Rabbi's Message

This week's Parsha contains seventy four Mitzvot. Twenty seven positive Mitzvot and forty seven prohibitions. These include;

Not wearing wool and linen garments,
Wearing tzitzit on 4 cornered garments,
Leaving the forgotten and fallen sheaves to the poor,
Allowing our workers to eat the fruits as they work,
Having correct weights and measures,
Not raping women,
Not seducing women,
Sending away the mother bird prior to taking her chicks,
Returning lost articles to their rightful owners,
Keeping our vows and promises.

The Torah also permits divorce but forbids people to remarry their original wives after the woman has married someone else. This is to prevent 'Kosher' wife swapping.

We are also told that Moabite men, Ammonite men, and a Mamzer lit' bastard can't marry Jewish women. They are permitted to marry their own kind or a convert.

The Parsha finishes off with the commandment to wipe out Amalek. The Torah tells us that Amon and Moabite men are forbidden from marrying Jewish women because they didn't offer to give us bread and water when we passed through their lands on the way to the land of Israel.

Question:

The Jews ate the Manna from heaven so why did the Moabites need to bring out bread for them?

The answer should have been that it was still offered. Their forefather Lot was saved by Abraham from the 4 kings and they should have returned the favor. To marry a Jewess and give genes to the future generations of the Jews, you need to be kind. The whole Parsha deals with Mitzvos that make you be kind to one another. Even getting divorced is Hashem's way of not prolong something that isn't good and causing people distress and anxiety. The Mitzvah to give your workers to eat also shows we must be kind. The Talmud states that the three characteristics of Jewish people are that they are kind, bashful and doers of good deeds. We are children of Abraham who was the epitome of kindness. He stood outside his tent on the third day following his circumcision looking for guests to host. He is referred to as 'the lover of kindness'. So, as the Moabite men are inherently unkind, they can't father Jewish children. This should serve as a lesson to all of us about the importance of being kind to others. We need to realize it's who we are. Being kind is part of our DNA. In conclusion it's worth noting that since Sancherev, the Assiriyan, came and took all the nations into exile prior to the destruction of the first Temple and we don't know who the nations are anymore, this prohibition is no longer in use.
