

6TH GRADE HEBREW SIDDUR CURRICULUM

1) Sixth grade Siddur Curriculum will focus on chanting fluently, reading effectively, and understanding the meaning of prayers from the siddur for the Shabbat morning Torah service, geared for their Bar/Bat Mitzvah. Students will gain mastery through class work, home study, and participation in organized events and services.
