### 1. YOU MUST SUBMIT A TICKET REQUEST FORM OR YOU WILL NOT RECEIVE HIGH HOLIDAY TICKETS.

Tickets are required for everyone attending High Holiday services at ASBI. Due to the high volume of ticket requests, the only way to receive tickets for either open or assigned seating, is to submit a ticket request form. Please DO NOT call the shul office to make a ticket request over the phone.

### 2. MEMBERS MUST BE IN GOOD STANDING BEFORE SUBMITTING YOUR REQUEST.

We cannot process your request until you are in good standing. This means that at least half of your membership dues have been paid or you have initiated a payment plan and you have no additional outstanding balances. If you need to request an adjusted dues amount, please fill out a [Dues Adjustment Form](#) ASAP and make at least a partial payment so that you can be in good standing. Log into your account at [asbi.org](http://asbi.org) to view your account balances.

### 3. SUBMIT YOUR TICKET REQUEST FORM BEFORE 10:00 AM ON FRIDAY, AUGUST 17.

"The Women's Balcony" (2016)  
Monday, August 20, 7:00 PM, at ASBI

An accident during a bar mitzvah celebration leads to a gender rift in a devout Orthodox community in Jerusalem, in this rousing, good-hearted tale about women speaking truth to patriarchal power.

When the women's balcony in an Orthodox synagogue collapses, leaving the rabbi's wife in a coma and the rabbi in shock, the congregation falls into crisis. Charismatic young Rabbi David appears to be a savior after the accident, but slowly starts pushing his fundamentalist ways and tries to take control. This tests the women's friendships and creates an almost Lysistrata-type rift between the community's women and men.

**ASBI Member Dr. Devorah Schoenfeld will be delivering the sermon this Shabbat morning: "What Does It Mean to Love God?"**

Dr. Devorah Schoenfeld is Associate Professor in the Theology department at Loyola University Chicago, where she teaches Bible, Judaism, Comparative Religion and Jewish-Christian Relations. Her book *Isaac on Jewish and Christian Altars: Genesis 22 in Rashi and in the Glossa Ordinaria* compares medieval Jewish and Christian approaches to the *akedah*, and she has also written on Midrash, comparative theology, and dream interpretation. She is a student in the Kollel Executive Ordination Track at Yeshivat Maharat and has been a member of ASBI since 2014.
