Be Mindful This Summer

Believe it or not, summer is almost here. There is a popular saying in the Jewish camping world, that kids live eleven months for one. Meaning, that kids will spend their eleven months during the year looking forward to that one month of camp. As adults, we may not live eleven for one, but we do appreciate the blessing of summer. Summer feels especially welcome after a year where we saw increased growth in our community, more activities (and traffic!) than ever before, and a hurricane!

The summer is our Shabbat from the rest of the year. Regular routines are interrupted for travel, family time, and different experiences. Some go up North, returning to visit family and friends in the cooler weather. Others will travel to different parts of the country or even the world. Many take time away from work. And there are those who prefer to stay put, making better use of time and resources here - eating in restaurants without making reservations, going to the beach and finding easy parking, driving down the road with nary a worry for traffic.

Even as we look forward to summer with great joy, we know that it will pass by all too soon. June will quickly turn into July, July into August, and before we know it, the High Holy Days will be here. That fleeting sense of time only seems to accelerate each year. Is it possible for us to slow down time, to enjoy these days more, to find the blessings of summer?

There are ways in which we can make this summer move “slower”, by engaging in mindful behavior and meaningful experiences. One should spend time with family, explore new adventures, and engage in acts that reflect your Jewish values. Whether traveling, volunteering, or visiting with others, create a routine that allows you to reflect, remember, and appreciate what made the day or week meaningful. Too often, we move from one experience to the next, without allowing ourselves to appreciate what we have done. This makes us feel like time is moving even faster, and also makes it more difficult to look back and recognize how much we have accomplished. Instead of falling into this mindless pattern, we should find ways to pause and reflect.

For some, events and key moments are best captured through a journal or log. Others may wish to create their own routine. Perhaps finding a night each week when all those present at dinner share highlights from the week. Know that being mindful will not physically slow or reverse time. That can only happen in comic books or on the silver screen. But, mindfulness can make us more aware of our journey, and give us the perception that time is moving at a slower pace.

Wherever your journeys may take you this summer, I pray that it is a summer full of laughter, joy, love, and blessing. I can't wait to hear your stories.

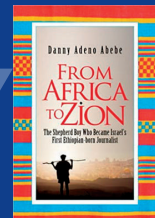

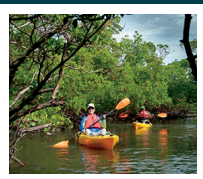

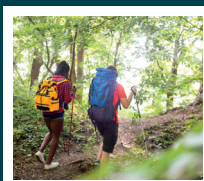

ISRAEL CORNER

Museum on the Seam

The Museum on the Seam is a socio-political contemporary art museum, located on the geographic seam line between East and West of Jerusalem, in the meeting point of the three religions.

The Museum, in its unique way, presents art as a language with no boundaries in order to raise diverse social issues for public discussion and bridge the gaps.

The changing exhibitions in the Museum deal with social issues such as: environment and sustainability, the consequences of capitalism, questions of public conscience, the individual's solitude in the technological age, gender violence, and the relations between men and animals.

The Museum is situated in a neoclassical building that was built in 1932 by the Baramki family. Over the years Jerusalem was divided (1948-1967), the building served as an Israeli army outpost on the border between Israel and Jordan, alongside the Mandelbaum Gate that connected east and west of the city.

The conversion of the Turjeman Post into a museum depicting the history of Jerusalem as a divided city, took place in 1983, through the initiative of then Mayor of Jerusalem, Teddy Kollek (1911-2007), the Jerusalem Foundation, and Georg von Holzbrinck.

In 1999, developed Raphie Etgar the Museum into an institution dedicated to dialogue, understanding and coexistence, and in 2005 into the first socio-political museum in Israel for contemporary art, promoting equality, human rights and diversity.

Located only five minutes' walk from the Haredi neighborhood, Mea Shearim, and the Old City, the Museum's rooftop holds one of Jerusalem's most magnificent views, a coffee shop, art books and the Jerusalemite atmosphere.

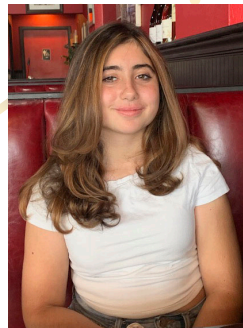
