MESSAGE FROM THE RABBI MORE THAN MEETS THE EYE

Our parasha opens with the declaration:

וַיְהִי מִקֵץ שְׁנָתַיִם יָמִים וּפַּרְעֹה חֹלֵם וְהִנֵּה עֹמֵד עַל־הַיְאֹר:

A typical English translation is:

It happened at the end of two years; Pharaoh was dreaming that, behold, he was standing over the Nile River.

means "end". Taking note of the added letter (mem), a more literal translation of the verse above would be: From the end of two years, Pharaoh was dreaming... While the literal translation feels somewhat awkward, it holds a deep message according to the teachings of the Sages of the Midrash. It was indeed **from** the "two years" ending that caused Pharaoh's dream. At the end of the previous parasha, Yosef successfully and favorably interpreted the dream of Pharaoh's chief of the wine butlers. He predicted that in three days, Pharaoh would restore the Chief Butler to his former position. Yosef petitioned the Chief Butler to mention him to Pharaoh and to release Yosef from prison. Our Sages indicate Yosef placed too much trust in another human being. As a result, HaShem extended Yosef's imprisonment by two years.

It was because the term of imprisonment concluded that HaShem granted Pharaoh his prophetic dream(s). Our Sages are cautioning us not to think that Pharaoh's dream(s) led to the release of Yosef. Indeed, when we attempt to assess events in

our daily lives, we often miss the full scope.

We are all invested in Israel's confrontation with Hamas. Likely, most of the time we dedicate to gathering news of current events is focused on Israel. I realized this week how difficult it can be to appreciate the vital dynamics of the war in progress. We recognize the challenges facing the members of the IDF and the dilemmas faced by policy making members of Israel's government. We recognize the pain of family, friends and others when a soldier sacrifices his or her life while fighting to protect the residents of Israel. We understand the worry and uncertainty haunting the loved ones of the remaining hostages.

I learned that even the heroes can be suffering. A husband and wife Hatzala ambulance team raced to the site of the horrendous October 7 attacks. They made multiple trips treating patients and taking them to hospitals. At the end of the day, they returned home to clean up and change their clothes. The wife would not stop washing herself. She complained of blood still remaining on her arms. Her husband assured her she did a thorough job. She dismissed his assessment claiming blood was all over her arms. He called for a trauma team to treat his wife!

We look at situations and think we know the story. However, there is more than meets the eye in many, many crucial experiences.

A couple of years ago, the Chafetz Chaim Heritage Foundation launched a program whose slogan is:

Be Kind. Everyone you meet has a challenge you know nothing about.

Let's continue our prayers on behalf of all who are exposed to the difficulties of war. In their merit, let us commit to add to the kindness we extend to others.

ANTISEMITISM IN OUR GENERATION: WHAT IS THE SHUL DOING?

Could it be coincidence that the depth of the hatred by Palestine (Hamas) towards Israel has finally been seen by the world at the same time that the world

became aware of the uncontrolled antisemitism on the college campuses?

For decades, American Presidents, guided by government experts, in succession, believed that they could negotiate peace in the Middle East, blind to Iran's lies and intentions to destroy Israel. Also, College Presidents and leaders have revealed their strong biases in choosing to interpret the endless campus riots against Israel and Jewish students as "free speech in context".

The revelations in the real-world events following October 7th have forever changed the ugly definition of antisemitism. Shockingly, the declaration "Never Again" now requires our own actions against those opposed to us, nationally and locally.

Our children and grandchildren in Israel serve in the IDF. Others in Israeli yeshivas have engaged in dives to provide clothing and food for the soldiers. On an individual level, many Shul Members have sent considerable fundis to many groups in Israel engaged in the battle (e.g. AIPAC, FIDF, Stand by Us, Magen David Adom, etc.)

What our Shul done? Here are some Inspirational activities that our members have participated in:

With Rabbi Yasgur, we invoke the mercy and power of Hashem with Tehillim at every davening.

We held a letter-writing campaign to elected officials asking them to increase support of Israel through funding and arms, as well as a letter writing campaign to Israeli soldiers to give them chizuk.

A number of our Shul Members flew to Washington to take part in the protest against antisemitism joining the 300,000 strong.

Recognizing antisemitic incidents against other shuls, the Security Committee applied for and received \$150,000 in Federal grants to fortify the Shul and to install communications equipment that will be monitored by the Palm Beach County Sherriff's Office.

We employ a private security service for times of high-density member presence.

We receive training, information and support from the SCN (Secure Communications Network) of Federation.

The Shul's Board of Directors are at the forefront of seeking all we can do to support Israel. One lesson from the Torah is that we are a Klal. Individually, we can be strong in our action, as Yosef was when he remained true to his father's teachings while in Egypt under dire circumstances. Ultimately, Klal Yisroel is one family that is obligated to support and forgive each other. As a Klal, we are stronger together.

To new residents, or those who have not yet returned from the days of the pandemic, we look forward to seeing you in Shul. We are committed to improving our Shul by **listening** and **responding** to your needs, concerns and interests. Shabbat Shalom.

