## From Rabbi Jana

**We Hope So** Many people travel during the summer. I love to take road trips. I remember some trips when I was young. It was fun to see new places and do different things. It was the 1960s. It was before seatbelts were mandatory in cars. By mentioning that, it may seem like this is a story about a tragedy from not wearing seatbelts. I did break my leg once when I was two years old and a dog ran into the street. My mom avoided hitting the dog, but – since there was no seatbelt, and no car seat either – I slid off the seat, and wound up breaking my leg. However, this isn't intended to be about seatbelts or broken legs.

I have distinct memories when I was a older than two of people in cars throwing their trash out the window. I think that since they were traveling down the highway, and by the time they tossed it out the window it was all behind them, they didn't think about the consequences of the trash they left behind them. The truth was there was trash on the side of the highways. Throwing trash out of the windows created a mess along the highways and in the streets in town as well.

When I was in elementary school there was a concerted effort to get people to stop throwing trash out windows and on the streets. There were commercials on tv about it too. I remember Woodsy Owl teaching us to "Give a Hoot – Don't Pollute!"

At first, it didn't seem to help, even though I can vouch for the fact that my family and the students in my school were making sure that our trash got into the trash cans.

At some point we started to notice that some neighborhoods and some stretches of highway really were cleaner. To be honest, around the same time seatbelt laws went into effect. There were fines for throwing trash out the windows, and there were fines for not "buckling up." By the way, there were catchy slogans for buckling up too. I still hear the "buckle up for safety, buckle up" song in my head when I get into the car – and it is almost 50 years later. I don't feel comfortable in the car when I am not buckled in.

Many people complained about the seat belt laws. The complaints ranged from "no one can tell me what to do in my own car" to "I was just going to the corner to get some cigarettes – it isn't far enough to worry about wearing a seatbelt." However, I knew more people who survived accidents by wearing seatbelts than I did people who survived the accidents by not wearing them.

The thing that made me think about seatbelts and not throwing trash out the windows is that they really helped make things better. The past 50 years have proven that people are thirty times more likely to be ejected from a car if not wearing a seatbelt. The streets really are significantly cleaner. As I travel on the highways I find way more miles without trash than with trash on the side of the road.

This month we will be celebrating not only the beginning of summer, but the awesome moment when we stand at Sinai and G-d gives us the Laws that keep us in covenant. Laws like: no littering, and taking care of each other, and making safety a priority. You can come to Torah Study on Saturday morning and I can show you where the seatbelt law is or where the not littering law is (they are not so easy to find, but I can show you how to find them).

What I thought about the reduced amount of trash compared to when I was young, it made me realize that, even when

we see trash around, we can clean it up, and we can be reminded to "give a hoot" - and it can work. We really can make a difference. Even when situations in the world feel hopeless, each of us needs to take responsibility for our own space, wherever we travel, and there is hope that the world will be safer and better again.

# From our President, Jon Black



Wishing everyone a fun, healthy and peaceful Summer. Meanwhile there are many things that will still be going strong at B'nai Zion.

In preparation for Camp Chai we will soon be installing a brand new swing set, compliments of The Jewish Federation – thank you Bethany. I know the Religious School students and teachers will also be happy for that when they return in the Fall. If all goes according to plan the remodeling of Rabbi's and Karen's offices will finally begin as well.

The thing I have learned most by being President and thinking back over the years of others is that two years is long enough that it will always present each President with a

unique issue to address. In recent years Fred & Mitch tackled the design and redesign of our sanctuary. Craig & Donald led the fundraising and construction phase. Gary handled the loss and replacement of a long -time and vital employee (Helaine). Many others before those had to lead several Rabbinical search committees. It happens that I am the one in the Chair during the horrific events at the synagogues in Pittsburgh and Poway.

