### A TIME TO UN-MUTE

A few weeks ago, I attended the Central Conference of American Rabbis (CCAR) Convention. The 2021 edition, like most of our lives, moved to a fully virtual platform. During one breakout session, I found myself frustrated and agitated when my responses to a pair of questions were completely ignored. Just as I could feel my pulse start to rise, I saw a blinking light out of the corner of my eye. My microphone was muted – leaving me to feel invisible. I was there in the room, but no one could see me or hear me – a very COVID-19 moment.

This last year we witnessed the coming out party for digital and virtual age. Unable to meet in person, we all turned to Zoom, FaceTime, Teams, and a host of other technological wonders to maintain our connections to one another. DoorDash, UberEats, Shipt and others kept us nourished, while Amazon delivered more to our doors than we ever knew was possible. Technology not only made things more efficient, it kept our society moving forward. Our entire Temple Shalom experience transformed as we transitioned from physical to virtual, becoming a synagogue without walls.

Grateful for the many ways in which technology allows us to bridge the gaps created by physical distancing, we know that these blessings came with a cost. Some of those were known up front – the fallibility of remote delivery services which did not always result in the products we wanted, or exactly the right food orders. Those we could return, or accept, knowing that it beat the alternative of having to go out to the store or restaurant in person. Other costs were more subtle. Zoom let us gather in groups, but we had to alter our interactions. We had to "mute" ourselves often, in order to avoid talking over each other. Unable to see more than a head, chest and the occasional hand motion, we lost the connection created by body language and being present. Much less the feeling generated by hearing the buzz of a

room full of people.

Our greatest moments this year came at times when we figured out how to "un-mute" ourselves – circumventing the challenges we faced to create the interpersonal connections that are the hallmark of our congregation. As a community, we felt this at the drive-in events, shofar in the park, Purim-Palooza, and Shabbat ShaPLAY programs.

Many individuals within the congregation found many ways to "un-mute" and connect with one another. Members of our Temple Family brought meals and made calls to those who were home bound, shared their talents with technology to help those who were struggling, volunteered at local organizations to address food insecurity, helped others get access to the vaccine, and even baked challah for those in need of a pick-me-up (see our President's article!).

We realized over this last year that these human interactions remain irreplaceable, even at a time when we have become more dependent on technology than ever before. Like all of you, I am eager for the time when we can be together in person on a regular basis. I know that the day is not far away when we will again be gathering in our building. When we do reach that moment, I pray that we will hold on to the lessons learned during this pandemic. Feeling gratitude for the opportunities we have to be with one another. That we will continue to engage in activities that strengthen our connections – generously giving of our time and talents to reach out to one another, bring help to those who are struggling, and lift the spirits of those in need. So that as we move forward, no one feels "muted" in our Temple Family.

# CANTOR Donna Azu

Between the holidays of Passover and Shavuot, we have the emergence of some newer Jewish holidays. Since the establishment of the State of Israel in 1948, several new holidays have been added to the Jewish calendar – Yom HaShoah (Holocaust Remembrance Day), Yom HaZikaron (Memorial Day) and Yom HaAtzmaut (Independence Day). In Israel, these days are observed as national holidays. This year, all three holidays fall in the month of April. We begin with Yom HaShoah on April 8, followed by Yom HaZikaron on April 14 and Yom HaAtzmaut on April 15.

The date of Yom HaShoah was selected by the Israeli Parliament on April 12, 1951. Although the date was established by the Israeli government, it has become a day commemorated by Jewish communities and individuals worldwide. The Jewish community of Collier County will gather together virtually on Sunday, April 11 at 10:00am to remember those whose lives were lost during the Holocaust. More information about the commemoration can be found on page 18.

The Israeli Parliament established the day that precedes Yom HaAtzmaut as Yom HaZikaron, a day to memorialize soldiers who lost their lives fighting in the War of Independence and subsequent battles, as well as a day to remember civilian victims of terrorism. The official "switch" from Yom HaZikaron to Yom Ha'atzmaut takes place a few minutes after sundown, with a ceremony on Mount Herzl in Jerusalem in which the flag is raised from half-staff to the top of the pole.

