Who Do You Want To Be?

I am surprised that more people don't try some kind of disguise for Purim. It has always been one of my favorite

parts of the holiday. It is exciting to find something clever, and even more fun to see what other people have done with themselves. The kids in costumes can be absolutely adorable, whether they are trying to be the Purim characters, superheroes, animals, or whatever. The adults in costume are really wonderful. I had a professor who would always find some "punny" clever outfit that usually required his wife as a partner to complete the idea. For example, one year they both wore signs around their necks that said, "Mitzvah." She carried a baseball bat, and he carried a short metal bar. They were dressed as "Bar and Bat Mitzvah." When I was a teenager, I was impressed when the female student cantor at my congregation came wearing a t-shirt that said "Vashti was the first feminist." The Rabbi that year – at my Reform congregation – cracked everyone up, because he came dressed as a Chassid.

You may notice that I wear at least one costume every year. Usually there is one for the service and often I have a different one for the carnival. At least once I changed my costume during the service, and at least once I changed my costume during the carnival. It is really fun to see the reactions of the kids – and adults – to the choices of the costumes I make.

There is something very refreshing about having a holiday that encourages us to try on different disguises – to briefly choose to "be" someone or something else. Judaism is not the only religion or culture that encourages this. Many of you have experienced this for Mardi Gras or Halloween. But when we do it for a Jewish holiday it feels safer, which makes it more fun.

Being able to disguise oneself is an important part of the story of Esther that we read on Purim. Esther hid her Jewish identity, which in the end allowed her to save not only herself and Mordecai, but the Jews of the kingdom as well. Esther had a Hebrew name, which was Hadassah. When she was disguised as a Persian, she went by the name Esther. In Persian the name Esther is taken from the name of a goddess, but the Hebrew root of the name Esther means "hidden."

I am not suggesting that by hiding our identity we can save our people. I do believe that by participating in the enjoyable attempt to disguise ourselves in order to better celebrate this Jewish holiday we will strengthen our bonds with our Jewish people, for us and our children, and thereby strengthen Judaism, and help preserve the future of Judaism

After you have chosen your disguise, and celebrated the holiday, and you put away your costume,

hopefully you are inspired to feel more empowered to be proud of your Jewishness. Hopefully taking off your disguise makes you feel freer to be Jewish. And feeling free to be Jewish is exactly the mood you need to be in after Purim, as we begin our preparations for Passover, when your new freedom lets you be the person you want to be. See you at the Purim Schpiel (but maybe we won't recognize each other).




Finding Leaders for B'nai Zion

People of the Book



Our next book is *The Last Jews in Berlin* by Leonard Gross. "Very well researched and readable at the same time." Though perhaps best read alongside other books on the Holocaust, *The Last Jews in Berlin* is a powerful and gripping portrait of life in Berlin during the Second World War. The meeting date is **7 p.m. Tuesday, March 8**.

The book that will be discussed in April or May is the latest winner of the National Jewish Book award: *The Last Flight of Poxl West* by Daniel Torday. A stunning novel from award-winning author Daniel Torday, in which a young man recounts his idolization of his Uncle Poxl, a Jewish, former-RAF pilot, exploring memory, fame and story-telling. All his life, Elijah Goldstein has idolized his charismatic Uncle Poxl. Intensely magnetic,

cultured and brilliant, Poxl takes Elijah under his wing, introducing him to opera and art and literature. But when Poxl publishes a memoir of how he was forced to leave his home

north of Prague at the start of WWII and then avenge the deaths of his parents by flying RAF bombers over Germany during the war, killing thousands of German citizens, Elijah watches as the carefully constructed world his uncle created begins to unravel. As Elijah discovers the darker truth of Poxl's past, he comes to understand that the fearless war hero he always revered is in fact a broken and devastated man who suffered unimaginable losses from which he never recovered.

The Last Flight of Poxl West beautifully weaves together what it means to be a family in the shadow of war—to love, to lose, and to heal.
