Rabbi Shay Schachter currently serves as Rabbi and Rosh Beit Midrash at the Young Israel of Woodmere, overseeing its extensive adult educational programs. He is the Rabbi and spiritual leader of Yachad, the Orthodox Union's international program for individuals with disabilities. Since the summer of 2017 he has served as the Rabbi of Camp Simcha, Chai Lifeline's camp for children battling cancer and chronic illnesses. He formally served as the Assistant Rabbi at Congregation Knesseth Israel "The White Shul" in Far Rockaway, from 2012 - 2015. Ray Shay receives his rabbinic ordination from RIETS after studying together with his father, Rabbi Hershel Schachter, for 9 years. He also received an additional Rabbinic ordination from his teacher and mentor, Rabbi Asher Weiss of Jerusalem. Rav Shay holds an MA in Jewish Education and Administration from the Azrieli Graduate School of Yeshiva University.

SHABBOS DEC 22-23 RABBI ELIMELECH GOLDBERG

Rabbi Elimelech Goldberg is the Rabbi Emeritus of the Young Israel of Southfield (Michigan) and the Founder and Global Director of Kids Kicking Cancer. He inspires a very diverse group of Jews. The Rabbi is the recipient of the Rabbinical Leadership Award from the Detroit Lakewood Kollel where he has learnt with the Rosh Kollel, Rav Shmuel Irons for over twenty-five years. He is also a black belt and Clinical Assistant Professor of Pediatrics in the Wayne State University School of Medicine. As the director of the Chai Lifeline's Camp Simcha in the 1990's, Rabbi Goldberg saw the need for empowering children beyond their pain and created Kids Kicking Cancer, an international program of pain and stress meditation using martial arts breathing and empowerment focus. There his staff provides therapy for over 7,000 children a year in over 100 hospitals and facilies spanning eight countries. Rabbi Goldberg has used these same techniques to develop a stress management seminar for adults. He has presented this program to corporations such as Ford Motor Company, Blue Cross Blue Shield, Wal-Mart, CVS, Sanofi Aventis and more. 96% of the employees surveyed describe them as having a "profound impact on their lives."



SHABBOS FEB 9-10 RABBI SHMUEL PHILLIPS

Born and raised in England, Shmuel Phillips has spent almost two decades studying in Yeshiva and Kollel in Israel, during which time he has also completed a law degree from the University of London. Shmuel currently resides in Rechavia, Jerusalem, with his wife Rivka and four children. There he divides his time between Torah study and managing a suite of serviced offices in downtown Jerusalem. Rabbi Phillips is the author of the book "Judaism Reclaimed: Philosophy & Theology in the Torah"

SHABBOS MAR 15-16 RABBI MOSHE HAUER

Rabbi Moshe Hauer joined the Orthodox Union (OU) as its Executive Vice President on May 1, 2020. In this role he serves as the organization's rabbinic leader, heading its communal-oriented efforts and serving as its professional religious/policy leader and primary spokesman.

Prior to joining the OU, Rabbi Hauer served as the senior Rabbi of the Bnai Jacob Shaarei Zion Congregation in Baltimore, MD for 26 years, where he was active in local communal leadership in many areas, with an emphasis on education, children-atrisk, and social service organizations serving the Jewish community. Rabbi Hauer is an active teacher of Torah who led a leadership training program for rabbis and communal leaders, and was a founding editor of the online journal Klal Perspectives.

Rabbi Hauer received his rabbinic ordination and doctor of Talmudic law from Ner Israel. He received his master's of science from John Hopkins University.

Ari Kahn is a rabbi, author and educator. He received his rabbinic ordination from Yeshiva University's Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary where he studied with Rabbi Yosef Dov Soloveitchik, and Rabbi Aharon Lichtenstein. He graduated Yeshiva University with a BA in psychology and an MS degree in Talmud. He is Director of Foreign Student Programs at Bar-Ilan University in Israel, where he also is a senior lecturer in Jewish studies; he also serves as Rabbi of the Mishkan Etrog community in Giv'at Ze'ev. He has authored hundreds of articles, and 14 books on Jewish thought.






