OUR HEARTS ARE WITH ISRAEL

Mourning & Hope

Our lives changed on October 7, 2023. We are not the same Jews as we were before that moment, and Israel is forever altered by that tragedy. Over these last few weeks we have gone through an intense process of mourning and grieving, one that parallels what we experience after the death of a loved one. A week of intense pain, those first days of shiva in which everything is surreal, our sense of time is warped, and we find it hard to function. Followed by the sheloshim, the first 30 days, when the world is still gray, our hearts still torn, but we begin to see things anew. This has taken a terrible emotional toll on us all. Know that if you, or anyone you know, needs support, Rabbi Boxman, Cantor Azu and I are here to help.

I strongly encourage you to go to our website and listen to the messages from the Friday night services over this period. You will hear the shift in tone as we go through these stages of grief. An excerpt from one of those sermons, from the second Shabbat after the terrorist attack by Hamas can be read by going to our website at this link - tinyurl.com/TS-Miller-Sermon-1020. This one focused on the idea of what we can do to provide hope for those in Israel, and ourselves even though we are living thousands of miles away.

May the hope that enabled us to establish the modern state of Israel, the dream of a land where Jews could live freely and in peace, continue to give us the strength and courage we need in these difficult times.

Our hearts ache as we watch the unfolding horror in Israel. We are all struggling with feelings of sadness, fear, and shock, and yet One Family's unwavering care and support for one another, evidenced by our swift action to support Israel and each other is the essence of "Am Yisrael Chai." From the havdallah service on 10/7 when we gathered to pray for peace, to the counseling session so generously provided by Dr. Arlene Kaplan, PhD and Leslie Wasserman, MA, to the informal dinner and gathering we hosted for all the local Israelis and their families, to the tremendous response to the call for goods that Asher Saida delivered to IDF soldiers and displaced families in Israel – this community jumped into action to respond to the crisis overseas and its effects at home.

While our attention is focused on the hostages and ongoing rocket attacks on our brothers and sisters, I also want to assure you that we are extremely mindful of the safety and well-being of our community members, students, guests, and staff while at Temple. I've spoken directly with security experts and both regional and national law enforcement agencies. My peers in other synagogues around the country and I are in close contact, sharing pertinent and helpful information as it becomes available from a variety of experts and organizations. It is wonderful to be part of a national organization, such as NATA, the National Association of Temple Administrators of the URJ (Union for Reform Judaism) and the Florida subgroup, FASTA (Florida Association of Synagogue and Temple Administrators) at a time like this.

As you may have noticed, our armed security presence has grown substantially - to seven days a week in recent years. The cost is tremendous and growing, but it is a burden we must bear. The team includes private security, Collier County Sheriffs, Florida Highway Patrol officers and Naples City Police (for beach shabbat). Multiple law enforcement vehicles also drive around our campus throughout the day. Many of us have bonded with some of the members of the law enforcement community who we see regularly, but please remember that their primary responsibility is to ensure your safety. Feel free to inform them of any concerns, and thank them for their service, but we do ask that you not engage them in casual conversations while they are on duty, so that they can focus on everyone's safety.

Finally, don't forget your own well-being. I have found myself continuously checking the news and social media for updates, or "doomscrolling." Doomscrolling can negatively affect our mental and physical health. We should all remember that social media can have unregulated comments, posts and commentary that might be untrue, offensive and damaging. Take care of yourself and together, we will get through this as a community and as a people.





Zavitan Stream

The Zavitan Stream is the longest stream in the Golan Heights region. *Zavit* in Hebrew means angle. The stream got its name due to the different angles at which the water flows, as a result of the cracks in the basalt rocks beneath the water.

Along the trail of the Zavitan Stream are beautiful waterfall. The biggest, the Zavitan Waterfall, falls from a height of twenty-five meters.






Along the length of the stream are tens of pools that are shaded by flora, an aqueduct, fig trees and hexagon and pentagon shaped basalt pillars that are also found in the Hexagons Pool located in the lower part of the Zavitan Stream.

The Zavitan Stream is the perfect route in the spring and summer months, with its cool water pool and it is also suitable for families of experienced hikers.







Temple Shalom United Against Hate

"Just as those who hate Israel want to end our Zionism, today's anti-Semites want to disrupt our Judaism. They hope that through intimidation tactics they will be able to discourage Jews from gathering to pray or celebrate holidays. They want to accomplish what the Nazis failed to do -- silence the Jewish people. We cannot grant Hitler this posthumous victory."

Excerpt from Rabbi Miller's Kol Nidre sermon

The problem:

Florida has the second-most hate groups in the United States (behind California). The Southern Poverty Law Center is currently tracking 88 hate and anti-government groups in Florida, and the list of them and their demonstrations is growing. Recently, there have been incidents in Lee and Collier County AND to our great dismay, to Rabbi Adam Miller, who was harassed by antisemites at a Collier County school board meeting this past May.

How Temple Shalom is responding:

In response to the significant rise in hate crimes both locally and statewide, the TOV has formed the Temple Shalom United Against Hate committee. This committee will develop educational programming, action items, and an advocacy agenda for our congregation.

An organization called The Interfaith Alliance of Southwest Florida has been developed to stand up to all forms of hate. Members of this Alliance, a chapter of a national organization, include people of all faiths and beliefs, with the purpose of finding ways to combat the hateful actions in our community. The TOV will partner with them and we encourage everyone to join this important

organization. www.interfaithalliance.org/swfl/
Temple Shalom has applied and been accepted by the
Anti-Defamation League to participate in their Kulanu:
Synagogues in Action Against Antisemitism program.
Kulanu, Hebrew for "all of us", is an eight-month
program dedicated to empowering congregations to
address antisemitism and hate in their communities
through education, community engagement, and
advocacy. Kulanu will be providing helpful knowledge
and tools for our congregation to fight the rising hate
in our community.

If you are a victim of or witness a hate crime: Call law enforcement immediately. A newly passed law in Florida provides enhanced penalties for certain antisemitic and anti-religious harassment, and elevates these as hate crimes, which brings a more robust investigative effort and punitive consequence to these activities.

You can also report the incident to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (1-800-CALL-FBI), and/or to the Anti-Defamation League (ADL.org)






