



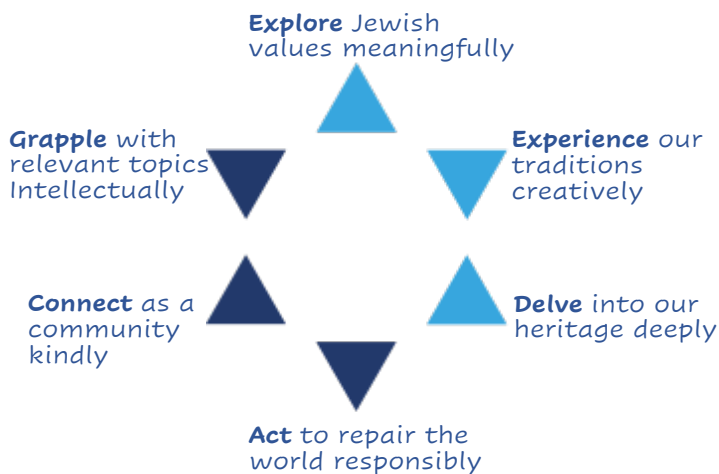
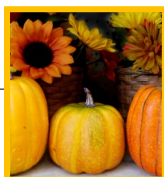

Guiding Principles

Study Hebrew, Jewish history, Torah and texts with curiosity and contemplation.

Grapple with relevant topics Intellectually.

Examine current events and personal life experiences through a Jewish lens by learning, discussion, and introspection.

Judaic Learning Grades K-7

Through creative and interactive experiences the following Jewish values will be explored in depth:

- * **Shalom** (peace)
- * **G'vurah** (courage & inner strength)
- * **K'hillah** (community)
- * **Hesed** (loving kindness)

Each group will design a project based on these values and share it with the community at the end of the semester.

In person sessions:

Online sessions:

Will meet once a week on a day TBD by each group, for nine sessions between October 18 and December 20 2020.

Groups* -

- * Grades K-2
- * Grades 3-5
- * Grades 6-7

*A minimum of 4 children is needed to open a session. Age groups may be combined as needed.

Hebrew Learning Grades 2-7

Small Hebrew instruction groups will meet by age/level on dates and times convenient for families (once a week for 12 sessions Sept.–Dec.)

Grades 2-3: Introduction to Modern Hebrew by building a vocabulary of words such as greetings, weather & family members. Interactive activities will be the main instruction method with a textbook as a supplementary material. Hebrew songs, games and stories will enhance learning.

Grades 4-5: Modern Hebrew, continued vocabulary building, understanding female/male words, roots and recognizing past present and future verb tenses. Interactive activities will be the main instruction method with a textbook and worksheets as a supplementary material. Hebrew songs, games and stories will enhance learning.

Hebrew Speakers: A small group or tutoring for Hebrew speakers who want to learn reading and writing at a fluent speaker's level.

Grades 6-7: Instruction will be through B'nai Mitzvah tutoring, or through one-one-one Hebrew skill tutoring as needed. Students will also have the opportunity to practice Hebrew in an informal way during Hebrew club.

Hebrew Club: In addition to Hebrew lessons, once a week students may join an open Zoom or classroom session a Hebrew speaking teacher, where they can review their assignments, converse in Hebrew and play games and activities.
