The Name We Remember

I cannot say this enough: Thank you. From all of our family to the entire One Family of Temple Shalom. Your loving presence, caring words, and supportive efforts provided the blessings that we needed to endure the recent challenge of my father's passing. The letters, donations, phone calls, and food have been part of an overwhelming outpouring of emotion from the congregation. We truly feel blessed.

I am especially grateful to my tremendous clergy partners, Cantor Azu and Rabbi Boxman, for filling in during my absence and giving me the space to grieve. Our amazing staff team, lead by Deborah Fidel, for all of your help, going above and beyond for the shiva gathering at Temple, and providing us with a meal. Our Temple President, Len Teitelbaum, and our Board of Trustees for sending a meal during shiva and making it possible for me to step away from my role to be with my family. I also want to publicly thank Shellie Spector, Joyce Toub, Pam Lundborg, Jessica Rosen, Ellen Goldberg, Jessica Schaab, Daryl Sissman, Amy Hunter, and the women of the Temple Shalom Sisterhood for organizing our local shiva at the Temple and in our home. We also could not have managed without the transportation assistance of Ellen Goldberg, Daryl Sissman, and Alicia Feldman making sure that our kids always had a ride home.

Robert Frost wisely wrote, "In three words, I can sum up everything I've learned about life: It goes on." The death of a parent, at any age, is not easy, and yet, life goes on. As the liturgy at the High Holy Days starkly reminds us, this type of experience makes one keenly aware that you are now next in line. This provides an acute awareness of our mortality, and a sobering reminder of reality. We need to do what we can to care for our bodies, to


extend our time on this earth as far as possible, but there are limitations. Life is not a given, nor will one live forever.

At the same time, those who have departed this world are never truly gone. They are not "lost" as we sometimes say in our common speech. Rather, they live on in the generations who follow and remember them. Every time we pass on their names, share their stories and live by the lessons and values they embodied, we provide a gift beyond measure: life ever-lasting in the form of memory.

In recent weeks, I witnessed once more the power of our mourning rituals. Particularly the opportunity to gather with family, friends, and community. The presence of our Temple Family uplifted my spirits, as did the chance to share memories of my father with those who came to visit. Those conversations enabled me to process my grief, a gift given by those who made the time to visit and sit with us. Truly, talking about my dad, recalling his life through story, gave him life eternal, as it helped me to focus on the memories and legacy that he has left for me.

One of my favorite poems, "L'chol Ish Yesh Shem – Each of Us Has a Name" by Zelda, acknowledges that we receive a name when we enter this world, and then proceed to be called by many different names. Names given by family or friends, by the work that we do, by our accomplishments, our failures and our success. The piece ends with the verse, "Each of us has a name, given by the sea, and given by our death." May the name of Jim Miller, who has passed now beyond this world, live on with his death in the hearts and minds of those who knew him, and all who listened to the stories of his life. In this way, may his name be for a blessing.


Hike at Fakahatchee State Park Sunday, January 29, 9:30am



Machane Yehuda Market

Beyond seasonal fruits and vegetables, prime meat and poultry, and fresh fish, Jerusalem's Machane Yehuda has come a long way as a tourist destination and foodie haven.

Machaneh Yehuda, the largest open-air market in Jerusalem, was founded during the Ottoman period. It was developed by local merchants who brought produce to sell in a central location. It was a ramshackle mess for many years, but still, it grew in popularity, adding more merchants

and attracting more customers.

For many years, Machaneh Yehudah was the heart of the city and where most Jerusalemites would find their favorite groceries, but like much of Jerusalem's decaying infrastructure, it needed a lot of improvements.


Finally, in more recent years, major renovations were made, including repaving roads and a new roof over many of the open-air areas. There were also more efforts to bring in cafés and boutiques and bars, transforming the shuk into a nighttime venue as well. This effort has paid off, and today Machaneh Yehuda is a bustling market and the center of innovative food in Jerusalem.

It is the perfect representation of the old and new in Israel. Many stalls are still owned by descendants of the original owners, while creative entrepreneurs with new ideas and an innovative approach to trendy foods are popping up regularly to rejuvenate and invigorate the old market.



A visit to Machaneh Yehuda is a transformative experience. Wizened faces yelling out produce and prices, tourists in shorts and tank tops jostling with black-frocked Hasidim for freshbaked bread and rugelach.

It is a kosher foodie's dream come true, with food from cuisines all over the world represented among over 250 vendors. You can find almost anything in the market, grilled meats, falafel, fresh-roasted coffees, savory spices, fresh ground tahini, and every flavor of halva you can imagine. You will also see gourmet cheese from all over the world, beer, candy, and even clothes and jewelry.

We had 16 people from TOV help collect the food, including several new Temple members who participated in their first such community event.


Harry Chapin Food Bank has made a huge difference for many families in our community, especially post Hurricane lan. The Harry Chapin Food Bank is a major reason why
