CLERGY MESSAGE

KEEP CALM AND MOVE FORWARD

I still cannot believe that I find myself writing the phrase, "Nearly a year into the pandemic...." I know that when this began last March, we hoped that perhaps by the late Fall, life would start to return to normal. At the outside, by the Spring of 2021, that's when the fog of COVID-19 would lift from life. We know now that the task is far greater than we first realized and will require much more effort on our part. Recognizing the emotional toll of this ongoing challenge, I want to share with you a message of hope.

You may already know the midrash of Nachshon. When the Israelites escaped Egypt and reached the Sea of Reeds, Moses lifted up his arms, and yet, the sea did not part. According to legend, Moses tried again, lifting his arms heavenward seeking a miracle. This time, one Israelite believed that the Sea would split, Nachshon ben Aminidav. Nachshon walked step by step into the water, repeating to himself the words, "Mi Chamocha ba'Elim Adonai, Mi Chamocha Ne'edar Bakodesh" - "Who is like you, Adonai, among the gods who are worship? Who is like you in awesomeness and holiness?" The water reached Nachshon's mouth, causing him to choke and say, "Mi Kamocha Ne'edar Bakodesh" - changing the Hebrew. Nachshon's faith in God succeeded, and at that very moment the waters split, saving his life, and letting the Israelites escape to freedom. To this day we say "Mi Kamocha" as did Nachshon.

Our tradition also carries an alternative version of the story. In this one, the Israelites began to panic as they waited for the Sea to part. Pushing and shoving at the shore caused someone to knock Nachshon into the water. Not sure what to do, he started to move deeper into the water, praying to God that he would be saved. The rest of the story remains the same – as the water reaches his lips, the Sea parts, and the Israelites are saved.

The key difference between the versions of this tale is whether Nachshon went in voluntarily, or whether he fell in by accident. One of my teachers wisely noted, whether Nachshon fell in or walked in, the result is the same. The most important point is that once he was in the water, Nachshon had faith that things would get better. He did not panic. He went forward, believing that things would work out. My teacher concluded with this message, "The same is true in life. One should worry less about how you got into a situation, and focus more on staying calm while moving forward to a better place."

That teaching feels aptly appropriate right now. How we arrived here in the pandemic matters less than staying calm and making the right choices so that we can move forward to a better tomorrow. Those choices include remaining patient, wearing masks, maintaining our COVID-19 protocols, and getting the vaccine when available. Viewed in the short term, one might feel like Nachshon, slowly moving forward, our actions unable to alter the larger picture as the pandemic continues around us. Do not despair. Know that those actions matter. As more and more people follow the guidelines, and receive the vaccine, a day will come when it feels as if the Sea has split, and the pandemic will no longer have its hold on us, or our society. That day will be one of great jubilation, worthy of song and celebration as if we witnessed the Sea of Reeds.

Believe, friends, in the wisdom of Solomon. This too shall pass. With Nachshon as our guide, we will stay calm, move forward, and together enjoy the blessings of that better tomorrow.



Mishloach Manot


Mishloach Manot are gifts of food that friends (and prospective new friends!) exchange on Purim. We are instructed in the scroll of Esther (9:19) to send gifts to one another. Mishloach Manot include at least two different types of food, including hamantaschen, the traditional three-sided pastry eaten on Purim. These gifts are frequently referred to by their Yiddish name, shalachmanos.

We will be giving out Mishloach Manot (or shalachmanos) to everyone - no need to leave your car!



Matanot L'evyonim (gifts to the poor), another Purim tradition, are gifts given at this season to those in need so that they, too, can celebrate Purim. (Esther 9:22). Many families have committed to participating in this important social justice aspect of the holiday.

In keeping with that tradition, the Mitzvah Madness Committee of the Tikkun Olam Council will be holding a clothing drive immediately following the dramatic reading of the Megillah. MAKING LEMONADE: A CURE FOR PANDEMIC ISOLATION!

Are you looking for something meaningful that helps others during this pandemic isolation? Since March we've been limited in our activities, travel, and seeing our families in person – which has not been easy. But we can make lemonade from those pandemic lemons by going through our closets and donating the gently used clothing we no longer use. Now that would be a mitzvah!

The Tikkun Olam Council's Mitzvah Madness Committee is sponsoring a:

Drive-Thru Clothing Drive Sunday, February 28 10:00am to 11:30am Temple Shalom parking lot

Who will receive the clothing? People in need who are being helped by non-profit agencies in Lee and Collier Counties. They include – women and children living in shelters affected by domestic abuse, as well as homeless, migrant, and low-income families. Some need nicer clothing to begin a job or return to the work force. Some clothing will be sold through non-profit agency "stores" to help fund services to these individuals and families.

What makes this a win-win project?

- People who are in need (men, women, children) will be able to wear the donated clothing.
- You will feel good about having done a real mitzvah during the time you are isolating at home
- Temple Shalom will have another successful mitzvah madness project to follow-up on the food drive we held in November, which resulted in a whopping 1700 lbs. of food donations to the Harry Chapin Food Bank!

So, get started on all your closets (children too) and set aside the clothing you haven't worn in awhile or that no longer fits. *Please*: No dirt, stains, tears, broken zippers, swimsuits, swim trunks, or undergarments (unless new and with tags). Place the items in tall kitchen bags or boxes labeled for men's, women's or children's clothing. Also needed: sheets (crib, twin or larger), any size pillow cases, small blankets or quilts, small, washable stuffed animals and bicycles or bike parts in any condition.

Come to the Temple Shalom parking lot on Sunday morning, February 28 between 10:00am and 11:30am. You won't even have to get out of your car. 