Israelis celebrate Yom HaAtzmaut in a variety of ways. In the cities, the nighttime festivities may be found on the main streets. Crowds will gather to watch public shows, and many spend the night dancing Israeli folk dances or singing Israeli songs. During the daytime, thousands of Israeli families barbecue and go out on hikes and picnics. Army camps are open for civilians to visit and to display the recent technological achievements of the Israeli Defense Forces.

Though we may not be in Israel, below is a list of ways you can celebrate Yom HaAtzmaut at home!

- 1. Have a barbecue
- 2. Go on a nature walk
- 3. Play some Israeli music
- 4. Eat hummus! My husband makes amazing hummus. Check out our video on YouTube for the recipe and to watch how to make your own. https://youtu.be/21NZsZfoEyk
- 5. Support an Israeli charity
- 6. Eat at an Israeli restaurant
- 7. Enjoy a glass of Israeli wine or beer
- 8. Watch an Israeli TV show. My recent favorites are "Tehran" on Apple TV, "Fauda" on Netflix, and "False Flag" on Hulu

# Rabbi Ariel Boxman



In the midst of a global pandemic, when young families have felt somewhat disconnected from one another, Temple Shalom has created a space for connection and Jewish engagement. Thanks to the generosity of the Jewish Federation of Greater Naples, we were able to kick off our Shabbat ShaPLAY program this year. Shabbat ShaPLAY is a program geared to young Jewish families with children between the ages of 0-5.

The families are invited to join together with Rabbi Boxman and Miss Jane on one Shabbat morning each month at a local park. The students arrive and play on the jungle gym while parents enjoy coffee and socializing. Following arrival, Rabbi Boxman invites families to each take a Shabbat ShaPLAY bag which includes a picnic blanket, snacks, an individual challah and musical instruments.

The families each spread out their picnic blanket on a large lawn and children find their seats. For the next 30 minutes, Miss Jane and Rabbi Boxman lead the families in a musical Shabbat celebration. Children get up and dance, recite the kiddush and motzi, and hear a story. The morning ends with more playing and socially distanced socializing.

The attendance at Shabbat ShaPLAY has been incredible and the feedback is always positive. Even though Covid-19 altered the original plans for the monthly program, Temple Shalom was able to shift and create a safe alternative. Shabbat ShaPLAY is open to all young families regardless of membership at our Congregation.

Temple Shalom stood out this year by not just putting our regular content online but finding ways to create new ways for engagement and meet the people where they are. The Decade of Distinction is a wonderful example of this principle. I am so proud of the celebration we had for Rabbi Miller and Cantor Azu. Our chairs, committee and staff did not just create a virtual fundraiser, they made this environment work for us. They were able to take advantage of the situation and make it special. Yes, we always have a Scholar-in-Residence (thank you to Henry Kraus and Shirley Kraus z"l) but this year we were able to have five scholars teach and engage the congregation. Yes, we now have a wonderful Artist-in-Residence program (thank you to Paula Brody and Merrill Hassenfeld), but this year we were able to have five cantors, Jesse Goebel, Jim Cochran, and our youth and adult choir create a fantastic concert to celebrate Rabbi and Cantor for their ten special years with us.

The flexibility that we have shown this year kept our community strong. Sustaining and strengthening our connections is an important part of my mission as president. I am so grateful to see the out-of-the-box thinking our clergy, staff and members use to create new experiences for our One Family: drive-up events, distanced gatherings, shofar and Purim programs in our parking lot, and meaningful engagement online. Their creativity taught us a lot – and showed us that innovation is key going forward. We will be taking some of the lessons we have learned and successful programs from the COVID-19 era and employing them again in the future.

