

FROM RABBI JANA...

"TRASH TALK"



The word "Bamidbar" also seems to be related to the Hebrew root D-B-R, which translates as "word" or "thing" or has to do with "speaking." Each Torah portion this month has speaking as an important part of the story. One week we hear the spies saying that even though the land was flowing with milk and honey, the people they saw there made the spies feel like grasshoppers. Caleb will teach some great insights about that Torah portion during his Bar Mitzvah service at Agudath Achim.

Another Torah portion describes when Moses and Aaron's cousin, Korach, speaks up with a challenge that he should be the leader instead of Moses or Aaron. His speeches convinced others to doubt the leaders.

By the end of June we will hear a lesson from Luke and Ben about a donkey that speaks up against injustice against her. The donkey's owner is a specialist at using words to curse or bless, and he needs to listen to God and only say what God tells him to say—despite the fact that a king is offering him a lot of money to curse the Jews.

Speaking up in negative ways against people tends to have severe consequences. We hear about it in the news. We feel it in bad relationships. We read about it in the Torah. We are taught to speak up to help others.

There are Jewish lessons about how God gave us two ears and one mouth, so that we listen twice as much as we speak. There is also another reason given about two ears: so that the "trash talk" we hear about ourselves can go in one ear and out the other. We learn to use our words wisely: to speak kindly, to teach consideration for others, to listen for opportunities to show that we care for others.

Lately I have been thinking about a different kind of "trash talk." I have seen a lot of news about how the plastic we throw away has become a horrible problem that threatens animals and humans. For example, I learned that Americans throw away 500 million plastic straws every day. The straws are too light to go through recycling processes. If we simply throw them into our trash, it takes hundreds of years for them to disintegrate—and even then, the particles wind up in our water supplies, and pollute our drinking water or get eaten by animals. I have seen horrible images of what straws do to animals that accidentally try to eat the plastic. I have seen pictures of plastic trash accumulating at alarming quantities in remote areas of our oceans and on our beaches.

I look around and I think about all the ways that plastic really helps us. Plastics are so much a part of the things we use that it is practically impossible to eliminate plastic from our lives.


B'nai Zion is taking steps to reduce, reuse and recycle the plastics that we use. We have eliminated plastic stirrers for our coffee (we use spoons and wash them instead). We recycle all of the paper, plastic and metals that we can. We try to reduce how often we rely on disposable items for our events. I now choose straws that are re-usable.

There is a concept that we find in Judaism that is called, "bal tashchit" / "do not destroy or waste." In the Torah it began as a way to teach us to take care of trees, but we have always also understood it to mean that we need to take care of our environment. The guideline has expanded to remind us to try not to be wasteful at all.

We need to live ethically in every aspect of our lives, including what we say to each other; what we say about each other; how we take care of each other—and that includes our environment and the other people and creatures who live on this land with us. I look forward to speaking with you about continuing to add ways to live ethically.
