We are reading from the sections of the Torah that explain the construction and dedication of the Sanctuary, and the sacrifices that were offered there. According to our Sages, there are hints throughout these sections of the future destruction of the two Temples in Jerusalem. Every time a word or a phrase is doubled, it's a reference to the destructions. Why interrupt the joy and celebration of the Sanctuary's dedication by referencing future suffering?

Every day we say blessings for the basic functions of life. We thank Hashem for being able to see, to hear, to stand up straight, to breathe, to use our minds. These blessings are often words that don't correspond to actual feelings. As time passes, we take our gifts and abilities for granted. An effective way of internalizing the gratitude is to think carefully about those who cannot see, hear, breathe, etc. The perspective helps give our daily blessings intention, purpose, and meaning. For this reason, God reminded us of the Temple's destruction just as its predecessor was dedicated. Appreciate what you've got - soon it may be gone.

Today so many basic activities of life are inaccessible. Otherwise healthy people, are struggling simply to breathe. In a time of so much loss, we ought to be overwhelmed by gratitude.
