The following rituals should be limited to Jews when one is leading others in prayer, when there is an intimate connection with the Torah and when there are ritual honors. These include: leading prayers (except the pre Musaf English prayers such as a prayer for our country, prayer for peace and prayer for Israel), Aliya blessings (except for at a Bnei Mitzvah a non-Jewish parent can stand with their spouse while receiving their Aliyah), Haggbah and Gellila/ lifting and dressing the Torah, passing the Torah between generations at Bnei Mitzvah, and saying Kiddush and Haotzi.

Opening of the Ark, which is not a ritual mentioned in the Talmud is permissible for a non-Jew to perform.
