

## Congregation Beth Shalom Attendance Policy

### To Our Members and Visitors:

We are grateful to finally be coming back together as a community. As we gradually re-open our doors, your health and safety is our highest priority. We have gone to great lengths to ensure that our Shul is a clean and safe environment. By reading and following the policies below, you can help us to keep it that way.

These guidelines apply to everyone who enters CBS for services or otherwise. These policies are a summary of all of the protocols in effect at CBS. For a more complete and up to date list, see our guide, *The Road to Re-Opening*, on our website.

### *You should stay home if:*

- You are sick or have a fever
- You have traveled internationally within the previous 14 days
- You have had a positive test for the coronavirus within the last 30 days
- You believe you have been exposed to anyone with the coronavirus within the last 14 days
- You are considered high-risk (age over 65, specified medical conditions such as heart disease, lung disease or diabetes)

### *When you arrive at CBS:*

- You will be screened at the door for certain symptoms of the coronavirus (fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath, GI illness, and loss of taste/smell). If any screening questions are answered yes, you and those arriving with you will be asked to return home.
- You may be asked to undergo temperature screening with an infrared thermometer at the door. Those with a temperature above 100° will be asked to return home.
- Please bring your own Kippot and Tallit. Kippot are available for use, but we ask that you please not return them. Once you take it, it is yours.

### *While you are at CBS:*

- Follow all posted signs and obey the instructions of our ushers and security personnel.
- You must bring and wear a face covering at all times. If you or your children remove your mask after being reminded of the policy, you will be asked to leave.
- Your child(ren) must remain with you and under your control at all times.
- No singing is permitted except by the prayer leader.
- Even while wearing a mask, cover your cough or sneeze with your elbow.
- You must maintain a distance of at least 6 feet from other congregants at all times. Do not shake hands, hug, or make any physical contact with other attendees either in the building or in the parking lot.
- Do not kiss any materials of worship, including mezuzah, Siddurim and Tallit.
- Use only one Siddur and one Chumash per person.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth during the service.
- Hand sanitizer will be available for use when entering and exiting the sanctuary.

### *After You Leave CBS:*

- Please contact the office if you exhibit symptoms of COVID-19 within 14 days of being at CBS so that we can inform others who may have been exposed. Names will remain confidential except as required by law.
