he Fruits of a Little Blue Box

From its inception, the Jewish National Fund (JNF) - called Keren Kayemet L'Israel in Hebrew - was charged with the task of fundraising in Jewish communities for the purpose of purchasing land in Eretz Yisrael to create a homeland for the Jewish people. JNF's signature blue boxes, which were used to collect the necessary funds, are known worldwide as a symbol of Zionism. JNF's work is evident in every facet of life in Israel, from beautiful forests to vital reservoirs to the innovative farming techniques being used on kibbutzim throughout the nation. Since its inception, it has planted over 240 million trees, built 180 dams and reservoirs, developed 250,000 acres of land and established more than 1,000 parks.

My great-grandfather $^{z^{*}l}$ was a strong Zionist, and a generous supporter of the JNF. In 1964, he was the designated honouree at their Negev Dinner in Montreal. This weekend, 57 years later, I will be honoured at the same dinner, together with many other rabbis serving Toronto's Jewish community. The award is the same, but the circumstances are very different. 57 years ago, the JNF was focusing on meeting the basic needs of a rather small Jewish settlement. Today, JNF investments are quickly developing Israel into the greatest country in the world, now home to the largest Jewish population in the world.

The name Keren Kayemet comes from the Mishnah. Tractate Peah (1:1) lists the types of good deeds whose rewards are enjoyed in this world, while the principal merit will be in the world to come: hakeren kayemet lo l'olam haba. I hope my great-grandfather is looking down from the world-to-come, deeply satisfied by the myriad and plentiful rewards on his JNF investments. I am proud to be following in his footsteps.

Beth Tikvah Virtual Annual General Meeting




Thursday, November 18 at 7:45 PM



In late September 1941, SS and German police units and their auxiliaries perpetrated one of the largest massacres of World War II. It took place at a ravine called Babyn Yar (Babi Yar) just outside the Ukrainian capital city of Kyiv.

Join us as Robert Jan van Pelt talks about the history and context of Babyn Yar (Bai Yar) and the recently erected new Synagogue which is finally part of the Memorial project. He will also discuss his latest book, How Beautiful Are Your Dwelling Places, Jacob, a two-volume series which visually documents Jewish space and the building of the Synagogue.

Robert Jan van Pelt is an internationally-renowned researcher and historian on the Holocaust and Auschwitz. He is also professor of architecture at the University of Waterloo, and the author of numerous books and articles.
