Message From the Rabbi

According to the "Newish Jewish Encyclopedia" (a book worthy of its own bulletin article in the future) the entry for "golem" reads in part: In Jewish folklore, a golem is a zombielike thing made of mud or clay, conjured into being by prayer or mystical incantation. The Golem of Prague...was conjured by Rabbi Judah Loew ben Bezalel in the sixteenth century to protect the city's Jews in times of crisis.

As we struggle against an invisible enemy and the coronavirus crisis nears its first anniversary, we can use all the protection we can get. So I would like to invite you to make a golem of your own.

On Sunday, February 21 at 3:00 p.m., I have invited Paper Midrash to lead a Make Your Own Golem workshop for us on Zoom. Paper Midrash is the husband-andwife team of Isaac and Rabbi Shawna

Brynjegard-Bialik, based in southern California. They combine Jewish scholarship and art to explore a number of Jewish topics. Since the pandemic began, they have moved their popular golem workshop to Zoom so we can participate while staying safe at home.

Isaac's preferred medium is cut-up comic books. (You can see examples of his work at www.nicejewishartist.com.) Each golem workshop participant will receive a special art kit with comic book pages, a knife, and a cutting pad. After Shawna teaches us the history of the golem in Jewish lore and popular culture, Isaac will guide us to each make a golem of our own.

www.emeth.org/event/papermidrash. If you look closely at the photo on that page, you will see that two of the participants have created artwork from the Hebrew word "Emeth." This was the word that, according to legend, brought the golem to life. The workshop is limited to 30 people, but if our February 21 program sells out, we have set time aside on March 7 for a second one.

To introduce the workshop, and to give us a sense of the many ways that Torah and art intersect, Paper Midrash will be offering the Shabbat sermon at our livestream service on Friday, February 19 at 8:00 pm. Their topic on Shabbat Zachor, the Shabbat immediately prior to Purim will be, "Purim, Masks, and Secret Identities." From Abraham and Sarah to Esther and even God, our tradition is filled with disguises and secret identities — so it's not

surprising that the comic book superheroes created by Jewish Americans would have so many similar ideas in them. Our presenters will explore the Megillah through the lens of midrash and pop culture — discussing the masks our heroes wear, and those we wear as well. Our Confirmation class will present the golems they made at a private workshop, and our service will be beautified by artwork Isaac created to accompany the prayers. The Shabbat service is open to all on the Temple's livestreaming platforms.

Even as the pandemic continues to keep us apart, the Temple strives to find speakers and create programming that will bring us together. I hope you will take the time to learn this unique perspective on our tradition in the coming weeks.





Message from President Nickie Falk

Meet the Faces Beyond the Screens

It sounds so cliché, but we couldn't do what we do without our volunteers. They are, indeed, the heart of Temple Emeth.

A community is too heavy to carry alone. — Deuteronomy Rabbah 1:10

One of the privileges of being president of Temple Emeth is getting to work closely with a dedicated group of volunteers — our Board of Trustees. In their role as overseers of the congregation, Board members tackle many challenges, all with the intention of building a stronger synagogue and ultimately a stronger Jewish community. Membership on

the Board is both a privilege and an obligation. And while we don't always agree with one another, everyone always has the best interests of the congregation in mind.

In addition to dealing with the financial and business aspects of Temple Emeth, our Trustees help transform the needs of the congregation into realistic goals. During our monthly meetings, we grapple with issues large and small—from when do we close our building due to a world-wide pandemic? (March 2020) to signing a public letter that was promoted in major newspapers around the country stating that Black Lives Matter (July 2020), to discussing the car lights that flash through the stained glass during services (October 2020). Initially in small groups in the Youth Lounge, and for the last year in breakout rooms on Zoom, we brainstorm how to raise money so we can continue providing all the educational and cultural programs that we do, to answering such questions as "what will Temple Emeth look like after the pandemic and we're back in the building?"

Over the last two years, I've posed questions to the Board members so that we could get to know one another better: Why did you join Temple Emeth, and why have you remained a member? (I spoke about this at High Holy Days two years ago.) What did you want to be when you grew up? (You'd be surprised who said fireman and whose answer was cowboy!) What is your favorite Jewish holiday? (Passover was the over-whelming favorite.) What is the best Chanukah gift you have ever given or received? (Yes, bubble wrap was on the list.) What have you learned as a Board leader?

