WISE WORDS FOR THE YEAR AHEAD

A few years ago, I shared the following story at Rosh Hashanah:

Long ago, there was a wise pencil maker with an amazing ability to actually speak with his pencils. One day, just before putting one of the pencils into the box for delivery, he took the pencil aside. "There are five things you need to know before I send you out into the world so that you will become the best pencil you can be.

"First, you will be able to do many great things, but only if you allow yourself to be held in someone else's hand.

"Second, you will experience a painful sharpening from time to time, but you will need it to become a better pencil.

"Third, you will be able to correct any mistakes you might make.

"Fourth, the most important part of you will always be what's inside.

"And finally, Little Pencil, you must leave your mark on every surface on which you are used. No matter what the condition, you must continue to write." The pencil understood and promised to remember, and it went into the box with purpose in its heart.

With the High Holy Days just around the corner, I think these wise words serve as excellent guides for us to reflect upon what has transpired in the past year, and the sacred Days of Awe that await us. Living in a world forever changed by the pandemic and the remoteness of social distancing, we understand even

more tangibly the importance of human contact, and the value of being held. We faced painful challenges this year that tested our limits. While difficult, those same obstacles had the capacity to sharpen our skills and focus, helping us to grow and evolve.

The imagery of this story also reminds us why we will gather at Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Like the pencil, we know that even if the world sees what we look like on the outside, the most valuable part of us is within. Though we aim to be our best selves, we know that we have made mistakes. With that in mind, we have the ability, as well as the responsibility, to atone for those transgressions and correct our way.

Finally, we recognize the importance of how our actions impact not only the world today, but what awaits us in the future. We must continue to write, to leave our mark on the world. We stand on the shoulders of countless generations, those who have gifted us with their wisdom, knowledge, and the work of their hands. Now it is our turn to add to the story. In particular, to leave our mark on the history of the Jewish people and ensure that the chain of tradition is not broken. The actions we take to live our lives guided by Jewish values, to embrace a connection with Israel, to celebrate holidays and engage actively with the Jewish community will create the pathway to guide those who follow after us.

This year, strive to be the best pencil, and the best person that you can be.

CLERGY MESSAGE

As our summer is coming to a close and we are preparing for the High Holy Days, it is important to take a few moments to reflect on the year we have had and refocus ourselves for the coming year. Unfortunately, because of the global pandemic we are living through, we have seen too many deaths and experienced more loss than we ever could have imagined. In an effort to help us process what we have experienced and help us move forward, Rabbi Frank Muller will be teaching a four-week mini-course via Zoom on the topic of life and death.

This four week mini-course was conceived and designed by Rabbi Muller to address the difficult issues of confronting our mortality and dealing with death, which have been at the forefront of our minds the past eighteen months as we have witnessed the loss of over 600,000 Americans due to the Covid pandemic.

Topics covered will include Judaism's reverence for life, where is God when disaster strikes, how our faith provides the spiritual tools and resources needed for developing greater equanimity and resilience in accepting death, and Jewish views of the afterlife. The class begins August 11 and was timed to coincide with the month of Elul, the thirty day period of spiritual preparation prior to the start of the High Holy Days. There will be a special focus on how a confrontation with our own mortality is built directly into the liturgy and theology of Yom Kippur.

The class is not meant to be morbid, morose or depressing, but rather uplifting, inspirational, and energizing. Participants will learn to understand that our human mortality is not to be feared or dreaded, but through its acceptance, can actually help us to lead lives that are more meaningful, more gratifying, less anxious and less worrisome. That's the "why". The "how" is what you will learn in the class. We realize that discussions about death and dying are difficult for most people, but what you will get out of this class in terms of ways to achieve more positive and productive living will be well worth the time.

RELATIONSHIPS!

Relationships – That is what ONE FAMILY is all about. At Temple Shalom we consciously focus on opportunities to develop relationships. It is a core value!

When the pandemic came into our lives, we started a process of looking inward to understand the needs of the members of our Temple Shalom community. With all of us isolated from one another, how could we reduce the loneliness of our Senior members who were "held prisoner" in their own homes by a virus and by fear. We began by arranging for members to call those Seniors at least weekly. A cadre of members called one, two, or three other members to check on them and to spend a little time chatting. For some of the Seniors, these phone calls were a respite from the loneliness of isolation.

