# Message From the Rabbi

This summer, the leadership of Israel will face perhaps its most momentous decision in over 50 years, since the Six-Day War in 1967. At that time, Israel won a decisive victory, taking control of the West Bank from Jordan and taking responsibility for the millions of Palestinians who live there. Since that time, through both settlement building and peace negotiations, it was understood that though Israel controlled this territory, it was not part of sovereign Israel.

To the United States, the International Community, and many Israelis, the occupation of the West Bank was temporary, intended to be resolved through a negotiated agreement that would protect Israel's security and guarantee Palestinians' human rights. The peace treaties with Egypt, Jordan, and the Palestinians were all signed with that premise, and it has been the position of both Democratic and Republican administrations for decades.

As both Israeli and American governments have drifted to the right, and as many Israelis have lost trust in the current Palestinian leadership as a negotiating partner, that position has begun to erode. Unilateral annexation has now become a strong possibility, and with it come concerns that the nature of Israel will be changed forever.

After three razor-thin national elections, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu was able to form a government that keeps him in power. He has signaled that he will begin annexing parts of the West Bank as early as July 1. This would be an historic disaster for Israeli democracy and security.

Annexing parts of the West Bank (some euphemistically refer to it as "extending Israeli sovereignty") will change Israel's nature as a Jewish democracy. For the first time, it will be clear that Palestinians will live under Israeli control with no hope for self-determination. Critics of the occupation have for years compared the situation to the Apartheid regime in South Africa. There have always been several fundamental flaws in that analogy. But if annexation is implemented, then, alas, that nasty label would be applicable. This would almost certainly be the scenario under Netanyahu, who in recent years has advanced a vision of Jewish nation-

alism most clearly articulated in the Nation-State Law passed in 2018.

But a future Israeli government, motivated not by Jewish nationalism but by equality and human rights, could grant full citizenship to Palestinians living in annexed areas. This would make Israel a bi-national state and virtually eliminate the Jewish character that Zionist thinkers, pioneers, and advocates worked for a century to build.

In short, annexation forces Israel to choose between being Jewish or being a democracy.

But annexation would be disastrous in a second way. It would undermine Israel's security in significant and unpredictable ways. According to 220 former Israeli generals and general-equivalents, it is likely to set in motion a chain reaction over which Israel will have no control,

leading to the collapse of the Palestinian security agencies and of the Palestinian Authority. According former MK Ksenia Svetlova, it would destabilize Israel's relations with Arab states and might result in another violent outbreak in the West Bank.

Though the two-state solution is currently dormant, perhaps even in a coma, annexation could likely kill it, forever eliminating that option to future generations who seek to live side by side in peace and with mutual respect. As American Jews, we must not allow the door to close on this outcome.

The leader of our movement, Rabbi Rick Jacobs, president of the URJ, recently said, "We call on this new government to refrain from unilateral actions that could potentially hinder or thwart the renewal of the peace process in the short and long term, especially unilateral annexation."

Rabbi Jill Jacobs, the executive director of T'ruah: The Rabbinic Call for Human Rights stated it more succinctly: "Any organization not actively working against annexation does not really support two states."

Though we may be sheltering at home to stay safe from the Coronavirus, we must still make our voices heard to prevent annexation of the West Bank. Our vision of Israel as a secure, Jewish democracy depends on it.

# Message from President Nickie Falk

## A Year of Thanks and Summer Wishes

I remember many trips to shopping malls, antique stores, and flea markets as a youngster. My mother once told me that she liked to acquire “stuff,” because as a child she didn’t have much. She talked about a doll that she and her two sisters had to share, making its bed in a shoebox with clothes fashioned out of scraps of material that my grandfather, a tailor, brought home. Though if you talked to my two aunts, they would tell you a different story—that my mother (the eldest) never shared.

But in all her acquisitions, I only remember a few things that she searched for because she really wanted—a white wicker rocker, a glass and silver match striker, and a cranberry glass pitcher. Cranberry glass is a decorative (not mass produced) glass, whose shimmer is achieved by adding gold chloride to the molten glass.

We used that pitcher only at holiday dinners. When I was about 15, she delegated the task of filling the pitcher to me. The memory is vivid so many years later. As I poured cold milk into the pitcher, I heard a noise, and then noticed a crack starting near its bottom. I shriveled up; I was devastated. She had searched many years for that pitcher; it was one of her joys; and in one instant, I had destroyed it.

Though upset herself, she tried very hard to console me, claiming blame for the crack. “I am a science teacher,” she said. “I should know that if you pour cold milk into a warm pitcher, the glass will expand...and crack.”

And then the learning moment. “Besides,” she added, “things aren’t that important; people are important.”

Her words have echoed in my head every day since then becoming my credo, especially now. Like the rest

of you, I miss going out to a restaurant on a Saturday night, visiting a museum, going to the beach. I miss walking into our Temple Emeth building. But what I miss more are the people associated with those things. I miss seeing my children in person and not on a screen; I miss the friends we shared those dinners out with or traveled with to the beach; I miss hugging my Temple Emeth family.

