
May will focus on Jewish American Heritage Month and Mental Health Awareness Month. Shavuot will begin on May 25.

Passover is celebrated by Jews every year, commemorating the anniversary of our miraculous Exodus from Egyptian slavery, as told in the Bible.

Beginning on the evening preceding 15 Nissan, Passover lasts for 8 days in the Diaspora and 7 days in Israel (here's why). This year it is April 5-13.

The Haggadah is the guidebook to your seder. There are many different types! Choose one unique to your seder.



WORKERS' RIGHTS

Workers rights are critical. The U.S. Bureau of International Labor Affairs states, "There is no single definition or definitive list of workers' rights. The International Labor Organization (ILO) identifies what it calls 'fundamental principles and rights at work,'" which are listed in detail on the website. The fight for labor rights is still ongoing, such as at Temple University, and the justice system is very important to that fight—which is one of the many reasons to stay tuned regarding Israel's judicial reform.


