Senior Rabbi Adam F. Miller

In the middle of this month, we will read the following passage in Torah:

Then the officials shall address the troops, as follows: "Is there anyone who has built a new house, but not yet dedicated it? Let him go back to his home, lest he die in battle and another dedicate it. Is there anyone who has planted a vineyard but has never harvested it? Let him go back to his home, lest he die in battle and another harvest it. Is there anyone who has paid the bride-price for a wife, but who has not yet married her? Let him go back to his home, lest he die in battle and another marry her." (Deuteronomy 20:5–7)

Clearly the Torah anticipates a time when the Israelites will be at war in the future. It is an insightful and honest text examining the reality that taking back the Promised Land would require some measure of conflict. Still, this text demonstrates an emotional side, noting that while there will be war in the future, there are still tasks that take precedence even in a time of war. It is more important for an individual to return and consecrate a new home, to tend to a newly planted vineyard or to fulfill a marriage vow, than it is to risk one's life in war.

According to one Jewish text, the three exemptions to service in war may be likened to one's religious roots:

(The building of a home is similar) to one's faith – that is, when a person

has acquired foundations for living, but has not yet lived by them. (The planting of a vineyard) to the commandments – that is, if one observes them, but not yet for God's sake (as you have not yet offered the first fruit of the vineyard to God.) (The marriage) to the Torah—that is, if one engages in its study but not yet for its own sake.

While the rabbinic text focuses on religious practice, I see an even more practical interpretation.

- A home that has been built, but not consecrated, is a structure that we have put together, but do not actually use. It sits, empty, yet full of potential. What structures have we put in our lives that remain empty and unused? Perhaps the gym that we belong to, but never visit, or the must-have-it purchases that sit now collecting dust.
- A unharvested vineyard symbolizes all of the projects that we began but never finished. They hold potential to yield great fruit, if we would only finish the work. Instead, we allowed other tasks to take our attention away. Perhaps this takes the form in our lives of home improvement projects that sit incomplete. The classes or lessons that we started to take but never finished. The hobbies that began passionately, and now sit in a closet.

• The new marriage is akin to a sacred promise we made to another individual and have left unfulfilled. A time when someone else is depending on us, or relying upon us, and we are not living up to their expectations. Perhaps a promise made to a friend or loved one to perform a task or make a change in our lives that we have yet to complete.

Having entered the month of Elul, the last month on the Jewish calendar before Rosh Hashanah, our thoughts should turn toward our actions from the past year. As we reflect upon our deeds, let us do so through the lens of this teaching. The reference to war is a reminder that life is fragile, and that we all face some level of risk in life. What sacred tasks have we begun, but not yet finished? What will we regret not having completed when our time on earth is complete? At the end of the day, only we know what homes, vineyards and vows wait for us to use them to their full potential.

May we use this final time of 5783 to end this year on a positive note, making the most of the time we have. For we know not what tomorrow, or the new year will bring.

You may request complimentary tickes for immediate members of your family (parents, grandparents, siblings, children over 25) who are visiting from out of town, military personnel and college students (with ID). Visitors who are members of other Reform congregations are welcome, but a reciprocity form must be sent from their home congregation to Temple Shalom at least two weeks before Rosh Hashanah.

GUESTS

Guests are welcome, but all adults must show a ticket for security purposes. The suggested donation is \$250.00, but no one is turned away for financial reasons. Visitors who join by November 30, 2023 can apply their gift toward a L'Shalom pledge and join the Temple Shalom One Family!

Members in good standing at another synagogue can attend our services via the Union for Reform Judaism's (URJ) reciprocity arrangement. *Their* synagogue should complete and send the URJ's reciprocity form to us on your guests' behalf, by email to info@naplestemple.org.

Please note: guest tickets must be ordered by Friday, September 1. After this deadline, we can't guarantee that we'll be able to accommodate your request.