## Social Action in Action

### Summary of Minutes from the Social Action Committee Meeting on May 18

Family Promise update: Shelter is closed; clients are staying in hotels with food being brought to them at St. Cecilia's; lots of activity in Englewood. Food is being collected at Hackensack shelter even though people are not staying there.

Paul Kaufman reported on the RAC Civic Engagement event, National Town Hall Meeting, and on these environmental items:

- The application for a major pipeline in South Jersey (Northeast Supply Enhancement – NESE) has been rejected by the state Department of Environmental Protection - (DEP).
- An editorial by Jeff Tittel, New Jersey Director of the Sierra Club, appeared in the May 18th Record opposing the projected fossil fuel-powered electric generating plant in the Meadowlands, near Kearny, NJ.
- The offices of Hackensack Riverkeeper, a major local environmental organization, were significantly damaged by a fire over the weekend. A GoFundMe page has been set up for donations to assist the organization in moving into a new space.

Discussion: How will we be active for the rest of the year? Programming? Issues?

- “Just Eat It” - movie showing at home, followed by discussion via Zoom. Beyond being interested in the subject, we are looking at this as an experiment. Does the format work? How do we move to action? What actions are needed regarding the food waste issue? Invitation with details to follow.

- The biggest, most immediate issue right now is food insecurity. We just donated \$300 to Teaneck Helping Hands Food Pantry, in honor of Janice Preschel, her friendship and her devotion to Social Action. What else can we do? Will we have a High Holiday Food Drive?

Ideas that were suggested:

- Have a one day food drive in front of the Temple, hiring a truck
- Find a garage we could use to set up a food drive
- Donate (they need money and it's the simplest)
- Research local food pantries to determine what we want to do
- Do we have Temple members who need food?

There may be one or two; however between the Caring Committee, Social Action, and the Cantor and Rabbi, we seem to have that covered.

- Temple garden is being tended.

The crops from the garden go to Helping Hands Food Pantry.



Decision around food insecurity initiatives:

• We will donate \$500 to Center for Food Action - we understand they need money and that they serve the greater community.

• We also decided to get the word out that Social Action will be donating to Center for Food Action and initiate a “money for food” drive. We would like to keep the community aspect of our food drives, but it's tricky - we'll continue to work on it while trying to serve the immediacy of the food needs.

From Nancy Miller: “My neighbor, Hila Levy, works for the Israeli American Council, which has an office at the Tenafly JCC. IAC received a contribution of dry goods from OSEM, an Israeli company. She would like to donate baskets of those goods to any needy seniors at Temple Emeth. IAC can deliver either to the members directly at their homes or to Temple Emeth.” We'll see how we can facilitate this.

From Ina Miller: A copy of Age Friendly Englewood will be sent by a separate email. It's a wealth of COVID-19 and local information.

## Monthly News Update: Survival


### ASSOCIATION OF JEWISH LIBRARIES ACCREDITATION



As this pandemic drags on we face challenges unlike any we have ever known. Books can help us get through these times. We might look to books for escape or comfort. Or we might learn how others persevered before us. In an opinion piece in The New York Times, Madeleine Albright wrote about “Resilience in the Face of Disaster.” She said, “I do think that we are a lot tougher and more capable of moral courage than cynics suggest, and that we benefit from the survivors among us...We can draw inspiration from those who have surmounted high obstacles in the past.


Two new books in the Rabbi Joshua Trachtenberg Memorial Library provide just such inspiration.

Yesterday: My Story is a memoir by Dr. Hadassah Rosensaft. “Dr. Hadassah Rosensaft (1912-1997) was imprisoned in Auschwitz-Birkenau and Bergen-Belsen. She kept 149 Jewish children alive in Bergen-Belsen from December 1944 until their liberation on April 15, 1945, and then served as administrator of that camp’s hospital. She was one of the leaders of the Jewish Displaced Persons in the British Zone of Germany, was one of the principal witnesses for the prosecution at the first trial of Nazi war criminals in 1945, and played a pivotal role in the creation of the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum.” This



book is published by Yad Vashem as part of their Holocaust Survivors’ Memoirs Project, which ensures that survivors’ stories are transmitted to future generations.

Steven J. Ross, a professor of history at the University of Southern California, has written “a history book that doubles as espionage thriller with a cast of characters that includes movie stars, studio moguls, entertainment lawyers, diplomats and pols, all of them quite real.” This Pulitzer Prize finalist is called Hitler in Los Angeles: How Jews Foiled Nazi Plots Against Hollywood and America. In the 1930s there were Nazi groups in California with dastardly plans to murder Jews, blow up defense installations, and seize munitions from National Guard armories. While federal law enforcement agencies focused on Communists instead, a Jewish lawyer named Leon Lewis recruited military veterans and their wives to infiltrate Nazi organizations in Los Angeles. They often rose to leadership positions. From 1933 to 1945 these daring spies uncovered and foiled many nefarious plots. This sounds like material for a movie, but it is all true and makes for exciting reading.



People who surmounted obstacles in the past can inspire us in the present, and their stories are in the Rabbi Joshua Trachtenberg Memorial Library.




