



THE REBUILDING PROJECT

We have talked about how the nutritional information printed on the front of cereal boxes, snacks and other packaged goods is always changing. People are drawn towards NEW things, so manufacturers keep announcing new information to grab people's attention.

The more I thought about it, it dawned on me there's something else we can derive from this marketing tactic. Have you ever noticed that a lot of the new nutritional info that gets emblazoned across the packaging isn't new at all? It just seems new because they're calling our attention to it! When they promote "high in fiber" or "low carbs" or "no fructose corn syrup", they're just announcing information the product has had all along! They're simply making it newsworthy by moving it to the front of the package in big type!

I know from being in the advertising industry, brands are always looking for that arresting insight or fact that sparks people's interest... Marketers pore over all the details of their products in search of something new and wonderful they can promote. But most of the time, it's been there all along.

Why in the world don't we do the same thing with ourselves? Why don't WE examine ourselves for what's great about us?!... Search out our positive qualities and character traits that all too often go overlooked or undervalued. Our negative self-talk and critical eye tend to focus on our weaker qualities. So we end up leaving many of our awesome qualities buried somewhere in the small type on the side panel of our cereal box, so to speak. Because appreciating our strengths puts us in a joyful state that energizes and motivates us to "keep on building."
