THE REBUILDING PROJECT

This week's Torah portion discusses the spiritual skin ailment known as *tzara'as*. *Tzara'as* would appear as a white blotch or discoloration on one's skin, and was brought on by a variety of possible faults or sins, including speaking lashon hara (gossip), theft and false oaths.

A person with one of these skin blemishes would be examined by a Kohen in order to determine if he was "tamei," spiritually impure. A fascinating law pertaining to this examination process was that if a person's ENTIRE body was covered with tzara'as, he was declared spiritually PURE! It seems so counterintuitive, doesn't it?! One blotch could make you spiritually *impure*. But one gigantic blotch covering your entire body—PURE!

Perhaps we can extrapolate a "Rebuilder idea" from this unexpected ruling that can help us when dealing with people we're not fond of. You know how when there's someone who really gets on your nerves—have you ever noticed that the one quality we don't like about him often becomes THE ONLY WAY WE SEE HIM! We identify him, his entire being, with the very thing we dislike! It's no longer a single *aspect* of him, it's ALL of him... It's like he's one big, walking talking blemish from HEAD TO TOE!

But the Torah says NOT SO FAST, Buster. Even if he really did wrong you, or even if it's just some annoying habit or idiosyncrasy that rubs you the wrong way—if that's all you can see, then you're looking at him the wrong way. NO ONE IS ALL BAD. No one is completely "one way."

The Torah wants us to remember that there's more to this guy than meets the eye. He has a thousand different qualities, but we're choosing to look at only ONE of them—the one we like the least! And if we can't make any distinctions and can only see his blemish, it's not the other guy's problem, it's ours. We need to change our perspective!

Is there someone in your life you could apply this principle to? Let's accept the challenge to look for the good, anything good, in people with whom we're only seeing the negative. Let's put the onus on *ourselves* and loosen up a bit... Make a concerted effort to take a more holistic view of the other person. Doing so will be such a worthwhile, incredible accomplishment! And not only will it give us more peace of mind, it will undoubtedly change the entire *complexion* of our relationship.
