David received his BA in Russian and East European Studies at Yale University, where he studied clarinet with the late Keith Wilson, and a master's degree in Bible and rabbinical ordination from Yeshiva University. While a rabbinical student, he was a Graduate Fellow of the Wexner Foundation.

David has taught for the Florence Melton School of Adult Jewish Learning of the Board of Jewish Education for more than ten years. He is a member of the Rabbinical Council of America, the Chicago Rabbinical Council, the Chicago Board of Rabbis, and the Clergy Task Force of Jewish Women International. He enjoys playing Jazz and Klezmer together with friends.

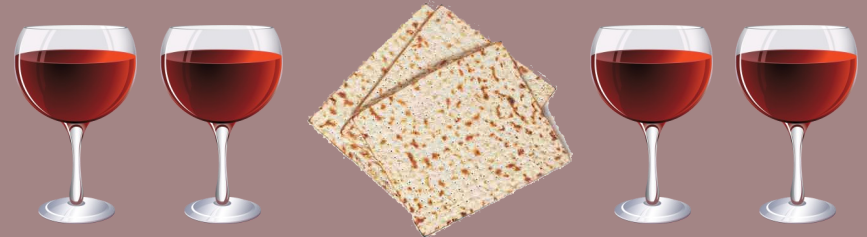
David is married to Frances Locke Rosenberg, a certified nurse midwife. The Rosenbergs have four adult children and two grandchildren.

Israel Movie Night: “No Place on Earth” (2012)

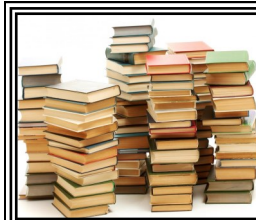

In 1942, 38 men, women, and children slid down a cold, muddy hole in the ground, seeking refuge from the war above in a pitch-black underground world where no human had gone before. These five Ukrainian Jewish families created their own society where young men bravely ventured into the harrowing night, to collect food and supplies, and to chop firewood. The girls and women never left, surviving underground longer than anyone in recorded history. Held together by an iron-willed matriarch, the cave dwellers, ages 2 to 76, emerged at war’s end after 511 days, in tattered clothes, blinded by a sun some children forgot existed. Despite all odds, they had survived.

The remarkable true story of "No Place on Earth" starts out as a mystery. While exploring some of the longest caves in the world in southwestern Ukraine in the 1990s, American caver Chris Nicola stumbled onto unusual objects: an antique lady’s shoe and comb, old buttons, and an old world key. Was the vague rumor true, that some Jews had hid in this cave during WWII, and, if so, had any survived to tell their tale? 67 years later, Chris leads four of the survivors back to Ukraine to say thank you to “the cave.”
