# Try to Remember

The Jewish holidays are going to be here later than we usually expect them this year. A few years ago we were surprised to have Chanukah coincide with Thanksgiving. This year the first night of Chanukah is December 24 and the

last candle will be lit New Year's Eve. I don't remember that ever happening.

We don't have to start getting ready for Chanukah, but this month we are supposed to start preparing for our big month of Holy Days. This year they will all be in October—starting with the evening of Rosh HaShanah on October 2 all the way to Simchat Torah at the end of October.

We are supposed to remember to blow the shofar every morning in the month of Elul. One of the reasons is that the sound is supposed to be a 'wake-up call' to get our souls ready for the spiritual impact of the Days of Awe.

We begin to try to remember the choices we made and the actions we took during the whole past year. We can rejoice in the good choices, but we are supposed to find ways to fix the consequences of the bad choices. The Days of Awe are in some ways like a final opportunity to right our wrongs.

There are some choices we make—and sometimes especially the consequences—that we don't forget. In fact, remembering some of the things that we did, or things that we didn't do, keeps us awake at night. We can potentially deal with these things any day, but this period of the year we are especially reminded to focus on them and find a way to take responsibility and repair the consequences.

Remembering the choices and consequences of other things sometimes gets lost when our lives are filled with just trying to mke it through another day. That is one of the reasos why having reminders—like shofar blasts becomes helpful. It is also why the focus of our worship services shift a little starting in Elul. We get to spend a little less time being grateful for our blessings, and a little more time trying to remember ways when we were not living lives of blessing. The prayers start to focus on the variety of ways we might have done more damage than good in the world. We need to try to remember those things. We need to try to remember to fix them, and try to remember to make different choices in the future.

There is a lot about the worship services during the High Holy Days that hasn't changed for generations. The prayers, the melodies, the food—or fasting, and the breaking of the fast—that help us to remember previous years. We remember the people who had been with us—family and friends who are no longer with us, or who simply don't live close enough to us to be together with them this year. If we try to remember we can find memories of how it felt to sit with them at services or at their table. In fact, holidays often evoke these memories more freely than during our everyday lives.

Obviously some of the things we will try to remember are wonderful, and others are difficult. Try to remember that we gather together during this time in the Jewish year intentionally to make it easier to remember, and to be able to celebrate with each other and support each other. Remember that we need you, and we realize that sometimes you need us.

### From our Educator, Helaine Braunig

Another year . . . I'm beginning to get a bit nostalgic as I realize that my own kids were the age of some of my grandchildren when I first started compiling curriculum, finding teachers, and planning celebrations and programs for our Religious School. How can my youngest child be 35? And that makes his brothers 39 and 41. Bill and I were just on our way on the parenting journey when I took over this office and began accumulating the large library that I'll enjoy when I retire because I'm too busy to read right now. Bill and I were finding our adult places in the congregation we had grown up in, celebrating Confirmation and participating in youth group, though not exactly at the same time.



Today I'm reminded that so much of what we do in educating our children is about instilling that sense of community that binds us to our Jewish family, whether that family is our personal family, our congregational family, or our community family. How fortunate we are that today's Religious School is a communitywide school, with children—as well as a rabbi and cantor—from both congregations. How fortunate we are that friendships are now formed early between the children of B'nai Zion and Agudath Achim, so unlike my discovery at Byrd High School in the 1960s of Jewish classmates that I didn't even know. We have come a long way.

As we begin a new year, I am so thrilled to have a returning faculty. There are a few people in positions that are different from last year, but they are still "faculty family," already close to each other, many having been together at the ISJL Conference, many having gathered for dinner at my house to welcome our new ISJL fellow. There is a closeness among them that is palpable, and it serves as a model for our children of what it means to be a Jewish community. The kids see the teachers talking with each other, helping each other out, concerned for each other's families. I want you to know how blessed we are to have this tight-knit group that includes Goldy Marrus, Sharon Goldman, Bill Braunig, Amy Turner, Diane Dufilho, Kathy Brodnax, Rebecca Austin, Barbara Joseph, and Bethany Sorkey. We also have dedicated parents, and we welcome your contributions of time and talent to our school. I'd love to have a call from each of you asking what you can do to help—before I call you.

Though we emphasize the fact that we have a solid curriculum and plenty of enrichment activities such as art, music, and cooking, we need to acknowledge that we also now have an awesome playground! So many thanks are owed to Garrett Brainis and his family for the Eagle Scout project that he conceived and persevered to



bring to completion. I can't wait to see how much the kids enjoy the new equipment. It may be harder than ever to bring them in from their short breaks outside. Classes have begun, and we are eager to begin projects and programs that make Jewish life in Shreveport meaningful for our children. At the same time, we want them to feel connected to Jews throughout the United States and throughout the world, especially, but not limited to, the land of Israel.

If you have lived outside the United States, this is the year we will call upon you—and members of our congregations who don't have kids in Religious School—to share with us the similarities and differences in living Jewishly here and abroad. For that matter, we want the kids to hear about living in other parts of our country and in large cities, so please let me know if you'd be willing to share something of your growing up outside of Shreveport.

We have lots of time this year before the High Holy Days to reflect upon their meaning and take actions to prepare for them. Watch for our Elul activities (Elul is the Hebrew month that precedes Tishrei, the month of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur).

It is such a blessing for us to celebrate happy events together.


Please join us each month when we bless and honor those who will be celebrating a **birthday** or **anniversary** during the month.

The Slichot service falls as the Shabbat before Rosh HaShanah ends. It gives us an opportunity to begin to reflect and prepare for the Days of Awe which are about to begin. The Slichot service includes melodies and readings that are a "foretaste" of Rosh HaShanah. At the end of the service we hear the shofar blast. continue their journey to repentance and forgiveness.


### Slichot Movie, Discussion and Worship at B'nai Zion
