CANDLE LIGHTING NOTE – When one household member is attending an early Minyan and another is lighting at home, it is preferable to light before the Shul attendee returns home (about 7:00 pm this week). Regular candle lighting time on September 3rd is 7:20pm. The earliest time to light candles with a bracha is 6:20pm this week. One leaving for Shul with no one else at home to light candles, may light before 6:20pm, but should not recite the bracha.

In my final year of Semicha studies, Yeshiva University's Rabbinic Placement Department invited me to apply for a prestigious position in Melbourne, Australia. I politely declined as I envisioned myself on the east coast of the USA. My inner reflection at the time was "Australia is probably a very lovely country, but a place I'll likely never visit in my lifetime." You may be chuckling at this thought. Many of our members are aware that Barbara and I have a daughter living with her beautiful family in Australia! (Not Melbourne, but Sydney.)

It was definitely an adjustment to having a child living in Australia. The time difference ranges from 14-16 hours. Australia is ahead of us on the international clock and most of our conversations take place on different days of the week for each party. It took training to recode our patterns, learning that if we wanted to call and wish our Australian family a Good Shabbos, our deadline was Thursday evening.

We have always had frequent phone conversations (and subsequently, video chats) and we enjoy a very close relationship. However, during the first year of our daughter's living in Australia, I felt a disconnect between my community, my country and the community, country and continent which hosted our daughter and her husband. Yes, some of the disconnect emanated from the "opposites"; opposite time of the day and opposite seasons. But, it was more. It was more natural to connect over the ocean heading east, connecting with the land and people of Israel; and, to a measure, connecting with family living in various European cities. It was more difficult for me to mentally cross the Pacific Ocean, to connect with the west and a country and people about whom I had little personal knowledge.

I am happy to share that I experienced an abrupt turnaround.

It was during my first, of many trips, to Australia. I arrived just prior to the birth of our first grandchild. My mechtanim relayed an invitation from their shul for me to address the congregation on Shabbat. The sharing of Torah was a major icebreaker. I met a couple of hundred members of the congregation and had repeated interactions with many; discussing Torah thoughts, davening together and enjoying social conversations. My son-in-law's family is, Baruch HaShem, large and they broadened and deepened my connection to the real-life people of the greater Sydney community.

These connections within the community generated profound spiritual and emotional sensations. I felt my neshama expand. The sharing of vital beliefs and values opened channels of communication. I had been disconnected from a vibrant slice of the world Jewish community; feeling as one with the Australian community created a sense of wholeness in me. The coming together of members of Klal Yisrael made the Jewish world more united in my heart and mind. The experience has made me, as a person, feel more complete and more connected. The more connected the Jewish People are, the more we, as a nation, as a community, are able to attract the blessings of HaShem.

May the upcoming soul searching days of the Yamim HaNora'im bring all of us to be more connected to one another, sharing Torah, davening and social occasions with one another. Covid precautions generated some barriers. Many of them, Baruch HaShem have been removed. Just as the most happy of all Yamim Tovim, Sukkot, follows the somber days of repentance and judgement, let us all look forward to the many happy occasions and events which will be celebrated in our community, together, as a community.

My experience from Australia has taught me how an individual is much greater when he/she is connected to the larger community. You need not travel to Australia to experience the phenomenon of connectedness. Our minds and hearts can make this journey.

Barbara and I wish you and your loved ones a Ketiva V'Chatima Tova!

Yom Kippur 5782

Complete services are held at both minyanim.

The *Shulchan Aruch* encourages one to daven *Mincha* on **Erev Yom Kippur** prior to eating the *Seudah HaMafseket*. Hence, we have scheduled a 3:00 pm *Mincha* in the Main Shul. *Kol Nidrei* is scheduled for 6:30 pm, followed by *Ma'ariv*.

Candle Lighting and Tenai for Yom Kippur

As *Kol Nidrei* begins before the official candle lighting time, one is advised to light candles a little early with a *tenai*, condition. One may then drive to *Shul* and leave one's car overnight. The wording of the condition, which follows, should be recited **prior to** lighting the candles:

"I do not accept upon myself any of the restrictions or obligations of Yom Kippur until the Kol Nidrei service concludes, or sunset occurs, whichever is earlier."

The candles are then kindled and the first blessing only ("...*L'Hadlik Ner Shel Yom HaKippurim*.") is recited. The second blessing (*Shehecheyanu*) is recited with the Congregation after *Kol Nidrei*. Whether one lights candles in the regular format or with the above condition, care should be taken to recite the *Shehecheyanu* only once.

He blends an organic capacity to lovingly connect to people with the precision of a therapist holding a doctorate in clinical psychology and the spiritual depth of a life devoted to religious study and teaching.

Rabbi Klein's forthcoming book, "On Being Friends with God" is a survey of biblical and rabbinic texts that leave no stone unturned to find meaning in circumstances of despair, and to encounter the goodness and the love of God even in the face of suffering, evil and human malevolence.

We have a great year planned with lots of exciting and fun programs.



