Something from Nothing

There is a great Jewish folktale about a grandfather who is a tailor, and makes his newborn grandson a blanket. As the baby turns into a toddler, the blanket gets old and the ends fray. Grandpa snips and sews and turns the blanket into a little jacket for the grandson.

Eventually the jacket gets frayed, and grandpa snips and sews and turns what is left into a vest. Eventually that wears out and gets turned into a handkerchief, and after awhile it gets turned into a button.

One day while the little boy is playing, the button pops off and gets lost. The grandson is distraught that grandpa can no longer make anything out of the cloth. Grandpa surprises him by proving to be able to make something from nothing, when he turns the missing button into: a story about the fabric, snipping, sewing, growing, wearing away, and creating something new.

There are many reasons to appreciate this story. The love between the grandpa and the grandson. How much the grandson cherishes each thing that grandpa does for him. The connection to the past – what the fabric was, and the future – what it becomes. Of course, the best part of the story is that when things seem useless, something good can come out of it. It often takes work and some creative re-thinking, but even losses can be seen as new opportunities. Sometimes an end is what was needed to create a new beginning. Also, sometimes it takes a writer to write a story about how wonderful it is to be able to write.

Sometimes I feel like our little Shreveport Jewish community has our own version of how to make something from nothing. We went from months that were filled with holy days and connecting with God and each other, and we move into a month that is supposed to be uneventful. This month is supposed to be filled with: nothing.

Somehow, with a little effort and creativity, we have turned this empty month into one that is overflowing with events, workshops, special guests, a variety of worship services, and more.

When I hear the story, sometimes I see it through the eyes of the grandchild, and love and admire the grandpa for being resourceful. Looking at the things that he made and knowing he made them for me, I am extremely grateful, and filled with love and appreciation. Sometimes I feel like the grandparent, watching the one I love change, and grow, and then sometimes lose and suffer. At those times I pray that I can be there for the people I love — to help them reinterpret bad situations to find something to appreciate. Sometimes I am the fabric, first feeling a sense of purpose, but sometimes realizing that I can't do what I had done anymore. At times like that I pray that I find a way to make something out of what seems to be nothing, and find new meaning in life.

Can we make something new together? Absolutely! There's nothing to it.

From our Educator, Helaine Braunig

"Mazel tov and siman tov and siman tov and mazel tov" - our grandsons Levi and Asa broke into spontaneous and celebratory song when, in complete darkness, we found the driveway (hidden by autumn leaves) leading to our log cabin in the Berkshires. Their song was just another reminder of how infused with Judaism their young lives are.

We arrived in time to welcome Shabbat, albeit after sunset, with candles we found in the cabin and wine and challah we brought with us. Jordan and Casey weren't arriving until the next morning, but Bill and I remembered that bedtime should include the singing of the Shema. The next day we spent hiking and cooking and reading and playing Uno (no television set in the cabin and no video games on the iPad). As it turned toward evening, Levi could hardly wait for Havdalah. We didn't have a Havdalah candle, just a taper removed from a chandelier, and our spice box was just a jar of cinnamon from the pantry, but we still had wine (we always have wine), and the singing of the blessings was sweet; and the soft sputter of the candle in the wine was followed by another trip outside to look up at the gorgeous starry sky. Every time I'm with Jordan and Casey and their children, I am reminded that the rituals of Judaism can bring such joy into family life.

Yes, it takes a little effort to be prepared each week, and no, we may not all make it to services every week, but when children celebrate Shabbat and festivals regularly, there really is a difference in their lives. What could be more fun for grandparents than hearing almost-three year old Asa singing "Veshamru" from start to finish? It rivals the thrill of watching the kids kick soccer goals and hit baseballs.

As we head into a month in which we have an American ritual for giving thanks, I am grateful for the opportunity to be a member of a congregation and community that engenders thankfulness every week. As our kids bring tzedakah to Religious School each week, we try to make it clear that we are thankful to be able to help others by volunteering in the community as well as by bringing dollars.

We are thankful for Rabbi Jana, Cantor Neil, and all our teachers who give their time and talent to help our children live lives of blessing. This month especially we honor our veterans and celebrate the bounty of our country's blessings. Remember to set an example for our children by exercising your right to vote. The rabbi and I, along with Donald and Connie Posner, will attend the URJ Biennial in Orlando. We hope to return with inspiration for new ways to engage everyone in Jewish life.

In the meantime, let's remember to celebrate all of the newness in life. Just yesterday I picked an apple for the first time in a Massachusetts orchard, and Jordan reminded me to say a Shehechayanu. I stood there, apple in hand, and recited the Hebrew words. Being thankful defines us as Jews--this month and in all months.

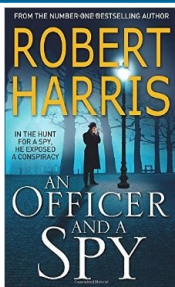

An Exploration of Gratefulness : Gratefulness is the foundation of our spiritual practice. Our liturgy teaches us that the very first words uttered each morning are to be words of thanksgiving. Our morning prayer of gratefulness is designed to open our hearts and energize us to step onto the path of Holiness. Yet so often we get caught in the habits of complaint. We lose sight of the miracle of each moment. Our enthusiasm, inspiration, receptivity and generosity are eclipsed by the stresses of Life. When we fall prey to the cynicism and jadedness of the dominant culture, we lose the opened-eyed innocence and radical amazement that is necessary for the Life of Gratefulness. In this workshop, Sunday, November 27, at 4 p.m., we will explore this quality in our lives and learn practices that cultivate, nurture and refine our ability to feel and express gratefulness. We will use the practices of text study, chant, meditation and holy conversation to uncover the obstacles to gratefulness and each learn how to deal with our particular challenge.

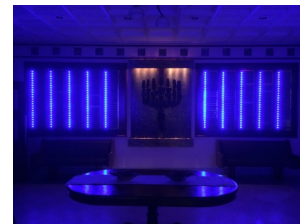

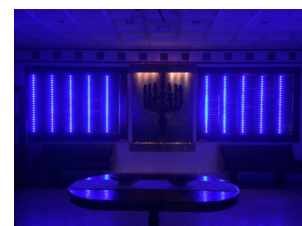
You've Got Mail