In years past, our Trustees were more visible as they took on their greeter and Bima honors at services. While we're still greeting and sharing weekly announcements at Shabbat services virtually, I wanted to put names to the faces on the screens.

Temple Emeth is blessed to have a strong leadership team at its helm. How lucky am I, how lucky we all are, to have a congregation of heavy lifters! Todah Rabah to all of you!

PRICE FOR CEMETERY PLOTS INCREASES JULY 1

The Bergen County Reform Temple Memorial Association is a cemetery association founded in 1954 to serve Temple Emeth. Prices for graves will increase from \$900 to \$1200 per grave effective July 1, 2021. This is the first price increase in seven years. While the \$1200 price is still well below market value, we encourage you to consider making a purchase while the \$900 price is still in effect.

Family plots of four graves or larger are available in our sections in Cedar Park and Beth El Cemeteries on Forest Avenue in Washington Township. Single graves and multiples thereof are available in our section in Riverside Cemetery located on Market Street in Saddle Brook. In accordance with the cemeteries' rules, we may sell graves only to Temple members for use by those who at the time of their death are of the Jewish faith.

Request from the Paul S. Lazar Caring Community Committee to congregants

The Paul S. Lazar Caring Community Committee asks your help in identifying congregants who need our assistance. Although we quickly hear about deaths, we don't always learn about illnesses or other situations in which we could offer phone calls, shopping, meals, etc. Please contact caring@emeth.org if you know of someone who needs help. All communications are kept strictly confidential.

Social Action in Action

- 1. This week has left us sick at heart, although we are trying to look at the future with hope and positivity.
- 2. We are presenting a Food Security proposal to the Board this week, since we would like to involve the entire congregation. We also are requesting a monetary commitment from the Board.
- 3. The committee voted to donate \$300 to the Teaneck Schools Scholarship program.
- 4. Alissa Sandler gave us an update and led a discussion about the Northern New Jersey Sanctuary Coalition. Temple Emeth will continue its commitment to supporting immigrant issues via its board membership in this organization. Alissa Sandler and Ina Miller serve as our representatives to this group. We plan to participate in future activities—such as letter-writing and distribution of fact-sheets when it's appropriate and we have the facts. The situation is complicated. Bergen County Commissioners are involved, and we do not actually have a contract to house the detainees. We'll continue to learn more and help when we can.
- 5. Paul Kaufman gave us the latest NJ environmental news:
- The Gibbstown New Jersey Liquid Natural Gas (LNG) export terminal was approved by Delaware River Basin Commission. Environmentalists are still fighting to prevent its being built.

- The New Jersey Transit Meadowlands Power Plant plan has been withdrawn, but we must remain vigilant to be sure that it is not introduced again.
- Two pipelines in South Jersey have been temporarily halted through court action, but their future fate is unclear.
- Senator Loretta Weinberg has introduced a bill (S2600) that will create an independent transit oversight board to promote the interests of transit riders, rather than the interests of highway users and highway builders. This bill is currently in the Senate Budget Committee, but no parallel legislation has been introduced in the Assembly.
- President-Elect Biden's environmental choices are quite positive for the environment:
- John Kerry will be Climate Envoy, representing the USA in discussions with foreign governments dealing with climate change.
- Michael Regan, a strong environmentalist and science-advocate, will head the Environment Protection Agency (EPA).
- Gina McCarthy, former EPA director will coordinate climate actions among and between all federal agencies.

No art experience, clay, or magic spells required; just your enthusiasm.

The story of the golem, an anthropomorphic being brought to life from inanimate objects, dates back to the earliest days of Judaism. The tale has resurfaced during times of suffering. The most well known version occurred in Prague during the 16th century. The Rabbi brought a golem to life from the local river mud to protect the Jews in the ghetto from expulsion or death. The symbolism of this ancient and intriguing tales could not be more relevant than it is now, during the fear and upheaval brought by the pandemic.

Register for an afternoon of magic at the **Make Your Own Golem workshop**. Space is limited! Each participant will receive an art kit for this 1 ½ hour Zoom session.
