Light in a Time of Darkness

By the time this arrives at your home, I will have finished my two weeks on faculty at URJ Camp Coleman, our regional summer camp. Those weeks are always special, a time to engage with Jewish youth, and witness the future of our people. As powerful as camp can be, the last few years have been challenging times to be there. After cancelling in 2020, the 2021 summer was difficult with strict restrictions, turning camp into a bubble, cut off from the world to prevent an outbreak of COVID-19. In 2022, the restrictions loosened to some degree, but that came with a steep cost. Staff or campers who tested positive for COVID had to leave immediately, even if that meant parents traveling great distances to pick them up.

For the first time since 2019, this summer was "normal." In some ways it was a great relief, no longer worrying about masks, campers able to mingle between units, and the freedom to move in and out of camp as desired. At the same time, this summer also renewed a sense of gratitude for many on staff and in camp leadership. They could once more appreciate aspects of camp that they had taken for granted – and

were absent during the pandemic. Additionally, challenges that they used to dread now seemed minor and easy to resolve after the last two years of complicated situations created by trying to balance between creating camp memories while also navigating COVID-19 restrictions. In talking with one of the staff, she put it in perspective – "This summer I am celebrating every moment of joy, because I learned over the last two years that joy is the most important thing we can create at camp."

That teaching struck a chord in me. With all that has happened over the last three years, it is easy for one to dwell on the challenges: the frustrations during the pandemic, the broken sense of normalcy, the missed lifecycle moments, and the lost time with loved ones. While we cannot ignore those losses, they do not have to be the only perspective. After what we have been through, we have all gained a heightened appreciation for the blessings in our lives - the moments worthy of celebration that pre-pandemic we may have taken for granted. We need to appreciate and embrace all moments that lift our spirits and give us hope for a better tomorrow.

In our Temple community, we model an appreciation for joy every Shabbat when we list the simchas in our community. You can also find good news in our weekly emails and The Voice. We do this intentionally, to draw attention to the happy moments in life. You have the power to extend this practice into your own life - celebrating every milestone - big or small -- expressing joy and gratitude. Discover the power of the Jewish teaching that every moment in life has a blessing associated with it. From seeing a rainbow, to consuming food, to doing an activity for the first time. Mark moments of happiness, laughter, or hope by saying a blessing - be it in a traditional Hebrew format or words that come from your heart. The words matter less than the act of celebrating and acknowledging joy. Saying, "Thank you God for..." transforms any moment from dull or mundane, into a time of holiness and light.

Into the darkness God spoke, and there was light. With the dark days now in the past, may we continue to add light into the world by celebrating every moment of joy that we can.






ISRAEL CORNER

The Herodium

The Herodium, also called Har Hordus (meaning "Mount Herodes"), is an archaeological site and ancient palace fortress located at Ar-Rahniah in the Judaean Desert on the West Bank.

Herod I, also known as Herod the Great, constructed the palace/fortress, along with a small town between 23-15 BCE. Herod was a Roman client king of Judea (referred to as the Herodian kingdom), where he commissioned the construction of many major colossal building projects, such as the port at Caesarea Maritima, the fortress at Masada, the Tomb of the Patriarchs in Hebron, and the renovation of the Second Temple in Jerusalem.



The Men's Club is an integral part of Temple Shalom and the broader Jewish community.



Our members get the greatest benefit from the Sisterhood when they participate in Sisterhood's Committees: Fundraising, Programing, Oneg, Judaica Store, Membership, and our newest committee: Innovation, Technology & Marketing. It is in these committees that women get to meet new people with common interests and form lifelong friendships.

As we look to the future, we are hoping to move Sisterhood in several new and important directions.

- We are considering a diverse collection of programs that deal with key social issues, as well as the arts, sports, science, wildlife, and our environment.

Di Karpman - Freedom Waters


