Rabbi's Message

What's the Date?

What's the date? What day is it? All of us sometimes need to ask someone these questions. All of us sometimes lose track of time. Even the prayer leader during Shacharit morning weekday services sometimes needs to stop and remember what day it is in order to recite the correct psalm of the day.

Most of us treat this with humor but, in reality, the Jewish calendar is of great importance. As we have been studying in Mishnah Rosh Hashanah during Seuda Shelishit (right after Minchah on Shabbat), Jewish law goes to great lengths to preserve a unified Jewish calendar, even going so far as to allow people to desecrate the Sabbath in order to serve as witnesses to the new moon (month).

A unified Jewish calendar, to this day, serves to unify the Jewish people as one. Whether one is Conservative, Reform, or Orthodox, Ashkenazi, Mizrahi, or Sephardi, Chassidic or Misdagdic, an Israeli or a Diaspora Jew, the Jewish calendar is the same (more or less). In fact, the Jewish calendar is an official calendar of the State of Israel and all Jewish holidays are official state holidays.


As the Mishnah teaches, when groups wanted to attack Judaism, many tried to disrupt the declaration of the new month and thereby destroy the unifying Jewish calendar. Thankfully, our Sages found ways to circumvent these challenges and preserve the Jewish people as one.

In our day as well, unity is of no less importance. This Rosh Hashanah, let us commit to walking in the path of our Sages and work toward a Jewish community of diversity, love, people who get along, and unity. As the new rabbi of B'nai Zion, I hold out my arms in the spirit of Jewish communal unity to our entire congregation as well as to the members of Temple Mount Sinai and Chabad, the Jewish Federation, JFCS, JCC, Anusim Center, El Paso Jewish Academy, Holocaust Museum, Hadassah, our Jewish group at Monte Vista, and all of the Jewish families in El Paso.

PRAYERS FOR THE SICK

If a relative or friend is suffering from an illness, perhaps you would like to recite a special prayer for the speedy recovery of the ailing person. Traditionally, the Hebrew name of the sick person and the Hebrew name of the sick person's mother are mentioned during the prayer. It would be helpful if you would provide us with this information when you make your request.

Prayers for the recovery of the sick are customarily accompanied by a gift to a deserving charity. The merit of this kind deed arouses God's mercy and His powers of healing. Although any amount is deemed appropriate on such an occasion, a gift of CHAI - \$18 - or multiples of 18 - is particularly fitting when pleading for a person's recovery from sickness.

Chai in Hebrew means life. The two Hebrew letters which constitute the word - CHET and YUD - have the numerical equivalents of eight and ten respectively, together yielding the sum of eighteen. For this reason it has become a custom to give charity in the amount of CHAI when praying for the well-being of a suffering person.

Yahrzeit is a Yiddish word, which literally means “time of year” or memorial. Jews of Ashkenazi descent use this term. Sephardim call this commemoration nahala, in Ladino. This custom is widely observed and based on the Jewish tradition of commemorating the death of a relative.

All the Yahrzeit rituals are deeply ingrained in the Jewish life. The common rituals that are performed in the honorable memory of the departed soul include reciting the Kaddish prayer and lighting a Yahrzeit candle.

Yahrzeit also includes the action of donating charity in memory of a deceased loved one. Through the performance of the mitzvah of tzedakah in the name of the departed, the merit of the deed is shared with the soul of the late relative, as their memory is enhanced.
