the musical cultures of Jewish communities of the past and present, and includes a Lexicon of Klezmer Terminology.

[Judaic Studies: Jewish Music](#) at the University of St. Thomas provides a general introduction to library sources of Jewish music.

[Jewish Music: Listening Online](#) is a Research Guide at the University of Wisconsin-Madison Libraries for Jewish music.
