RABBI'S MESSAGE

Now that the Chagim are over,
my thoughts are turning to
programs and learning I would
like to implement. I work full
time as a rabbinical coordinator
for Kosher Miami which
involves going into Miami every
day. Therefore, I have two
slots in mind. I think 30 minutes
is a good length of time to
learn. The first time slot is 30
minutes before Mincha
on Shabbat and the second
time slot is 30 minutes
after Shacharit on Sunday
morning.

I would like to present some
options and welcome people's
feedback as to what topics they
feel they would like to learn in
these times. These shiurim are
open to both men and women
and if we can combine the 30
minutes prior to Shabbat
Mincha with a nice
Seuda Shlishit then hopefully
we can make it worthwhile for
ladies to come as well.

Here are the options;

- 1) learning Talmud both times,
- 2) learning Halacha about
Shabbat both times,
- 3) split the slots between
Halacha and Talmud.

If we choose Talmud I have the
following suggestions for topics:

- 1) The first chapter of tractate
'Baba Metziah ' which
discusses financial laws,
- 2) The third chapter of
tractate 'Shabbat' which
discusses the laws of cooking
on Shabbat,
- 3) Tractate 'Brachot ' which
discusses the laws of davening
and blessings on food and the
like.

Please let me know what you
feel and we can see what the
common consensus is
(hopefully there will be

one). The Talmud ('Avodah
Zarah' 19a) says people only
really learn and retain what they
are really interested in learning.
I therefore want to have people
who are interested and excited
to learn the topics suggested.
This week we learn about
Noach. He was very righteous
and merited saving from the
floodwaters. He was given 120
years to build the ark in the
hope that people would see and
ask what he is doing and why
he is doing it, in the hope
they would be inspired to return
to the righteous path. However,
he failed in that mission and is
therefore not considered in the
same bracket as Abraham who
influenced people to change
and follow Hashem's path. Let's
take this message to heart and
hopefully inspire and influence
people to come and learn and
study the Torah in our times.
