My dear Beth El family,

When I first came to Beth El, one of our biggest concerns was PR. How were we going to send the message that there was a new birth of activity and excitement in our synagogue? President's Greeting by Sharon DeFala

The spring of my 5th grade year after the last day of Hebrew school, my class and I were – finally – invited to join our first Kadima ice cream social. We were even allowed to run for an office for the following year. I ran for, and was elected, to be the recording secretary for my Kadima chapter for 6th grade. I was so excited! I remember being in what was then our social hall, with the big stage at the front of the room, and a long table of make-your-own-sundaes at the back of the room. Leon Berkowitz was our youth advisor who made sure that everything ran smoothly.

That was the first time I was ever elected to any office. It made me feel involved and excited to be part of something bigger than myself. I stayed active in Kadima and then USY throughout my middle school and high school years. I attended encampment every summer for seven straight years. 
Eskenazi family and their seeming never-ending stream of new babies.
