Hayei Sarah: It Is Time To Get Up

Life inevitably brings with it difficult moments. The true measure of a person lies not in their moments of triumph nor moments of defeat. The measure of a person lies in what they do next.

Right at the beginning of our parsha Sarah dies, and Abraham cries out in sadness. But in the very next verse, the Torah tells us, vaiyakum, "Abraham got back up..."

He cannot live in a place of darkness; the task of building a new nation that the two began is not yet complete. He must honour Sarah's life by continuing to live his. It is not easy to get back up after experiencing pain, as Abraham does, but it is necessary. It is a duty to those who we've loved and lost to continue the work they have left unfinished.

This lesson can teach us not just how to respond to grief but also how we should respond to any challenge life throws at us. We can sit for a time in the pain, but then, like Abraham, we must get back up. The past nearly two years have been a challenging time for each of us individually and also as a community.

Covid has knocked us down. For almost two years, we've been unable to gather as we did before. We've lost coming together to learn, to pray, and to celebrate. We've all felt that loss, and we've been sitting with the pain for too long. It is time to be like Abraham; it is time to get back up. It is time to begin the work of rebuilding what we lost. The task is far from complete, and each of us has an integral role to play. It is time for Beth Tikvah to get back up. -RLS

As part of Veterans Shabbat, Rabbi Grover will be interviewing Captain Johnathan Seguin of the Canadian Armed Forces, following services, and discussing his personal involvement in the military, and the role of Canada's forces in the world today.

Captain Johnathan Seguin is 34 years old and a native of Cornwall, Ontario. He is an infrantry Officer with the Royal 22nd Regiment. Captain Seguin has been deployed both on domestic and international operations and exercises; including Operation NANOOK, Canada' Sovereignty Operations in Canadas High Arctic, the Contingent commander of Canadians abroad undergoing the French militaries "Jungle Commando Training" in Martinique and also the Deputy Company Commander of Force Protection for Nato Mission Iraq, in Baghdad, Iraq.