Ayun Stream and Nature Reserve

Ayun Stream Nature Reserve is located in northern Israel, near the city of Metula, on the edge of the Lebanon border. The park covers the course of the Ayun Stream from where it flows into Israel from Lebanon to the Hula Valley, and on to the Jordan River.

Ayun Stream is one of four sources of the Jordan River. The stream descends from an elevation of 500m to 350m above sea level, through a deep gorge, traveling down five levels, and creating some of the most beautiful waterfalls in the country. The picturesque waterfalls are surrounded

by a lush landscape of vegetation, forests, and wildflowers.

Ayun Stream (Nahal Ayun) is a perennial stream and a tributary of the Jordan River. It originates from two springs in southern Lebanon and runs south through Hula Valley before flowing into the Hasbani River, which joins the Jordan River. In winter the stream fills with rainwater and gushes over the waterfalls. In summer, only a few springs continue to flow into the stream from Ein Sukhra, Tanur Spring, and Cascades Spring. Water is diverted from the Dan springs



and supplements the smaller springs to fill the Ayun.

The nature reserve is home to a variety of trees including the turpentine tree, maple, and buckthorn. Other plants and flowers include Spanish broom, cyclamen, anemones, and cyclamen flowers. The beautiful maritime squill flowers cover "Squill Hill" with a carpet of color in the fall. In the winter you can see grey wagtails, white-throated kingfishers, and common kestrels. Rock pigeons and the Eurasian eagle-owl nest in the surrounding cliffs. For a short time, each year, the park is visited by the rare wallcreeper bird. The waters of Ayun Stream are home to a variety of fish.


Men's Club Ron Yasbin, President

Refreshments will be provided during the question and answer session that follows. The presentation is scheduled to start at 1:00pm. Jscreen has agreed to provide, at reduced cost, kits to the Jewish Community of Greater Naples as well as to the family and friends of participants. We want to make as many people in our community aware of the risks, as well as the scientific and medical advances and how you can protect yourself and your families.

In addition to this event, we are pleased to announce the return of our arrangement with Ben's Kosher Deli to bring meals to Naples on Sunday, January 28. We will also continue sponsoring golf outings, trips to the Alamo and our joint luncheon with the Sisterhood as advertised in *The Voice*. Summertime, and the livin' is easy.

It's summertime, but for whom is the living easy? Was it really easy for Porgy or Bess, the titular characters in Gershwin's play, as black Americans in the slums of Charleston, South Carolina in the early 20th century? Was it really easy for George Gershwin, the son of Russian Jewish immigrants in Brooklyn in the 1930's?

Is it any easier for SW Florida residents in 2023? We are facing all sorts of challenges, such as food insecurity, insufficient housing, hate crimes and rising antisemitism, gun violence, and political polarization. We continue to deal with the residual ravages of the COVID pandemic. We face environmental challenges like hurricanes, climate change, and degradation of the Everglades. We see income disparities and health disparities. And there is increased cynicism about the role of government and about democracy, itself. The livin' is definitely not easy for many of us and our neighbors.

What to do?

- Hunker down "Life is bristling with thorns, and I know no other remedy than to cultivate one's garden" per 18th century Voltaire. That is, create your own universe and share it with those you love.
- Renew yourself Seek true sanctuary at the temple, whether through the solace of prayer or fellowship and social bonds within our congregation. Make connections with those around you.
- Reach out Try to make a difference in the world. Volunteer for something, anything. Or donate time or money to a cause. Heal the cracks in the world around us.



• Be kind – if you're feeling emotional distress about the state of the world, so are your neighbors. Be kind. Be encouraging. Lend a hand.

'Summertime' is aspirational. Like 'Somewhere Over the Rainbow' from the same era, it imagines a better world without its myriad problems - back in the 1930's and equally applicable to our world today. This month, let's each do one thing to make the summertime living easier for those around us.

The Tikkun Olam Volunteers (TOV) of Temple Shalom have recently developed a committee called the Interfaith Engagement Task Force, co-chaired by Ida Margolis and Michelle Levine-Troupp. The Task Force will partner with the Interfaith Alliance of S.W. 