CHESED OPPORTUNITIES AT TORAH OHR

Many of us can remember when President John F. Kennedy exclaimed, "Ask not what your country can do for you. Ask what you can do for your country." When it comes to engaging in acts of kindness, "chesed," many of us need to ask ourselves the same question. It's not "what can others do for me" but rather, "what can I do for others?" Being kind and acting charitably is one of the thirteen attributes of Hashem, whom we are encouraged to emulate. Pirkei Avot (3:22) reminds us that simply being scholarly or performing mitzvot without engaging in good deeds is comparable to a tree that has many branches but has no root system. Eventually, a wind will come and blow it over. The ultimate act of "chesed" is when we occupy ourselves by taking care of matters that encompass death and dying with no expectation of reciprocity. This is called, "chesed shell emes," true acts of kindness.

Our shul is fortunate to have a select group of people who are eager to perform these acts of kindness. These people participate in the work of the Bikur Cholim/Chesed committee. They call or visit the sick. They set up shiva houses, arrange for minyanim and provide chairs so that mourners can easily and properly observe shiva. They provide meals such as the "seuda havra'ah," the first meal surviving relatives eat when they return from the cemetery. They lend out emergency medical equipment such as wheelchairs and walkers when our members are in need.

We have liaison relationships with the chaplains of the local hospitals. As such we can help arrange the provision of a Shabbos guest room for families of hospitalized members. We can also help obtain religious articles, such as electric candles and siddurim for any of our members who might be in the hospital over a longer period of time. In fact, we have a helpful tote bag filled with items that our members might need while they are hospitalized.

We also have a liaison relationship with a social worker from the local Jewish Family Services. They stand ready to provide our shul members with a myriad of services. These include support groups for bereavement or caregiving, educational webinars and presentations, financial assistance for the needy, a nonperishable food pantry and kosher meals on wheels. They also conduct a senior day program and can arrange for home health care aides or respite. They provide discrete mental health services. Finally, they have a "kibbitz and ride" program where they will have someone drive folks to their doctor's appointments or even to the grocery store, if need be.

Our Torah Ohr volunteer program is simple and easy to join. We have created our own "WhatsApp" Bikur Cholim/ Chesed group. Any time there is a need for an act of "chesed" such as picking up a meal (which is paid through our committee), making a phone call or touching base with someone who may need to be looked in on, a message goes out on the app. We ask for someone to figuratively raise their hand and volunteer to help out. There is no long term obligation or cost to the volunteer, although donations from recipients are always appreciated. We are always looking for extra volunteers of this sort who can help out.

The Gemara (Baba Kama 92a) states that when an individual prays for another who has a similar problem, their prayers will be answered first. R' Shlomo of Zvhill commented that if a person is answered for merely praying for another person, how much more so will be answered if he actually helps another person with acts of kindness.

The odds are that we will all need some sort of "chesed" one day. We all eventually sit shiva and many of us occasionally fall ill or need an act of kindness from a friend. In the great "bank account of life," we should all prepare by making deposits of chesed if we ever expect to make a withdrawal someday. Chesed transcends shul politics. It is just the right thing to do.

Death notices are handled by the shul office staff. Transportation to doctor's offices is handled directly by Volen, Palm Trans or Kibbutz and Ride.

All are certainly invited to participate as volunteers in this group. If you wish to have your name added to our WhatsApp chat so that you can join our elite group of "mitzvah men and women" and one day perform an act of chesed, please contact me as mentioned above. In the merit of performing these mitzvot of chesed may Hashem bless us all by providing for our needs through good times and bad.



Request for Adjustment to Congregation Torah Ohr Membership Dues and/or Capital Repair Fund

The office staff has been directed to NOT accept applications or answer any questions regarding dues and Capital Repair Fund accommodations.

All questions regarding this procedure should be directed to the Financial Secretary.

The Board of Directors recognizes that not everyone who wishes to be a member of Congregation Torah Ohr has the financial capability to pay the full amount of the Congregation's dues and the required contribution to the Capital Repair Fund.

The Board must balance two critical responsibilities:

First, The Board must develop an annual budget that enables the Congregation to provide the programs and services required to support a vigorous Orthodox Jewish community in Century Village West.

Dues represent approximately one-third of the income needed to accomplish that goal. The balance comes from the proceeds of the annual dinner and directory, fees for some programs and goodwill donations from members.

The Capital Repair Fund supports repairs or changes to the Congregation's building as approved by the Board.

Second, The Board is responsible for making membership available to any Jew living in or near Century Village West, regardless of that individual's ability to pay the total assessed dues.

Any arrangement must be done in a manner sensitive to the person making the request while preserving maximum confidentiality.

Our bylaws require that "The President shall appoint a Good and Welfare Committee which shall have the authority to adjust membership dues and assessment and arrange special payment schedules for members with special needs."

To achieve both responsibilities with confidentiality and sensitivity, the Board has established the following procedure:

Members desiring a dues accommodation must complete the confidential request form on the congregation's website. The form is sent ONLY to the Financial Secretary.

If one is unable to complete the form on the website, a paper form is available in the building lobby. The completed, signed form must be submitted **only to the Financial Secretary** or placed in the secure mailbox in the building lobby.

The Financial Secretary will review the application and, if necessary, contact the requestor for additional information.

The Financial Secretary will send copies of the application to the other members of the Good and Welfare Committee with all personal identification information redacted.

Within one week of receiving the request, the Good and Welfare Committee will vote on whether to accept or deny the request or ask for additional information from the requestor.

The Financial Secretary will contact the requestor(s) with the decision of the Good and Welfare Committee.

The Financial Secretary will direct the office staff to make any adjustments to the requestor's account.

The decision of the Good and Welfare Committee shall be final.

Adjustments are granted for one membership year only.