BIKUR CHOLIM/CHESED COMMITTEE UPDATE ON MEDICAL EQUIPMENT RABBI DR. AVI KUPERBERG

Torah Ohr's Bikur Cholim/Chesed Committee recognizes that in an active senior community such as ours there will be a need for medical equipment such as wheelchairs, walkers, etc. from time to time. People may fall down or come back from a hip or knee replacement procedure, for example. As such, for the benefit of our members, we have set aside such equipment for emergency or short term use. We have some of the equipment ready for emergency use in the shul itself. We have other equipment stored nearby if the need grows beyond what we have immediately available.

Here are some thoughts for your consideration: This equipment should be considered as a short term loan. After all, we are not in the business of procuring medical equipment for long term use. If, after a month or two, the equipment is no longer needed, it would be reasonable to expect that it be returned so that it remains available for the next person. (I found one of our wheelchairs that had been stored in the laundry room of a building for over a year, for example. No one knows how it got there.) If it turns out that the equipment is needed for a long term use, it might be reasonable to just keep it and make a donation to Bikur Cholim so that a replacement can be purchased for the next possible user.

If it is possible to have Medicare or your insurance company arrange for the equipment (they call it Durable Medical Equipment), that might be a better choice for all involved. They pay for wheelchairs, hospital beds, etc. If the equipment is relatively inexpensive, you might wish to consider buying it for yourself, especially if it is going to be for a long term use.

We keep shiva chairs, siddurim and related equipment on premises knowing that they will be used in a more emergent fashion when, unfortunately, the need arises.

We maintain a liaison relationship with the Jewish Family Services. They can provide for meals on wheels, home aides and many other social services if the need arises. Several of our members are happily availing themselves of these services.

Hopefully, with Hashem's help, we will all stay healthy and strong for many years to come. However, it is reassuring to know that a team of volunteers stands ready to provide bikur cholim and chesed services within our Torah Ohr community. It is provided for the sake of the mitzvah and because it is just the right thing to do. We need to look out for one another.

If anyone would like to volunteer to be part of the Bikur Cholim/Chesed team they are very welcome to do so. If there are folks out there who want to help our committee with medical equipment loans or help with the shiva setup process, please feel free to contact me. Q: How many Bibles are there in Century Village?

Yes, this is a trick question.

The Congregation Torah Ohr Telephone Directory (aka "The Bible") has more information contained therein than most Palm Beach County directories. All this information was not always contained in the directory. Since I have been the chairman of the project, having joined the committee over ten years ago, each year we've tried to improve upon the previous year's issue.

In the early days, it was a challenge adding new member pages to a three-ring binder, so the decision was made to print all listings, not just the new members. We abandoned the binder in favor of spiral binding.

The next year, we decided to add photographs of members to enable our membership to find and recognize their friends and neighbors more easily. After all, we are seniors! Don't worry, we will not test you on this!

The year after that, we made what turned out to be a very successful addition. We solicited advertising to not only defray the cost of printing but in fact raise many thousands of needed funds for our treasury. In a later version, we added MemberPerks to highlight businesses that extend an extra discount to our members.

I encourage all of you to open the directory to just before page 1, letter A. Space prevents me from listing here all the names and titles. You will see the names of all the people who make the "Torah Ohr Bible" the huge success that it is, each in their area of expertise. Please thank them for their devotion and the hundreds of combined hours of volunteer effort each year that it takes to produce the directory.

The accuracy of the Telephone Directory listings is directly dependent on your input. Please notify the Administrative Office of any changes that need to be included. In November, the Telephone Directory Committee sends an e-mail to every member with their then current listing. In December, the Committee sends a confirmation only to those members who requested changes to their listing.

Building Expansion Update

The most recent accomplishment has been the new landscaping – it is transforming our “active” construction site into a beautiful welcoming entranceway to our shul! The road in front of the shul is nearly finished and will be ready for use soon.

Florida Power & Light had to shut down the transformer on Aug 9th in order to provide a new power service for the West Wing. This resulted in the whole building being out of power and work continued with the installation of a portable generator. The power cables have since been reconnected and the power is now restored, but only to the original building. The power to the new West Wing won't be available until sometime before Labor Day. In the meantime, the contractors continue to work on the West Wing with power being supplied by the portable generator. Once the power is fully restored, the electricians will be able to complete their work of installing and programming light switches, outlets and lighting. The HVAC system will then be started up, tested, calibrated and put into service and Comcast will be able to install the new broadband service. At that point, the building will become eligible for the “C of O”, the Certificate of Occupancy.

Our interior decorations have begun; the wall decorations, new sconce lighting and a chandelier for the main lobby are being installed. Unfortunately, the delivery of the new Mechitza, Aron Kodesh and Bima has been delayed due to circumstances beyond our control. We look forward to their arrival so that we will be able to complete the decoration of the shul before the end of October and finally move in to our new West Wing.

As originally planned, once the new West Wing opens, the Main Sanctuary will then undergo basic renovations. New carpeting and wall decorations have been ordered, the lighting will be updated and the Sanctuary will be painted creating a fresh new look.
