new things.

Finally, we cannot recess for the summer without a big shout-out to our rabbi. Rabbi Jana has worked tirelessly to prepare our B'nai Mitzvah students, to lead our children in weekly worship, and to elevate our Confirmation students' knowledge about living Jewish lives.

Join us for Mitzvah Day, have a relaxing summer, and let me know how I can help YOUR family continue to grow over the vacation period.

# Jacob P. Schick "Jake" Brain Performance Institute

Jake Schick, Warrior Relations Specialist with the Brain Performance Institute's Warrior Training Team, is a third generation Marine who epitomizes service and sacrifice.

After a triple-stacked tank mine detonated below his vehicle in Al Anbar Province, Iraq in 2004, Jake suffered compound fractures in his left leg and left arm; multiple skin, ligament and bone losses; varying burns; partial loss of his left hand and arm; amputation below the knee of his right leg, traumatic brain injury (TBI) and post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD).

Jake has undergone 46 operations, 23 blood transfusions, and countless hours of rehabilitation. Jake will tell you his physical injuries weren't the worst that happened to him. For years he dreaded his TBI and PTSD diagnosis; a common mindset among warriors. After being encouraged by a fellow warrior to train his brain the way he re-trained his body, Jake skeptically participated in the Brain Performance Institute's high performance brain training, called SMART. He credits this opportunity with making him a better husband, father and man

Since participating in the SMART program, Jake has become a staunch advocate for maximizing the cognitive potential in people from all walks of life and shares his story and the effects of being severely wounded at public speaking engagements throughout the country.

A passionate and fearless leader whose quick wit and stories of intestinal fortitude have a profound impact on everyone he meets, Jake has appeared on James Gandolfini's HBO special "Alive Day Memories: Home from Iraq," as well as "60 Minute Sports" and various other local and national venues. Jake also plays a small role in Clint Eastwood's production of "American Sniper." You can read Jake's Open Letter To Warriors and his eloquent wisdom on resilience in Psychology Today.

Jake's passion lies in helping his fellow warriors regain their drive and determination and enhance their cognitive performance in his role as a Warrior Training Specialist at the Center for BrainHealth and Brain Performance Institute.

# Benjamin Maxey Organ Recital



Yom Yerushalayim (Jerusalem Day in Hebrew) is the anniversary of the liberation and unification of Jerusalem under Jewish sovereignty that occurred during the Six Day War. It is one of four holiday (in addition to Yom HaShoah, Yom HaZikaron, and YomHaAtzmaut) that were added to the Jewish calendar in the 20th century. This year it is celebrated May 17.
