A message from our incoming President

I have now been president of Beth Tikvah synagogue for just over 3 months. There is much to be pleased and proud about at our shul. Rabbi Sach's contract has been extended for a further 3 years beginning this coming July. We have hired Ellie Reinblatt as our new Youth and Young Families coordinator. These roles support the Beth Tikvah Strategic Plan's goal of attracting and engaging the next generation of members.

There has been lots of wonderful programming including Musica's "Passport to Canada" concert, our participation in the world wide screening of "Who Will Write Our History", Mishpaha Kabbalat Shabbat, Organ Donation Shabbat and Family Volunteer Day.

In the November Hakol I wrote that my most important goals were to widen our volunteer base and formulate a plan for the financial sustainability of our membership. The financial challenges have become more immediate.

The students at Royal Crown, the school on our premises, have moved to another location. There is uncertainty about whether or not we will continue to receive rental income. As well, our application to rezone the site to allow for a "for-profit" school is still pending. We are hopeful of having a result of that application around the time of the High Holidays.

Without the rental income we face a serious budget shortfall. Even with that income, the synagogue will still run a deficit. The members of the Strategic Plan Committee are now focused on our sustainable future and financial health.

One of our main financial strengths is the large capital fund we have available to deal with "rainy day" issues

Working groups have met to deal with membership issues, synagogue expenses, including salaries and operation, increasing income and plans for the use of the property itself. We have met twice as a large group with the second meeting receiving feedback from each of the small groups. We will meet again and by that time there will be enough information for the executive to formulate a policy.

Whatever that policy is, you will all be fully informed.

This Strategic Plan group is sensitive to the needs of our members and our clergy and staff. We all have the best interest of the congregation at heart. The financial issues are serious, however, the Board and Executive are working hard to resolve them.

I also want to acknowledge the generosity both in terms of time and funding of our membership.

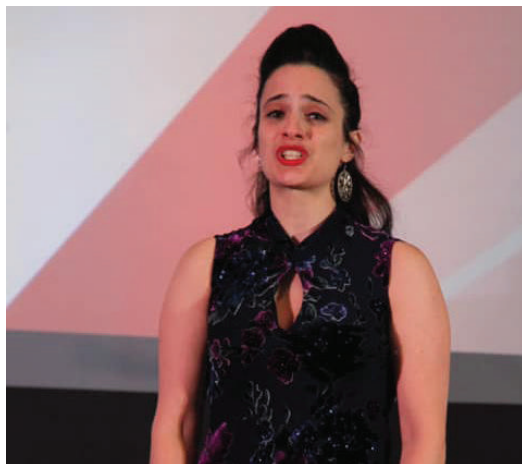
While there are significant challenges to be faced, I find working with our clergy, administrative staff and volunteers to be among the most rewarding volunteer experiences I have had.

Musica Presents Passport to Canada



On Saturday, January 19, Beth Tikvah Synagogue hosted 'Passport to Canada. This program consisted of talented Jewish artists who have made Canada their home and in doing so, have enriched our musical landscape. Their varied songs and instrumentals gave the evening a wonderful elegance and international flair.





On Sunday, January 27, Beth Tikvah Synagogue participated in the world-wide screening event of the award-winning documentary, *Who Will Write Our History?* With 200 people in attendance, the synagogue was one of 350 screenings taking place that day in over 55 countries. The screening was part of International Holocaust Remembrance Day, which marks the 74th anniversary of the liberation of the Nazi Concentration camp Auschwitz-Birkenau by Soviet troops.