So it is not by design, but my Number One priority has now become safety. That is such a broad category so we will mainly focus on the safety of our employees, our congregation members, and our children. This topic presents many problems. First of all, it will be impossible to devise a plan liked by everyone. For example, when the decision was first made to hire police officers to stand guard at all our events I was somewhat put off each time I drove up and saw a patrol car. On this I have come full circle as I now truly enjoy the fact they are there and after getting to know each of our officers I am pleased to know how dedicated they are to keeping us safe.

We must now begin Phase 2 of the safety issue. It is clear the congregation in Poway minimized the chaos as a result of prior planning. My goal will be to gather as much information as we need to help formulate the best and most effective plan possible and then pray to God that we never have to use it.

John Aronstein has agreed to head up our safety team. He, the Rabbi and I have met with someone who leads a safety team at one of Shreveport's larger churches. We will soon meet with others in the field of law enforcement to gather ideas. In the coming few months I anticipate a congregational meeting to allow everyone to voice their opinions and concerns. All ideas will be heard and taken into consideration as this House belongs to us all.

In the end, some decisions will need to be made and possibly one or two may be unpopular. I want you to know I am prepared to make the decisions I believe are for the greater good. Anything less would not make me worthy of being your President.

# From our Education Director, Barbara Joseph

The end of a school year inspires reflection - successful holiday events in 2018/5778 and 2019/5779 included Consecration at Simchat Torah, the indoor Sukkah decorating, and the Hanukkah party and Purim Carnival hosted by the Federation. I am proud of the Youth Shabbat held in March. It was wonderful to work with Rabbi Jana and Rachel Robichaux to prepare the students, and then to see the students from grades seven through twelve who embraced this honor.



A few years ago, the Religious School planted several fruit trees, a few in the corner between the Religious School wing and Lefkowitz Hall, and then a lot more in the fenced area behind the back parking lot. There are now peaches and pears on some of

those trees, and there are plenty of leaves on the fig and plum trees which promises future fruit. There are mounds of lovely-smelling lemon balm, and perhaps more herbs and veggies waiting to reveal themselves as the soil warms. Several Religious School families helped maintain the garden this year on Tu B'Shvat, which coincided with Martin Luther King Day.

There's a long-standing tradition, or *minhag*, in most Religious Schools, including this one, of students bringing a small amount of money each week to place in a Tzedakah box. The amount collected this year was \$340. Each class chose a cause for a donation.

Heifer International HOPE Connections Arts in Medicine program at Feist-Weiller Cancer Center American Foundation for Suicide Prevention - Louisiana the South Central office of the ADL located in New Orleans, to counter anti-Semitism and hate with acceptance and understanding.

Over the course of the year, there were a total of seven *Madrichim*, high school juniors or seniors who assisted, as well as several members of the Confirmation class who helped before their class with the Rabbi started each morning.

Art was with Rachel Stuart-Haas, music with Cantor Neil Schwartz, and we enjoyed a few sessions of Israeli dance with Patti David.

I'm thankful to our teachers who were involved for part or all of the year: Sharon Goldman, Goldy Marrus, Rosa Padin, Amy Turner, Amanda Dodson, Jessica Weiss, Adam Miller, and Rebecca Austin.

I appreciate the teamwork of the B'nai Zion staff - Karen and Carnell have institutional knowledge and helpfulness that is a tremendous asset.

Our partnership with the Institute for Southern Jewish Life has continued, with visits from ISJL fellow Kesler Friedman throughout the year. There will be five members of the community attending the ISJL conference in Jackson at the end of this month – rabbis of both congregations, two teachers, and myself.

This year we wished the best to the Nierman, Weiss and Henderson families. We welcomed the McCaughey and Jones families, and welcomed back the Serkins. I will miss the Smets, who will be moving to New Jersey this summer and the Miles/Barnoy family, who were here for a year and are now off to Pittsburgh. We ended the year with 57 students. This number includes the confirmation class.

I want to thank Rabbi Jana for all she has done this year, not just for the Religious School, but for me personally and professionally. I've known her a long time, and working together has only increased my respect for her and all she does. For leading services every Sunday morning, teaching Hebrew and Confirmation, sharing your ideas and perspective, and countless other things, Rabbi, I thank you.
