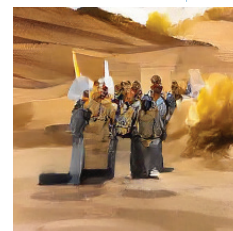

Light of the Torah

The Secret Meaning of Birkat Ha'Mazon

"When you have eaten, and are replete, then you shall bless God your Lord" (Deut 8:10). We are commanded to bless the Holy One, blessed be He, for everything we eat and drink and enjoy in this world. From this verse comes the obligation of Birkat Ha'Mazon — the grace after meals. The mystical tradition tells us that a person who does not recite Birkat Ha'Mazon is considered as stealing from God. How is it possible to steal anything from the Almighty?

The sages explain that by these blessings, we pour out through our words abundance from the highest source. And all the levels and sources are blessed and filled with abundance to pour upon all the worlds, and everything is blessed together. (Zohar, Ekev 1:3) Therefore, a person needs to meditate on the secret of the blessings. Whoever blesses the Holy One, blessed be He, is blessed and receives his part from these blessings. As soon as the Name of the Holy One is blessed, the initial portion of those blessings comes down and rests on the

head of the one who said a blessing. As it is written, "In all places where I cause My Name to be pronounced, I will come to you, and I will bless you" (Ex 20:21). After that particular blessing comes and rests on the head of one who blessed, it spreads from there to the rest of the world. So who is stealing from whom? When we don't bring blessings to this world, we are deprived of blessings ourselves. May we all have many causes to recite the blessings in our lives, and may the rest of the world benefit from that.