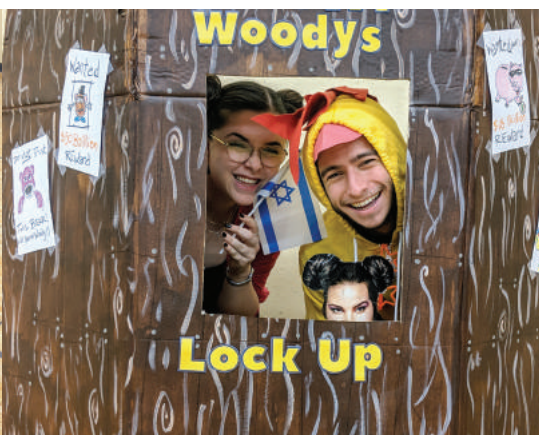
The film provided new insight into the life inside the Warsaw Ghetto. In 1940, in Nazi-occupied Poland, a group of Jewish historians, journalists and others gathered in secret. This group decided to resist with the power of their words. Under the code name Oyneg Shabes, or the joy of Sabbath, they started documenting every bit of their lives. They collected poems, essays, underground newspapers and diaries that captured unflinching real-time accounts of the horrors around them. They defied their murderous enemy with the ultimate weapon – the truth – and risked everything so that their archive would survive the war, even if they did not. Following the powerful movie, the audience watched a post screening panel discussion from UNESCO in Paris with the Writer/Producer/Director, Roberta Grossman, Executive Producer, Nancy Spielberg and Author, Samuel Kassow.

On Thursday, March 21, 2019, Beth Tikvah premiered the documentary called 'Heading Home' for Seudat Purim. Heading Home: The Tale of Team Israel is the David-and-Goliath story of Israel's national baseball team as it competes for the first time in the World Baseball Classic. After years of crushing defeats, Israel finally ranks among the world's best in 2017. Its roster includes many Jewish-American major leaguers, most with a tenuous relationship to Judaism, barely any ever having set foot in Israel. 

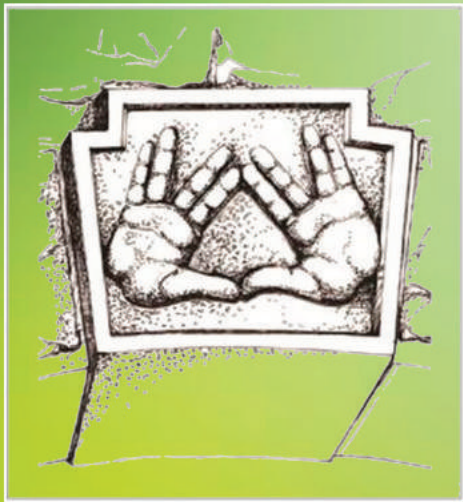

Monday Morning Learning with Rabbi Grover

Kotemporary Kohanim - Part 3 GENDER AND THE PRIESTHOOD

Patriarchy and gender difference run through the entire Jewish tradition in thoroughgoing ways; we can debate at length whether that is good or bad. But in many, many areas of Jewish ritual, social conventions and ideologies define the limits and boundaries of halakhah around gender, much more than do essentialist notions of body and being. While we can argue about the proper interpretation of the original meaning of the Torah, it is indisputable that, in the rabbinic tradition, women are, and can be, Jews independent of their fathers and their husbands. By contrast, the priesthood is essentially and inescapably patriarchal and the exclusion of women from certain roles is fundamental to its construction, beginning with the Torah. How does a more egalitarian Judaism engage with such a non-egalitarian institution? Come explore in a source-based exposition with Rabbi Grover.

During the week of November 24th - December 1st, 2019, Beth Tikvah, will have the privilege of hosting an elite unit of released IDF Soldiers through Peace of Mind Canada. We are encouraging members of our synagogue to donate towards the cost of the program and to open their hearts and homes to these heroes during their stay in Toronto. We need approximately 10 families to host (2 men per family) for the week. On November 29th, we will invite host families along with the entire congregation to join our POM soldiers for Shabbat dinner followed by services the next morning. Peace of Mind is dedicated to facilitating emotional and psychological support for discharged IDF elite combat soldiers who have undergone difficult battle situations. This unique 9-month long process includes orientation and concluding sessions in Israel, 3 month interval follow up sessions and individualized therapy for those who require further interventions.
