Torah on Tour With Rabbi Grover



The Duality of Life

After many years, Jacob and Esau are finally reunited in Parshat Vayishlah. In preparation for the showdown, Jacob sends a peculiar message: "I have lived with Lavan and I have stayed until now".

Rashi explains that Jacob is subtly telling his brother two things. Firstly, I have been working hard for my father in law and have not become a great prince or a leader of any nation. Don't attack me, for I am still 'just' your brother. Secondly, even after living in this wicked environment, I have kept all of the commandments. It is striking that Rashi's first explanation shows great modesty, humility and subservience, while the second shows haughtiness and pride.

Rabbi Menachem Mendel Morgenstern, better known as the Kotzker Rebbe, was a great $\underline{\mathbf{H}}$ asidic rabbi and leader in the 18th century. He used to teach about the duality of life, which helps us understand Jacob's message to Esau. There are two Jewish precepts which seem to contradict one another. Abraham tells God "I am but dust and ash". Yet in the Talmud it teaches that we must say "The whole world was created just for me". The Rebbe reconciled these contradictory teachings by advising to go through life with these messages on two pieces of paper, each in a different pocket. We should all strive to be humble and accomplished, leaders and followers, modest and firm. The challenge in life, he said, is to know when to pull out which piece of paper.