As I mentioned in previous articles and letters, I never expected to be a president while our physical Temple was shut down. I was looking forward to being at Friday night oneg to chat with people, sitting in the library on Sunday mornings getting know new families, attending Friday

morning Shabbat services at the preschool and just being around Temple more. Without those in-person events, it has been more difficult to connect to people and continue that sense of community for me.

Learning from our Temple's successes that this is a year to go outside the norm, I decided to do something new to get to know more people and overcome the challenges we face today. Baking challah is a strong part of my family's Shabbat experience. Taking that tradition, I began the practice of using challah to connect with members of our congregation. Every week I deliver a challah to a congregant who may need a pick-me-up or just a "hello". As you can imagine, people are very grateful. To be honest, it is uplifting for me as well, as I feel fortunate to be in a position where I can share this blessing with others. While challah has become my calling card, I know that all of us have ways that we can increase our connections at Temple Shalom. As we near the end of my first year in this role, I would ask each of you to consider how you might connect with others. 

# MITZPE RAMON By Andy Karpman

Mitzpe Ramon was founded in 1951 as a camp for the workers building Highway 40. The town's first permanent residents, several young families from Kibbutz Re'im and other parts of Israel began settling there in 1956. After five years, the town was home to 370 residents including 160 children, most of them veteran Israelis. There were also 180 housing units to absorb new immigrants. They were joined by immigrants from North Africa, Romania, and India in the 1960s, and it became the southernmost of the Negev's development towns.

Conditions in the early years were harsh, with limited food supplies and practically no modern-day amenities. Ice blocks and provisions were delivered once a week by a supply truck. There was a single school with one classroom for all ages. The homes of the first settlers were prefabricated asbestos barracks. Later, rows of small attached stone houses were built and after that, apartment buildings, beginning in the early 1960s.

In 1972, Mitzpe Ramon had a population of about 1,400 people living in 300 households. The town further grew after Ramon Airbase was completed in 1982. In 1988, the town had a population of about 3,000, and it experienced more significant population growth when it absorbed Soviet immigrants during the Post-Soviet era.







I hope you had a chance to participate last March in the *Day and Evening of Learning* events sponsored by the Jewish Community Relations (JCRC), the Jewish Federation of Greater Naples and Temple Shalom. Under the leadership of our own Ida Margolis, two informative, educational and emotional "virtual" events were held.

The first program, "It's Chai Time to Visit Jewish Neighbors," was an opportunity to learn about two Jewish communities. Cantor Azu provided a history of Jews from Persia as well as a look at the music of Persia. We also learned about her family's background when they left Iran in 1977 and moved to California. Dr. Ron Duncan Hart educated us about Crypto Jews. Jewish life in Spain changed in 1492 when they were no longer welcome. Muslims and Jews were forced to convert to Catholicism. We learned about their migration to other countries, including America, and how they maintained their Jewish heritage. Both speakers were excellent. It truly was a Day of Learning.

The other event on Wednesday, March 10, was exactly one year after a national emergency was declared regarding the pandemic. It was a time to recognize the amazing work of our clergy here in Collier and Lee Counties. Rabbi Miller moderated the panel as the panel of clergy members told their stories about dealing with difficult life-cycle issues in a totally new and creative way. In addition to Rabbi Miller, the distinguished panel included Pastor Lonnie Mills from Macedonia Baptist Church, Reverend Edward Gleason from Trinity by the Cove, Reverend Dawson Taylor from Naples United Church of Christ and Fr. Hugh McGuigan from Our Lady of Light Catholic Church in Estero.

Mitzvah Madness continued to focus on social action by helping people deal during the pandemic. The clothing drive on February 28 was a huge success. We collected 150 boxes of clothes and bedding items that were donated to local organizations. In addition, thanks to a generous donation from the Sisterhood, we were able to provide needed items for Grace Place and Laces of Love

More events are being planned including a collection of bikes for Bikes for Tykes. This organization provides bikes to underprivileged children and families here in Naples.
