CURRICULUM –ETHICS AND JEWISH VALUES 6TH GRADE

Many of the choices we make as Jewish people are rooted in Jewish tradition, notably the Torah (as explained in the Talmud).

Goals and objectives:

6th Grade Ethics and Jewish Values will invite students to find the connection between the ethical values and their own life experiences. The focus in each session will fall on solving and applying their own values and ethics with Jewish learning, and then moving towards the truth of his/ her own personal meaning (there are a number of answers with different student opinions).

Students will work in groups to identify the different themes and to find "the right answer" to a complex series of ethical dilemmas.