In addition to the phone calling, volunteers came forward to do the grocery shopping for members who needed this assistance. A third group of volunteers became the technology tutors for Seniors who had been unable to access the many online services, classes, lectures, and entertainment provided by our clergy. A fourth group of volunteers made "check-in" calls to every member of the congregation three times during the many months of the pandemic.

With all of these connections taking place in our ONE FAMILY, relationships developed among our members. Two examples...

Rhonda Brazina and Phyllis Titlebaum had never met. Rhonda was selected to call Phyllis and to shop for her. After months of calling and shopping, Rhonda called Tussy to say "thank you!!" She was grateful they had been paired! She said she had made a new friend and they had agreed to meet for lunch when it would be safe to do so. A few hours later, another phone call, this time from Phyllis. She also said thank you! She was so grateful for having been paired with Rhonda! They had become friends and were planning to meet for lunch when it was safe to do so. Imagine the joy at receiving these two phone calls...and on the same day!

Iris Shur and Rosie Hyman had never met. From the beginning of the pandemic, Iris and Rosie talked weekly. Over time, a friendship developed and they agreed to meet for lunch when it was safe, once again, to meet in person. In an email to Tussy, Iris wrote:


"I called Rosie Hyman every week for over a year and a half. She was alone and not feeling too great. We finally met last week for lunch and got to know each other in person. It was a delight!"

Iris included a picture of the two of them at the restaurant.

Here's what Rosie wrote in an email to Iris:

"It was great to finally meet you in person... I so appreciated your weekly calls and our lively conversations... I don't know whose idea it [the calling project] was, but it was a good one. You and your weekly calls certainly helped me get through a difficult time. Again, I thank you for that!"

And so it began – two new relationships! We are sure there are many more stories. This extended period of isolation actually brought our members together! This project (which we called The Shalom Cares Project) - calling, shopping, and technology tutoring - created new relationships even during the time we were all physically isolated from one another. What would your life be like if every day was like the Yom Kippur fast?

In the world to come, each person will be asked what he or she did in this world.

If one says, "I fed the hungry," "I clothed the naked," or "I performed deeds of lovingkindness," that person will be told:

"This is the gateway of Adonai; the righteous shall enter therein."

- Midrash Psalms 118:17

We live in a prosperous country at a prosperous time. However, hunger is a real concern in our community and beyond. If your stomach is growling, it is difficult to study, work, pray, or be spiritual. What would your life be like if every day was like the Yom Kippur fast? In fact, for many people in the world, and even in our community, hunger is a real daily occurrence. "But," you may say, "We live in such a wealthy community!" Think again.

- Of the 1,000,000 residents of Lee and Collier Counties, approximately 15% are food insecure, with 1/3 of them children and 1/5 of them seniors. As we are all aware, the pandemic has significantly increased joblessness and food insecurity.
- 65-70% of students in Lee and Collier Counties are considered "economically needy."
- The summer time is especially difficult because schools are on summer break and kids have limited access to school food programs.

This year, the Tikkun Olam Council (TOC) has identified 'Basic Needs' as our primary area of involvement. By this, we mean food, shelter, and clothing. Our TOC projects, educational programs, and advocacy efforts will be primarily directed towards addressing these issues.

I hope that you will support the High Holy Days donation drive to benefit the Harry Chapin Food Bank. Traditionally, many of us were brought up picking up an empty grocery bag as we left the worship service on Rosh Hashanah,

and returning it full of non-perishables on Yom Kippur. But, here at Temple Shalom, we are asking for something a little different - we hope you will make a monetary donation to the Harry Chapin Food Bank instead. They can leverage that money to buy many more groceries than you or I can when we shop at the local Publix. They estimate that every \$1.00 donation provides 2.3 meals. This means that with the approximately \$30,000 which Temple Shalom members donated to the Food Bank last year, 68,400 meals were able to be provided for our foodinsecure neighbors! So, please donate to the High Holy Days Food Bank Donation appeal. It's important!

Volunteer opportunity: The summer is a tough time for the food banks – the number of volunteers is down because some people are 'up north' for the summer. And the needs for food are increased because the school food programs are shut down when the schools are closed for the summer. Harry Chapin Food Bank has a current shortage of volunteers to pack, sort, and distribute food. Looking for a good activity for your havurah or with some friends? This is a good one! 


