A THOUGHT FROM THE RABBI

In tractate Shabbat 68a, Rabbi Simai taught: When B'nai Israel accorded precedence to the declaration of Na'aseh (נשמת) "We will do" over the declaration V'Nishma (נשמת) "We will hear/learn" ministering angels came and tied two crowns to each and every member of the Jewish people, one corresponding to "We will do" and one corresponding to "We will hear." A careful reading of this account appears to yield a contradiction. If the two crowns were given to correspond to the two actions of Na'aseh and Nishma, why is it important to mention the order in which these responses were made?

Rav Yosef Soloveitchik, z"I explained that had the order been reversed, with the hearing preceding the action, it would have been logical to conclude that one must hear or learn Torah **in order** to know what to do and how to do it. Had this been the order, we would understand that learning Torah is a necessary component of fulfilling the commands of the Torah. If so, we really have only one statement of commitment from the Jewish nation. We would then ask, why did we merit two crowns?

Monumentally, we must note the actual order. Rav Soloveitchik identified two different types of Torah study. The first is the acquisition of knowledge, the handbook, to know how to implement the commandments. These are both part Na'aseh (נעשה) "We will do" But, then we have a second type of Torah; that is the V'Nishma (נשמע) "We will hear/learn". Even after we know the details, we still study Torah. There is an independent mitzvah to study Torah just for the sake of occupying ourselves with Torah study.

The name of our Shul is Congregation Torah Ohr, appropriately reflecting our mission to promote the light of Torah through its frequent study. As I reflect over the past several years, I note how we have expanded our offering of ongoing classes, special shiurim, lectures visiting scholars and other programs.

Congregation Torah Ohr is a Beit Tefilah, a house of prayer. In tandem with our study of Torah, our davening presents opportunities to express ourselves in prayer, to grow in prayer and to grow closer to HaShem. All of our endeavors promote our bonding with one another. Our shul is proud to create all three categories (and more) of opportunities.

I extend a Yeyasher Kochachem to the Co-Chairmen of our Education Committee, Rabbi Kenneth Greene and Rabbi David Jacobowitz, to the committee members, to all of our many partners in making our goals accessible to our membership and to all who participate in the many valuable opportunities.



Mincha & Ma'ariv vary throughout the year, at times being one minyan and at other times two separate minyanim, early (Plag) and z'man (Shekiah). Please check the weekly Synagogue Bulletin for exact times.



RABBI DAVID STAV December 15-17, 2023 Parashat Miketz

Torah Ohr is honored to welcome Israeli scholar and leader Rav David Stav. Rav Stav is one of the founders and current director of TZOHAR, the Israeli Rabbinic organization of Zionist Orthodox Rabbis that seeks to bridge the gap between religious and secular Jews in Israel.



Rav Stav received his semicha from Rav Avraham Shapira of the Mercaz Harav Yeshiva. He has served as a lecturer and community leader both in Israel and Antwerp, Belgium. In addition to serving as the Chief Rabbi of the city of Shoham, he has served as a rabbinical judge on courts for conversion and other Halachic issues in the Tel Aviv area. Rav Stav has also served as a cochair of the Ohr Torah Stone Institute with Rabbi Shlomo Riskin. Rav Stav is an advocate of the use of pre-nuptial agreements as a way to resolve the Agunah/Get Refusal issue and supports offering a kashrut endorsement as an alternative to the kashrut supervision of the Chief Rabbinate. We look forward to hearing from Rabbi Stav this season.

This annual event is sponsored by Rabbi Dr. Moshe Kranzler in memory of his wife, Eveline.





We are honored to welcome the founder of United Hatzalah

Eli Beer was born in Israel, where he witnessed his first terror attack at the age of seven. This traumatic experience, coupled with his desire to help save people, encouraged him to become a volunteer medic. Beer has been involved in emergency medical first response in Israel since 1988. With 25 years of life-saving experience, he has responded to some of the worst civil, wartime and terror-related incidents. He currently serves as Founder and President of United

Hatzalah; lecturer to health organizations worldwide on the importance of receiving medical care within the first few minutes of an incident through a network of volunteers; has expertise in creating cohesive and integrated responses to mass casualty incidents as well as terrorist attacks; is a pioneer in the field of GPS-based technology for medical response; recipient of awards, including the 2010 Social Entrepreneur for Israel received by the Schwab Foundation, the 2011 Presidential Award for Volunteerism in Israel received by President Shimon Peres, and the 2012 Young Global Leader award. Married with 5 children and when not saving lives or guiding United Hatzalah, he manages the family real estate company, Beer Realty.

RAV YITZCHAK ETSHALOM

One of the highlights of the Torah Ohr calendar is the annual Scholar-in- Residence program. This program features an outstanding personality with recognized credentials as a dynamic educator and thinker. The Scholar program affords participants the opportunity to explore the depths of Jewish thought and philosophy and to consider serious issues confronting the Modern Orthodox community.

Rav Yitzchak Etshalom is a dynamic and exciting educator. His ability to reach out to today's youth and share with them his passion for Jewish learning and Jewish life has enriched many young lives. He launched the Beit Midrash program at YULA Girls High School as well as opening the Beit Midrash at Shalhevet, where he currently serves as Rosh Beit Midrash. Rav Etshalom directs the Tanach Masters Program at YULA Boys High School. He lectures annually at the prestigious "Yemei lyyun" Tanakh Seminar at Herzog College. In addition, he teaches Daf Yomi and a popular Navi series at the Young Israel of Century City and his podcasts on Daf Yomi (www.dafyomiyicc.org) have attracted an international following, as have his Tanakh podcasts, many of which are available at www.yutorah.org and at www.ou.org, as well as on Spotify, iTunes and other popular podcast platforms. His critically acclaimed series "Between the Lines of the Bible" is a methodological guide to the study of Tanakh. He authored a weekly lecture for Yeshivat Har Etzion's Virtual Beit Midrash on the books of Amos and Hoshea and his book on Amos will be published in the fall of 2023 as part of the Koren Maggid Studies in Tanakh. Rabbi Etshalom lives in Los Angeles with his wife Stefanie, also a dynamic educator; their children live in Alon Shevut, Yerushalayim and Washington Heights.
