THE REBUILDING PROJECT

Antisemites don't discriminate. They hate all of us.

Doesn't matter our religiosity, spirituality, nationality, age, income, politics, IQ... They clump us all together. We're all the same. We're all the same.

We know one of the effects of antisemitism is that it brings Jews closer together. But what if there was something more? What if, as strange as it sounds, antisemitism was offering us an incredible opportunity that we're not currently taking advantage of?

Sinas chinam, baseless hatred among Jews, takes root when we don't accept one another. We focus on our differences—the behaviors, opinions, mannerisms, characteristics, traits, attitudes, whatever—anything we don't like or agree with. And then we push that person away. We create emotional distance. And sadly, this lack of acceptance and coldness often grows into condemnation and hatred, creating rifts in our relationships as well as our collective unity.

Is it possible that Hashem wants us to learn something from the blind hatred of antisemitism that we can apply to eliminating sinas chinam?

The parallels between the way antisemites hate Jews and the way we can STOP hating our fellow Jews is astounding. When they look at us, THEY DON'T SEE OR CARE ABOUT DIFFERENCES. THE DON'T MITPICK. They don't care if we're a little hard to get along with, short-tempered, abrasive, negatire or "weird." THEY DON'T MAKE DISTINCTIONS. They don't get hung up on how we dress, who we vote for, what we eat, what shul we belong to ... they couldn't care less about our salaries, personalities or idiosyncrasies...

Those who hate us see us as ONE PEOPLE. Let that sink in for a minute. In a bizarre ironic twist, they see us the way WE ASPIRE TO SEE OURSELVES! THE WAY WE YEARN AND PRAY TO BE! A single people. A family.

When we unconditionally accept other Jews the same way antisemites unconditionally *hate* Jews, there will be no more antisemitism—we will have gotten the message. We will have finally fulfilled the words of our sages who say that the Beis HaMikdash will be rebuilt when we overcome sinas chinam. Hashem's presence will return and rest among us and world peace will be a reality.

From now on, when we hear about an antisemitic incident, let's "flip it" and remind ourselves to be less discriminating and more accepting toward the next 3 Jews we interact with... To not focus on differences or trivialities. But to feel a familial bond with them. To relate to them with as much unconditional respect and love as possible.

If antisemites can see us as one ... then for sure ... we can too.
